ATTENTION : DOG OWNERS

Recent reports of roaming and menacing dogs have prompted me to remind dog owners of their responsibilities.

Please remember that you live in a rural area where many peoples livelihood is reliant on their livestock. Please see the extracts from legislations below...

(Editor)

“Owning a dog can be very fulfilling.

Dogs are great company, affectionate and give us unconditional love. Many studies have shown that owning a pet improves your health by encouraging us to exercise.

Dog ownership also teaches children responsibility and helps them develop their social and nurturing skills.

We oversee legislation to protect dogs from neglect and cruelty, and to protect the community from nuisance and danger caused by irresponsibly owned dogs.

Responsible dog ownership includes caring for your pet's welfare needs, along with registration, microchipping and adequate confinement of dogs to your property.

Legal requirements for dog owners

The law aims to protect animals from neglect and cruelty as well as protecting the community from animals becoming a nuisance or danger.

If you don't comply with legal requirements, such as microchipping, registration and confinement of dogs to your property, you can be fined.”

“DOMESTIC ANIMALS ACT 1994 - SECT 30

Owner of livestock able to destroy dog or cat found at large near livestock

(1) The owner of any animals or birds kept for farming purposes, any person authorised by the owner or an authorised officer may destroy any dog or cat found at large—

(a) in the place where the animals or birds are confined; or

(b) if the animals or birds are tethered, in the vicinity of the animals or birds.

(2) The owner, a person authorised by the owner or authorised officer does not incur any civil or criminal liability for acting under subsection (1).”

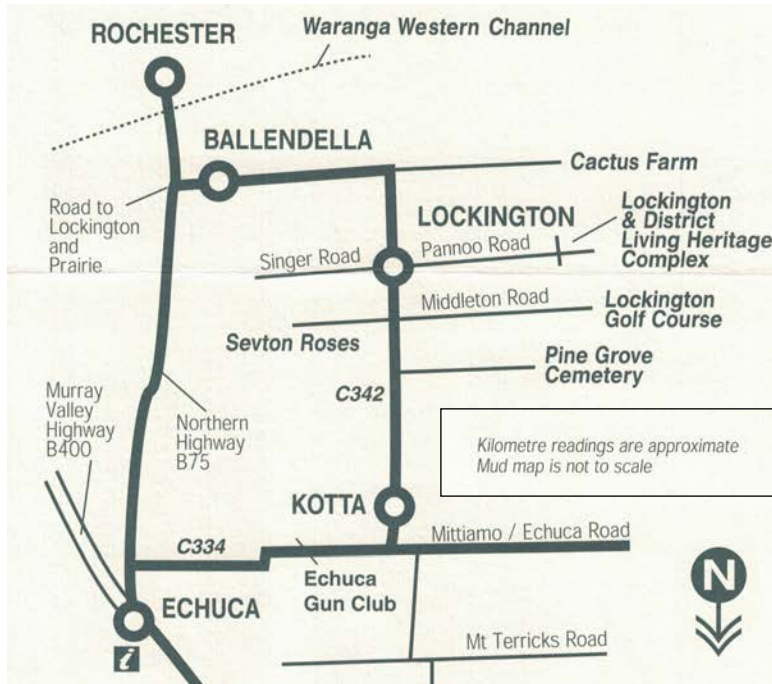
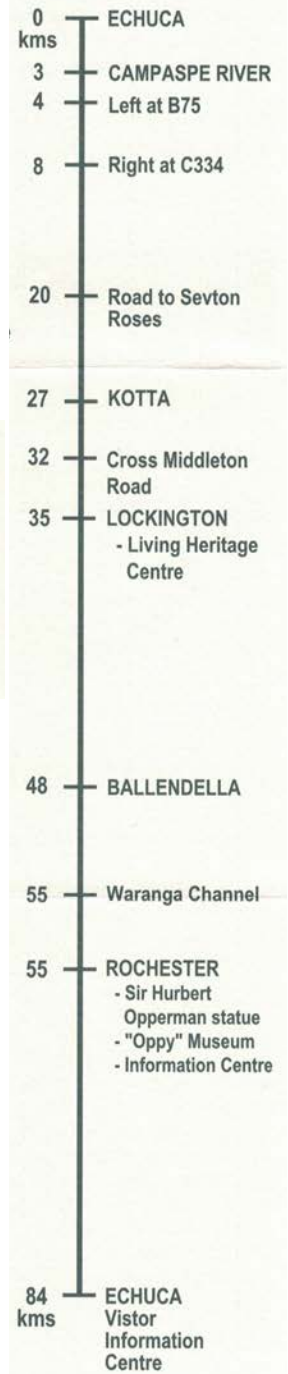

THE BIRDMAN'S WIFE

by Melissa Ashley

Sometimes a book comes along and there is just something about it that you can't ignore and just have to pick it up and read. This novel is an amazing feat and an incredible example of how a deep passionate interest and a yearning for detailed research can enable a writer to build on their original thesis and then create a wonderful work of 'fiction' out of it. Melissa Ashley provides the reader with such insight about Elizabeth Gould, a woman who contributed so much to ornithology, zoology and art in its most detailed form. We learn far more about Elizabeth Gould, the wife of birdman John Gould than we ever knew. Reading about the expeditions, adventures, travel and especially her amazing 'partnership' from her perspective take the reader on a wonderful journey. Everything about this book exudes excellence, from the cover, the chapter design and the detailed au-

thor notes. I found myself wanting to know more about her life and the characters from Australia's early days that were also meshed into the story. Elizabeth was a strong woman who showed great endeavour coming out to this country in its infancy, heading out on numerous expeditions to study and examine birds and many of our native fauna. For those faint of heart the descriptions of taxidermy are detailed and some may find distressing but through her close observation Elizabeth was able to draw the most stunning detailed pictures of Australia's bird life and our unique animals. She too empathised and often worried about their fate explained so well in this line "we had taken its life, so I had best ensure that the exchange was not in vain, that at the very least the splendid animal would live on in my drawing" And indeed they did.

Highly interesting, informative and well worth reading.

Mr Walsh said the police resources in Rochester are terribly understaffed for the region they have to cover and local officers are to be commended for the job they are doing in extenuating circumstances.

“The very essence of keeping crime out of our community is crime prevention and stopping crime as soon as it happens.

“Under the Andrews Labor government country police simply do not have the support and numbers they require to keep their communities safe.

“Rochester is damning evidence that the Premier for Melbourne Daniel Andrews is dismally failing on law and order.

“He claims he is keeping Victorians safe but the statistics show that under his watch the fabric of country communities is in fact being torn apart.”

REDHS Boosting Community Care

Rochester and Elmore District Health Service (REDHS) is changing its model of care in response to the community's needs, which will place an even stronger emphasis on the provision of home, aged and primary care, said Board Chair Dr Carol McKinstry today.

"Our realignment of priorities reflects the Rochester and Elmore district's communities' shifting needs. We are responding to our community's needs by driving innovation, efficiency and person-centred care. "The high demand for home, aged and primary care shows our community's strong preference to be served by their local health service," Dr McKinstry said.

Acute occupancy has reduced over the last five years. After recent evaluation, REDHS has identified a shift in usage patterns so will adjust the number of acute beds from twelve to ten to direct resources to aged and community services where demand is increasing. An acute ward room will be repurposed to assist in the rehabilitation and support activity based programs for patients to assist in their recuperation.

REDHS CEO Anne McEvoy said changing models reflected the direction set by the REDHS 2020 Strategic Plan – based on the three pillars of Quality Healthcare, Collaborative Endeavours and People and Infrastructure. The proposed changes exemplify all three strategic priorities.

"The strengthening of home care will lead to more local services and increased employment opportunities. The Day Procedure Unit (theatre) has also been enhanced under a new shared surgical service", she said.

"While we continue to have a strong commitment to service our acute patients, we are making the most of opportunities to evolve in the way that best serves our community," Ms McEvoy said. "The changes reflected an enhanced focus on contemporary model of care and efficient bed management", she said. "Our commitment to person-centred care underpins everything we do. We are committed to providing the best care in the most convenient place."

A review of the REDHS aged care service plan is currently being undertaken to ensure appropriate future facilities for aged care residents as well as services required in the community such as:

- Home care packages
- National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS)
- Post-acute and transition care programs

Due to the changes, acute patients will benefit from enhanced access to rehabilitation equipment on the ward to support their recovery.

Recent donations from Rochester Bowls Club, Nanneella Hall committee, REDHS ladies auxiliary and bequests have assisted in the purchase of new equipment. The changes will take effect from 31 July 2017.
