JUNIOR PUBLIC SPEAKING

Lions Club Final of Junior Public Speaking Competition held in the big hall at the Lockington Consolidated School on Wednesday June 12 in the evening. Year 3/4 students kicked off the show with their three minute prepared speeches on the topic of "The day I went into space and met an alien....." The speakers all showed vivid imagination and the general consensus was that space travel is dangerous and aliens should be avoided. The topic for the 5/6 students was complex. Their four minute prepared speech was about immersing themselves into the story of their favorite book. This is a precis of a much longer question. The four speakers did an excellent job of this. We learned about the life of Geronimo Stilton, Little Red Riding Hood, Hatchet and a Horse called Spartan. There was plenty of detail and the speakers showed a lot of confidence in their presentations.



A ten minute break and then the 5/6 students had the added challenge of composing a short speech on the topic "what is your main concern for the future"? The responses were that the most important thing to worry about is security- social and financial. Finish education and find employment. The task of deciding who would go on to represent Lockington at the next stage of the competition went to our three judges, Christine Sebire, Leanne McInnes and Bernie McManus. Deliberations took a little time and then the presentations were made by Christine and Lion Bill Roberts. Winners on the night were 3/4 level, Ziah H with runner up Patrick K. In 5/6 Chloe P won with Charlie B second. Chairman of the judging panel, Christine congratulated and encouraged all of the speakers and thanked them for their participation. Lion Bill also thanked the members who organize the event and the school for their continued enthusiastic assistance of the Lions Club.

The other students competing at this level were Lily D in year 3 and River S year 4. Nicholas M in year 5 and Chelsea R year 6. As usual, there was very little difference in the competency of the speakers and they are all to be congratulated on a great job. An excellent evening of relaxation and entertainment for Lions members and the families of the contestants. Thank you all!

Hello again, Everybody,

On 12 December, 1918, the *Bendigoian* reported that Mr R J French of Elmore, had suggested that Elmore's 'tribute of honour' of the district's soldiers should take the form of a commodious memorial hall. He felt there was a need to replace the Athenaeum Hall which had been erected in 1883, and the people of Elmore responded favourably to this suggestion. There were quite a number of halls constructed throughout Australia as memorials to honour all of those young people from throughout their districts who had served their country in the war of 1914-1918.

The people of the new township of Lockington were among those who decided that a memorial hall was the way to go. I've been unable to find just when the decision was made but on 24 January 1922, the following report appeared in *The Argus* : - "LOCKINGTON. - A commencement has been made with the erection of the Bamawm Soldiers' Memorial Hall. Work had been held up owing to the inability of the contractor (Mr. R. Helmore) to obtain labour. It is expected to complete the building by the end of February. A committee, with Mrs. J. N. Vise as president, is organising fetes, garden parties, etc, to raise funds for the building, which is to cost £1,200."

In *Then....The Water-Wheel Turned*, we read that the Memorial Hall was constructed from bricks recovered from a former brewery in Bendigo. "It was erected by Robert Helmore" and "George Cummings also worked on it." Work must have proceeded without any further delays, as the *Age*, on Saturday, 1 April, 1922, carried a report of the official opening of the Hall having taken place on Wednesday that week: - "ECHUCA. In the presence of a large number of district residents, a new soldiers' memorial hall has been opened, at Lockington. The building is substantially constructed of brick, and tastefully finished as regards interior furnishings. It is 80 feet in length, including a 12 feet stage, and 26 feet 6 inches wide and there is also a weather-board annexe measuring 28 feet by 15 feet. The total cost of the building and furniture was £1635." The same paper reported that Mr John Allan, M.L.A. had opened the building and that Major Rankin, the representative of the soldiers of the district, hoisted the flag. "In the afternoon a varied sports programme was carried out and in the evening a concert followed by a dance was held in the hall."

The *Argus*, *Country News*, on 6 October, 1922, carried the information that new Lockington Memorial Hall had been constructed at a cost of £1,700, "which was subscribed by residents," but there was a further debt to be met and fundraising continued over the next four years; a Buckjumping Contest in mid-1922, a fair in August 1922, a sports event in May 1923, and a children's fancy dress fair in

June 1924, were among the functions reported. However, by mid-1926, final payments had still to be made and it was decided to run a Queen Competition to raise the remaining balance. The rural newspapers of the time have yet to be digitised but we are fortunate that a news clipping of the report of the Queen Competition was saved by a local resident. It is thought to have come from the *Bendigo Advertiser*. Half of the story appeared in the *Locky News* in Sep-Oct 2012, but due to other pressures, the second part was never published. I thought perhaps it might be of interest to include the whole story over the next couple of issues.

Four local young ladies were chosen to be Queens and a committee was formed for each. Advertisements appearing in the local (probably Rochester) paper gave an indication of the program that these committees organised and the fun that was to be had. Among other events, on 29 September, a Fancy Dress Football Match took place, with the "Bamawm -Never-Will-Bes" playing the "Lockington-Never-Wasers". On 1 October, the Lockington Choral Society gave a Grand Concert, and on 19 October, a Public Picnic was held in Mr R McGregor's Woolshed Paddock. All fund-raising had ceased by 1 November, 1926, when all were invited to attend a "Complimentary Social and Presentation to the Queens of the Lockington Queen Carnival". This was held in the Lockington Memorial Hall and proved to be a memorable occasion.

I think there might just be room now to include a photograph or two (though not very clear ones) of the newly completed Memorial Hall, so I'll leave the final of the Queen Competition until another time. 'Bye till then,

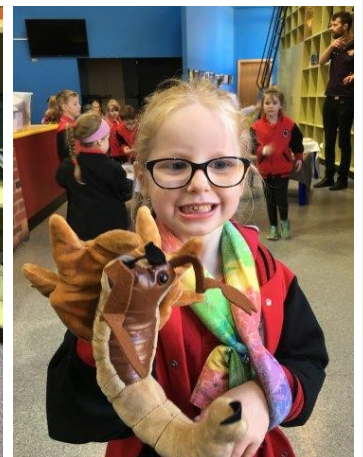
Sporting Schools Tennis

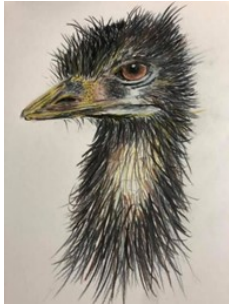

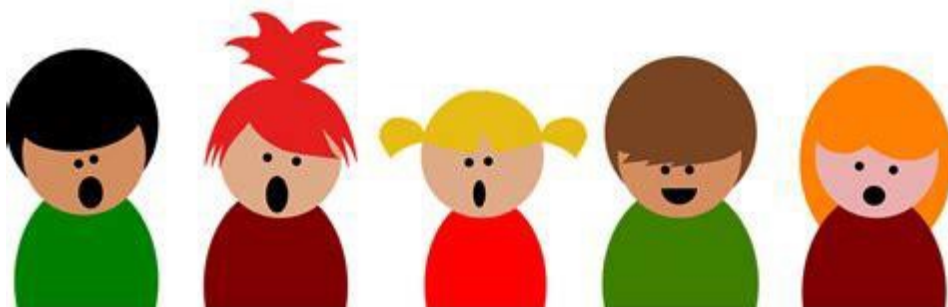

TO FIX WIRE ROPE BARRIERS**

Money that should be used to fix potholes in country roads, crumbling road shoulders and cut roadside grass is being diverted to repair damaged wire rope barriers it has been revealed.

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh said that his constituents living in the Murray Plains electorate will be alarmed that the meagre resources available to fix their roads are being further diluted.

Under questioning at the Public Accounts and Estimates Committee (PAEC) this week, VicRoads CEO Robyn Seymour revealed that repairs to wire rope barriers that have sustained damage are being funded from VicRoads routine maintenance funds as well as the TAC.

"Previously we've been advised that repair of barriers was fully funded by the TAC, which we all pay for through third party insurance on our car registrations.

"To hear that the VicRoads maintenance fund is also being plundered to repair barriers is a concern, particularly after the roll-out was botched by the Labor Government.

"Roadside barriers can be life-savers when placed in the right spot, but there have been major mistakes in their placement and location, with many placed too close to the road and hampering access for emergency services.

"As the rollout of wire rope barriers continues, it can be expected that maintenance costs will also rise, further diluting money for actual road works.

"How many potholes will go unfixed, how many roadsides will have dangerously long grass because money is being spent on fixing wire rope barriers?" Mr Walsh said.

DANIEL ANDREWS TO DESTROY THE CFA

Daniel Andrews succeeded this week in his plan to tear apart our CFA, with the support of Labor's members for Northern Victoria Jaclyn Symes and Mark Gepp.

After years of war on our CFA volunteers, the Andrews Labor Government's destructive CFA Bill passed the Legislative Council last night, with support of Labor MPs, the Greens and the Animal Justice Party.

It will see the CFA stripped of its paid staff, which will be moved into the new Fire Rescue Victoria and seconded back to the CFA, with approval from a union-controlled board.

Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh said it was devastating news for local volunteers with the union also being given a controlling stake in decisions on surge capacity, resourcing and budget allocations for the CFA.

"It's a dark day for our CFA volunteers and the regional communities they protect," Mr Walsh said.

"Our local CFA volunteers have been outspoken in their opposition to Daniel Andrews' destructive plan, but still Northern Victoria's Labor representatives went against what our community wanted.

"By voting for this Bill Jaclyn Symes and Mark Gepp have sold out local volunteers and our community for a sweetheart pay back deal that destroys the CFA and delivers control of it to the union."

The Andrews Labor Government deliberately tied its divisive CFA Bill to a Bill granting presumptive rights to firefighters who develop cancer as a result of their work.

But although career firefighters will get it as a right, volunteers will have to prove they fought enough fires to be eligible – but that number's yet to be defined.

Mr Walsh said volunteers must be treated fairly.

"I support presumptive rights for volunteer and career firefighters," Mr Walsh said.

"But twice, The Nationals introduced a standalone presumptive rights bill to Parliament and twice the Andrews Labor Government voted against it.

"Daniel Andrews has trashed decades of tradition and volunteerism all to pay back his union mates.

"Country communities will never forget what Daniel Andrews has done to the CFA and The Nationals will keep fighting to make sure our volunteers get a fair go and our communities are protected in times of emergency."

**COMMUNITY URGED TO HAVE A SAY
IN FARM TRESPASS INQUIRY**

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh is encouraging the community to have their say to help fix farm trespass laws, with a parliamentary inquiry into the issue now taking public submissions.

The inquiry will help determine the best ways to strengthen laws to protect Victorian farmers against farm trespass, following the alarming action of brazen extreme activists who have been illegally entering farms and stealing livestock.

Mr Walsh said The Nationals moved to establish the inquiry to make sure regional communities, including people living in towns across the Murray Plains electorate could have their say.

"Our farmers deserve laws that protect them against activists illegally coming on to their farms and stealing livestock," Mr Walsh said.

"It's clear the laws need fixing when law-breaking activists get fines of just \$1 – it's just a slap on the wrist that only emboldens illegal activists, instead of deterring them.

"No-one should have to face the heart-breaking decision of closing down their business, as we saw at Yarragon's Gippy Goat Café, because of the stress of constant harassment and intimidation.

"The Nationals stand with our farmers and rural communities, and this inquiry is a first step forward to deliver the change our communities are demanding."

The Nationals have also requested that the Committee ensure that public hearings are held in rural communities and not just at Parliament House in Melbourne.

Written submissions will be accepted until **August 2**. The inquiry will deliver its final report by November 28.
