CHAPPEL'S REMEMBER 100 YEARS ON.

105 descendants of Jonathon and Ann Chappel had a family reunion at Lock-& District ington Heritage Living Complex on Saturday, October 7, travelling from the U.S.A., Western Australia, Queensland, and closer. Relations were rekindled, new ones met, memorabilia browsed over, lots of food and lots of talk, and updates to the family tree. The

highlight of Saturday was the presentation by student Stewart Wallace of Carnamah, W.A. of the project he did of 22 year old Joseph Hector Percy Chappel who was killed in action in Belgium on 20 October, 1917, and his published book "In the Line of Fire". Seventeen year old Stewart's book included Percy's World War 1 memorabilia, his letters to his family, diary entries, and in particular an emotional letter Percy's best mate, Fred Helmore of Bamawm, wrote to his parents recounting the last evening the two mates were together. Stewart, with his school, visited war torn areas of Belgium, France and Germany in June 2017, which included a visit to Belgium's Huts Cemetery, Dickebusch and Percy's grave. (See photo).





Flowers were laid at the Bamawm War Memorial, the Ode recited, also the prayer of St. Francis of Assisi "Lord make me an instrument of your peace".

A pilgrimage was made to Pine Grove Cemetery to visit the several Chappel graves, including the grave of Ann and Edwin on which their son Percy's name is mentioned. Then it was onto the Chappel farm on which Percy was reared.

The church service at Bamawm Uniting Church on Sunday 8th was conducted by Chappel family tree members. Included in the service was a ceremony where brothers Stan and Bruce Wallace of Western Australia presented to the church a plaque which the Bamawm Methodist Church had given to Percy's parents expressing condolences following the death of their son whilst serving abroad. The plaque had been with Percy's brother, Howard, in Western Australia until the nephews decided it should be returned to Percy's home. So the plaque can be seen by the wider community the church then presented it to Lockington & District Living Heritage Complex, which was appropriately accepted by president, Joe Chappel. (See photo) The two day event was voted as a great success.
