Hello Everyone,

Without doubt life was as busy as ever for the people living in our district in March, 1918, a century ago, but there seems to have been very little local news. There was a report in the *Rochester Express* that Farmers' Union members were worried about the increased presence of the pest plant stinkwort in the district. Problems were being experienced in Wanurp, Diggora, Bamawm, and Pannooabamawm. It was also reported that, in Bamawm and Ballendella, orchardists were troubled by incidents of fruit pilfering.

On the other side of the globe, the battles of the Great War continued to be fought in Europe and in the Middle East. The locals involved in the fighting there were never far from the minds of their families and friends here at home. However, news from the front could be very slow to arrive, and so overwhelming in its detail that it was difficult to even imagine where those local lads might have been and how the war might be effecting them.

On 6 March, 1918, the *Bendigo Independent* reported that an enthusiastic welcome had been extended to Corporal George Atkins who had recently returned to Ballendella. He still suffered from an injury incurred when a fragment of shell from an aircraft penetrated his thigh – a fragment that still remained there. Corporal Atkins had left Australia almost three years earlier, accompanied by three other young men from Ballendella; his brother, who was then still in England, suffering from the effects of gas; Harry Foster, who was still fighting in France; and Gunner Clive J T Bunbury, who had been killed in action. Many of the first of the enlistees, having seen action overseas, were now returning home, but new enlistments were still being sought, and yet more young Australians were being sent abroad to relieve those heavily engaged in fighting at the Western Front and in the Middle East. The *Rochester Express* proudly carried a report that the number of new recruits from the Echuca area (which included our district) was high on the list of country enlistments for 1917.

The following item appeared in the *Gisborne Gazette* on 22 March, 1918, reprinted from an earlier issue of the "Rochester Irrigator":— 'A Brave, Soldierly Act'—"Private Harold McGregor, of Pine Grove, is to be commended for a brave act of self-sacrifice. It appears that when a recent transport was about to sail, several men were turned down at the last minute. In making up the complement, a married man with four children was selected as one of the number. This would have necessitated his departure

without final leave, and Private McGregor, hearing of it, volunteered to take his place, and forego his own right to final leave. The offer was received with cheers by his comrades, and the officer in charge remarked that he was the best sport he had met for a long time. Private McGregor's offer was accepted, and he has consequently sailed without having the opportunity to run home for final leave and to farewell his folks at home. It was a gallant deed, and may good luck and a safe return be his reward!" One feels for Harold McGregor's widowed mother at home in Pine Grove. She had already lost one son to this war; Trooper William McGregor had been killed in action at Gallipoli on 15 June, 1915.

On the local scene, on 26 March, 1918, the *Bendigo Independent* relayed the sad news that Mr John Hutcheson, of Warragamba, had been taken to hospital in Bendigo on 24 March, suffering from what the doctor suspected might be meningitis, and that he had since died. Mr Hutcheson was born in Pine Grove, where his family still ran a blacksmithing business. A blacksmith himself, Mr Hutcheson left a bereaved wife and children at Warragamba.

Meningitis had also claimed the life of Charles Melville Hewlett, whose death occurred at the home of a relative in South Devon, England, on 26 March, 1918. In reporting his death, the *Rochester Express* went on to state that, before going overseas to fight in the war, Mr Hewlett had lived with his parents Reverend J A Hewlett, M. A., and Mrs Hewlett, at Bamawm. The *Bendigo Advertiser* had reported on 28 March, that Private E Hewlett was suffering from pleurisy.

Other local news was both bad and good – The *Bendigo Independent* told of James Fraser of Bamawm, having suffered a broken leg when he fell from a fence, and of Mr P M Cobbett, also of Bamawm, running a flourishing poultry business. Mr Cobbett had a flock of five hundred pedigreed Wyandotte hens, which were proving to be very productive layers, and he was selling eggs at a premium price in Melbourne. More news coming from Bamawm, this time published in the *Rochester Express*, stated that a successful Church of England sports meeting was held there on 6 April, 1918.

"WE REMEMBER VERNON HELMORE"

31 May, 1926 ~ 10 March, 2018



Vern lived his life without frills and fanfare, a local farmer, used to hard work and the practical ways of things with his wife Nancy and his two daughters, Sue and Leonie. Sue and Leonie blessed their parents with...Steven and Darren, Mark and Shannon,...Canda, Marty, Louis and Emma.

Vern Helmore was a true local, his parents Fred and Em dairy farmers on their property on Strathallan Road, Bamawm. The same farm continued by Vern. He had a brother Bob, and his sister Kath is still living – in her 96th year. As children, they walked to the then Bamawm Extension Primary School. When Vern was just 16 years old, he spent many weeks in hospital with an abscess on his brain – something that returned to him again in his late 70s and again took an extensive amount of strength and determination to recover and rehabilitate from. As a young lad, this and the fact that he was too young to enlist to fight in the Second World War, helped develop his sense of determination and commitment to working hard for what he wanted to achieve.

His marriage and partnership with Nancy, was one that furthered that commitment to provide for their family, utilising the production of their farm and hard work. They milked cows, grazed sheep, which meant a regular supply of prime two tooth to kill. The rituals around butchering it and cutting it up on the kitchen table for the freezer remains a vivid memory for the girls.

Susan and Leonie, like all farm kids, were the farm hands and lent a hand in the milking, de-horning the poddies, giving love and comfort to the calves prior to them going to market. They weren't the "sons he didn't have" but they

were part of the farm life and Sue inherited the love of football after listening to her dad follow it, and particularly Richmond, on the radio in the dairy. And like farm kids, they also learned to drive at home on the farm. They both agreed that their dad was not a great teacher in the finer art of driving skills. They learned from experience, especially after running into the hay shed. The art of braking comes very quickly, after something like that!

Vern lived out his belief in giving people a fair go and would have boys from the Malmsbury Youth Justice Centre stay and put them to work on the farm. He had strong opinions about fairness, although it didn't always extend to all groups of society and many a conversation could be "energetic" about some of his views on race and religion.

Farm work was put aside on weekend golf days with Vern earning a life membership of the Bamawm Golf Club. His school age daughters didn't really enjoy the significance of his hole in one on the Par 3 over the dam, and just wanted to get home as the 19th hole celebrations went on. Vern actually played two hole in ones in his lifetime of golf. His second one at Valley View on March 9, 1975. He spent many years enjoying the game and companionship of his fellow bowlers as part of the Lockington club, and the teams and travel that were part of it.

When he and Nancy retired from their years of farming dairy cattle, sheep and all that went with running their rural property, they embraced the life of being grey nomads. For a dozen years they headed up north, following the sunshine playing golf, then bowls, enjoying the peacefulness and the companionship of each other. Frequently fishing and meeting up with the friends they made at regular places, especially their favourite Karumba. Vern celebrated his 70th birthday while on an Australia wide trip, missing Sue's 40th and Canda's 21st, but catching fish in many different places.

When the time was right they made their home at the Cunningham Downs Independent Living Units for the next 6 years. Vern enjoyed working the vegie patch there until the need to transition to Bupa, Echuca, and the higher care needed for Nancy's Parkinson's disease. They were fortunate to have side by side rooms and shared one as a bedroom and the other as a lounge room, able to be together as the soul mates they were throughout their 62 years of married life. Vern had settled happily into his new room, and would walk to the dining area singing as he went. In his lucid moments he would know that Nance wasn't there, but the loss was softened, a small kindness that dementia gives. The Helmore family has nothing but praise for the brilliant care given to both their parents.

Wednesday 23rd May 2018**Funding for sports clubs to buy defibrillators**

Local sporting clubs are encouraged to apply for an automatic defibrillator to help save the lives of players, officials and spectators.

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh said the Defibrillators for Sporting Clubs and Facilities Program was now open and provided clubs with funding to purchase an automatic external defibrillator (AED) for their club or sports facility.

“A person’s chance of survival decreases 10 per cent every minute without defibrillation after they’ve suffered a cardiac arrest,” Mr Walsh said.

“A heart attack is a medical emergency and every minute counts. The sooner that an AED can be placed on the patient, the greater their chance of survival and recovery.”

Mr Walsh said clubs would be assessed according to eligibility, adequate evidence supporting the application, and the approach of the applicant club or facility to enhancing medical emergency planning.

“Clubs who are successful in acquiring a grant will receive an AED package that includes a high quality defibrillator, basic training and a minimum of six years of essential

maintenance.

“This program is an opportunity for local sports clubs to boost their first aid skills, improve planning for medical emergencies and ensure players and spectators suffering sudden cardiac arrest get help until paramedics arrive.”

If we consider just the Shire of Campaspe area:

Just under 10% of the area of the Shire is our natural environment

We have less than 2% remaining of the pre-European distribution of Northern Plains Grasslands

At least 27 fauna species that are listed under State and/or Federal legislation

This includes some of the species on display today such as the Squirrel Glider and Growling Grass Frog.

Another unique animal (and challenge to find and photograph) is the Plains-wanderer. Of the 9993 species of birds across the world, the Plains-wanderer ranked as number 1 in Australia and number 4 in terms of their evolutionary distinctiveness (this is not being related to any other birds, no close brother or sister species) and extinction risk.

This is not a list that you want to be on top of the list! Did you know that the world's largest population of this bird is on the Patho Plains and it is the 21st Priority Threatened Species for Zoos Victoria and they are undertaking a breeding program?

For fish, there's been a 90% decrease in fish populations across the Murray-Darling Basin since European settlement.

In the Gunbower waterways, only 13 of the 22 native species are still present in the system today.

For plants, more than 32 flora species that have a conservation status can be found in the Shire.

This includes the Spiny Riceflower (*Pimelea spinescens*) which exists at 35 sites in Northern Victoria and 27 of them are roadsides. That is a tough place to live!

A number of orchids can be found near our lakes (especially around Lake Cooper), in grasslands and Box-Ironbark forests. We are fortunate to have a range vegetation types across our region.

So while there are lots of species that are struggling to survive – what can we do to help?

Raise awareness and educate the community [You can also add a comment that Lockington and District Landcare Group does this too]

Which increases appreciation

Encourages good land management

No matter where you live, you can contribute. Small things like collecting a piece of litter each time you go for a walk in town or pull out a weed near the plantings as you walk along the Campaspe River!

If you have property you can increase the plants on your property to provide habitat

Resist the urge to 'clean up' on farm. Branches and log provide habitat for insects and lizards and are part of the food chain.

Support Landcare Groups, community groups, agencies, Trust for Nature,

Friends of Terrick Terrick National Park who undertake works on ground
