Sharmaine played her first TAC Cup game on the 3rd of March against the Western Jets in Epsom which they won.

Hello everyone,

While 1918 began with the "Great War" still in progress, news from Europe, published in the Weekly Times on 5 January that year, sounded encouraging. The New Year brought a statement from Lord Derby, the British Minister for War, expressing his hope that the troops would be coming home that year. And, Lord Robert Cecil, then Under-Secretary for Foreign Affairs in Britain, whilst admitting that it would be a hard year, felt that, "strengthened by America", the Allied Forces could hope for victory within the coming uary had started a couple of small fires. It was also reported twelve months.

That same edition of the Weekly Times carried the first full, detailed descriptions to appear in print of the terrible battles that had been fought on the Western Front in September and October in 1917. Written by War Correspondent, Keith Murdoch, these reports would have made difficult reading for the people at home who knew by then that many of their own young men had become casualties of the fighting which the correspondent described.

There was also the news that Russia had experienced a complete military collapse, and that Civil War was proceeding throughout that country. Fighting between the Cossacks and the Bolsheviks had resulted in devastated towns, with homeless families being left to freeze to death. There was little or no food, and agriculture was paralysed. A week later, other news from Europe told of extreme deprivation being experienced in Belgium due to German military oppression, and there was an item that the great bell at the Cologne Cathedral, weighing 56 tons, was melted down "for war purposes" after ringing in the New Year.

The Weekly Times of 12 January, 1918, brought the opportunity of reading first-hand news of difficulties being felt in Germany. The Germans had released some prisoners of war; among them, thirty-four Australians, who were then in hospital in England. They described Germany as "cold, barren and hungry". The Australians described prison rations as having been "inadequate in quantity, and unspeakably bad in quality", but they themselves had been kept "wonderfully supplied" with food parcels sent to them by the Australian Red Cross. While German civilians seemed to them to have plenty of money, food could not be bought. The Australian prisoners had often been begged to sell their "leavings", but they preferred to give whatever help they ing. could to their less fortunate Russian fellow-prisoners who, being solely reliant on prison fare, were being left to die "like sheep in drought time." The Russians had been denied outside news, and had not even heard the fragmentary details emerging of the Civil War in their homeland. The Australians regarded the deprivation of any form of news from outside,

for which they "longed intensely", as having been the harshest part of their own prison experience. It also seemed to them that the German authorities controlled the extent of information made available to their own fighting men, who continued to fight in the belief that they "must do so to save their country from British aggression."

Back in Australia, New Year 1918 seems to have begun fairly quietly for the people of this district, though the Rochester Express reported that a thunderstorm at Tennyson on 8 Janthat, owing to the large number of State School male teachers who were currently enlisted, more lady teachers would be expected to take up duties of Squad drill and culture exercises. Classes for Victorian teachers were to commence soon. The Bendigo Advertiser, on 8 January 1918, carried a report that Mr and Mrs Holland, of Piavella, had received news from their son, Sergeant George Holland, who was recovering from wounds incurred whilst fighting in France, and that he had been awarded the Military Medal. Lance Corporal William Green of Warragamba, had written to his family, too. He was engaged in "machine gun work" at the front, and wrote of having been twice "over the top".

Late in January, the Express carried a report of two Bamawm settlers having been fined in the Rochester Police Court for allowing irrigation water to flood a road, making it dangerous for traffic. "The chairman of the bench said that flooding of roads was becoming flagrant on the part of irrigationists".

Other local news reported by the Express concerned a public meeting of the debenture holders, in connection with the Ballendella Public Hall, which was held in the hall on 29 January, Mr Len Clarke in the chair. The first business was to appoint a chairman to receive the resignations of the old trustees and Mr L. Clarke was elected to the position. The meeting then discussed a new scheme proposed for raising funds to pay off the debt on the hall. An election of a new seven-member board of management, then took place with Messrs L. Clarke, D. Fletcher, T. Bunbury, W. Murray, T. Windle, W. Williams and A. Butcher being elected.

An Express report of 98 points (24.5 mm) of rain at Tennyson, on 29 January, brought the month to an end. Wheat yields for the season were reported to have been disappoint-



Those who do not clean up after an animal in their care, can be issued with an on-the-spot fine of \$300.


