Road Safety – Letter written after last meeting to Leanne Pentreath, Council Rep, for support with Vic Roads

Leanne responded:

C334 Kotta – Bamawm Extension – more extensive work to commence on sides of road when weather improves,

Dullard road to east - some work has started on potholes

Lockington to Kotta road – white line will be put down middle

Corner to north of Milloo Hall – will be investigated, due to high number of serious accidents

Again need for grader work as well as gravel mentioned.

Hello again, Everyone.

A century has passed since the First World War was being fought, and it is interesting now to look back and learn how well-informed or otherwise our locally-based ancestors were about its progress. As 1916 drew to a close, the Great War, as it later became known, still had almost two years to run. Knowing this would not have given any cheer to the people here who had seen friends and family members despatched to fight overseas. Those departing had been farewelled with pride; feelings of sadness, fear and concern being somewhat lessened by the hope that it would all be over in a very short while. As 1916 came to a close, this was a hope that had faded.

Soon after war was declared, the Editor of the *Express*, like many other editors of small rurally-based newspapers, arranged for war news to be relayed directly from overseas by Reuters Agency. Local people depended on its regular reports to keep them up to date with what was happening, but news was often belated. By mid-December, 1916, the *Rochester Express* was reporting heavy fighting taking place in Belgium and France, and deaths and injuries were being reported ever more frequently. Battle fields were seldom mentioned by name in those reports, but they have since found a place in Australia's military history – names such as Verdun, the Somme, Fromelles and Pozieres. With so many of their young people, particularly young men, stationed in Europe, families at home would have been longing for some indication of an early end to the conflict.

In addition to Reuters' reports, local people looked to the rural papers for news being shared by neighbours, from letters written home by family members and friends who were actually involved in the fighting. One of these letters, published in December, 1916, by the *Express*, had been received from a soldier hospitalised in England. It was his feeling that, while the Allied Forces seemed to be gaining the upper hand in the battle, the Germans were determined to make them fight hard every inch of the way. He considered that there would not be peace for at least another year. Adding weight to this statement came a Reuters' report that Germany was thought to be making winter preparations for an unprecedented effort to rebuff the Allied Forces in the coming season.

These preparations must have been made at considerable cost to Germany's citizens. In January, 1917, came

news that the economic situation there was worsening, with the possibility that they might need to raid Denmark and Holland for food. The poor were suffering and, even in the case of the military, diets were being cut back. Army boots were difficult to obtain due to a shortage of leather, and the railways were disorganised due to a shortage of coal.

At home, in Australia, it was announced in the *Express* that training of Citizen Forces, which had been interrupted by the war, would be resumed soon. However, no country units would be required to go into camp until after harvesting was complete. Locally, the *Express* reported, good yields were being experienced at Diggora and, at Tennyson, Mr Ernie Windridge was having some success using a "new Massey-Harris reaper harvester machine". It was also reported that the Government Inspector, at station sites along the new Elmore-Cohuna rail line, had required that part-built wheat stacks be dismantled and rebuilt! Another report stated that fruit-growers at Bamawm were being bothered by 'Rutherglen fly' for the second season in succession.

The *Express* regularly published instructions on the manner of addressing letters to soldiers serving abroad, i.e. "Number, Rank and Name, Name of Regiment, Battalion, Battery, Company or Corps only; not Brigade, Division or larger body. Include Australia (not AIF) i.e. Australian Imperial Forces, Abroad". In addition, the *Express* now published a warning to families – Cables they received, requesting remittances for soldiers in hospital, might be not be genuine!

In mid-January, 1917, the *Express* reported that Private W Williams of Ballendella, who had sustained a severe wound to his right arm while serving in France, was welcomed home. But there was also sadder news, slow to arrive; by late January, the district learned that during December, three more local young men had been killed in action in France. They were Lieutenant E Jenkins, and Privates Ernest Archibald and Howard Irish. The war was proving very costly.

That must be all for this time,

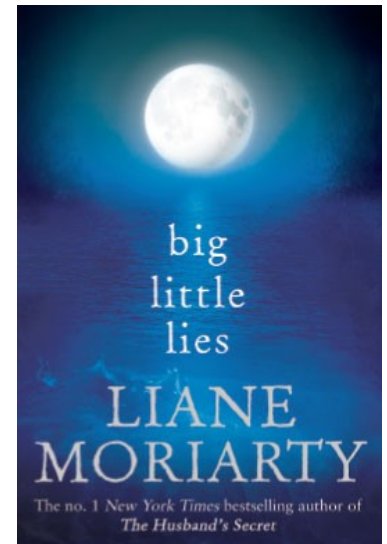
IN THE... LIBRARY

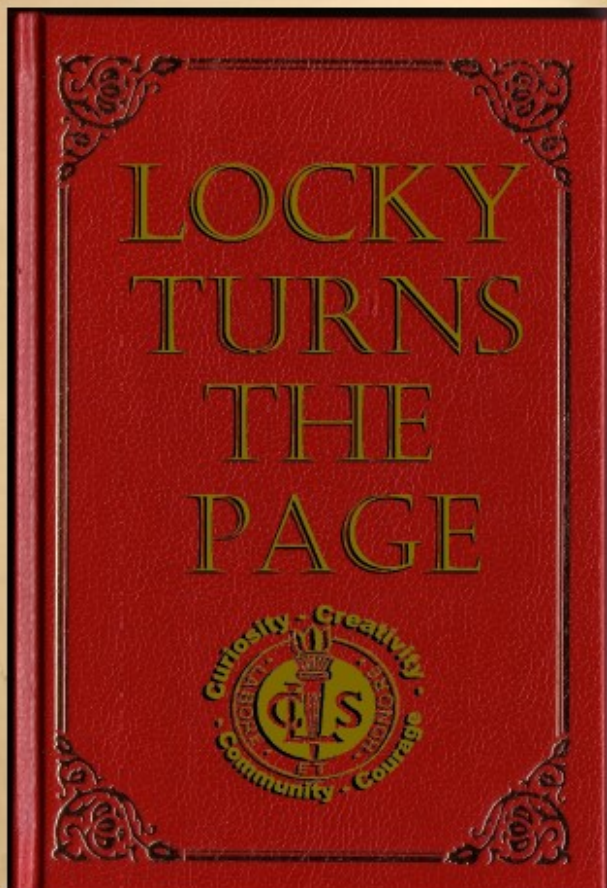

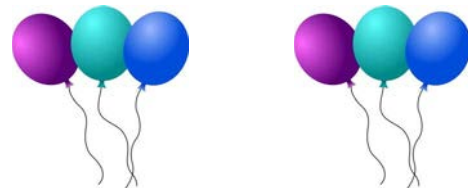

Containers must be inspected and counted before they can be left.

drumMUSTER collects eligible non-returnable metal or plastic containers above one litre/kilogram and up to 205 litre/ kilogram in declared content in the packaging used for: agricultural and livestock production,

industrial and recreational pest and weed control
household pest control operations

CLEANLINESS STANDARD:

Inspection of containers at collection points is necessary to ensure that containers can be safely recycled.

There must be no chemical residue on the inside or the outside of the container, including the thread and cap. If there is any chemical residue visible when delivering your containers these drums will be rejected.

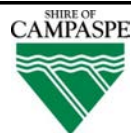
After rinsing your chemical container it should be left to dry with the cap off which will aid in the drying process.

The threads of the container opening must be free of residue and although the cap should not be replaced on the container, it may be brought separately to the collection if clean.

Your container should have the labels on to provide inspectors with identification of the container being handled.

A signed statement by the farmer or chemical user at the point of the collection provides **drumMUSTER** with evidence that the container has been rinsed.

When rinsing the chemical container use rinsate to make up an application of same chemical according to the prod-
