

#### Key reminders for winter

- Remove all fruit left hanging on tree from autumn e.g. apples, pears, quinces, pomegranates etc
- Dispose of fallen fruit e.g. citrus seal it in a plastic bag and kill any larvae by leaving it in the sun for several days, freeze it for two days or zap it in the microwave
- Think about how much fruit you need and only keep as many trees as you can manage

- Prune your trees down to head or chase height. This way you have a greater chance of protecting all the fruit during
- If you haven't been able to control the fruit fly consider removing the trees
- Help older family, friends and neighbours to prune or remove
