Hello again, Everyone,

I've only recently realised that the names of those from the western portion of our district who fought and died in the First World War are recorded on the memorial at Mitiamo. This is because, for much of the duration of the war, there was no Lockington; the township came into existence after the coming of the railway. Because the railway is so important to our history, I thought it might be interesting to see just when and how Victoria's rail system came to be. One of the earliest relevant newspaper articles that I came across was published in the Williamstown Chronicle on 13 September, 1856. Gold had been discovered in Victoria in the early 1850s, and the Government was anxious to open up the interior of the State/colony, to provide easier access for travellers to and from the various goldfields, but also to enable goods to be transported cheaply and quickly. This particularly applied to produce from the station properties of the Riverina which at that time was either hauled overland by bullock wagons, or was transferred to riverboats and barges at such inland ports as Echuca, to complete its journey by being carried downriver to Goolwa and to Adelaide. supplies being brought to the station properties used this same process in reverse, it was becoming a matter of some concern to Victoria's government that Melbourne was missing out on a considerable amount of commerce and trade. The introduction of a railway system was proposed as providing the answer, and so the government arranged to borrow from Great Britain an amount of £8,000,000 to put such a scheme into operation. For a country as young as Australia then was, this was an extremely ambitious project, and it was viewed with some trepidation by many of Victoria's residents. The following is taken from that article in the Williamstown Chronicle: -

"The subject of the railways about to be undertaken by the government has of late been a good deal discussed, both in letters to the newspapers and at meetings of various candidates for legislative honours. From the lines of argument, and from the contradictory nature of the various statements, it is quite clear that much ignorance and misapprehension exist in reference to the whole matter, we therefore propose to lay before our readers from time to time such information as we are enabled to ascertain, from authentic sources, regarding the proposed works. On the present occasion we shall point out as clearly as possible the line of route of the grand trunk railway to the Murray, which is the first to be constructed. ...

(W)e are informed by the Chief Engineer that, after a trial of all the routes that have been suggested, the

following is that fixed upon as by far the most practicable and the least expensive. The great trunk line runs from the terminus at the end of Collins-street [Now Southern Cross Station] along the joint line to Geelong and Williamstown as far as Footscray, there crosses the Geelong road, runs in a westerly direction four and a half miles, then north-westerly towards Aitken's Gap to the Diggers' Rest; passes on the east side of the Bald-hill to the township of Sunbury, which it passes on the west side by Jackson's station, crosses the Saltwater River, rises on a stiff gradient to the tableland between the Saltwater River and the Deep Creek, goes northerly through the parish of Bollinda, takes a turn to the westward for about eleven miles to the top of the table land two miles north of Gisborne. The line to this point is finally decided on. The remainder of the route will probably proceed in a north-west direction from the last-named point passing through Woodend, crossing the Campaspe two miles beyond that place, and keeping on the west side of the river leave Carlsruhe, Kyneton, and Malmsbury, at a short distance on the east. Leaving the Coliban river at Malmsbury, the line will pass under the Mount Alexander road, cross the Back Creek at Tarradale, and skirt that township on the west. It has not yet been decided whether the main line will pass through Castlemaine, or go direct from Tarradale to Harcourt. If the latter, a branch will connect Castlemaine with the main line. From Harcourt the line goes northward to Ravenswood, keeping on the east side of Bullock Creek. From Ravenswood it runs nearly north to Sandhurst [Bendigo], passing down Kangaroo Gully. From Sandhurst, the line will pass down the valley of the Bendigo sixteen miles to a point about a mile west of the Campaspe, and four miles beyond Barrow's Inn, now Runnymede. Thence the line runs in a northeasterly direction nearly straight for the Murray a distance of forty miles, to Echuca, at the junction of the Campaspe with the Murray, and a few miles below the confluence of the Goulburn with the same river. The Railway Board are about to proceed with the construction of twenty miles of the above grand trunk line."

That was September, 1856, and they were fairly correct about the future route that the line would take, but there would be many ups and downs before it would finally reach Echuca. We'll look in on it again in a future *Locky News*.





CHECK FOR QUEENSLAND FRUIT FLY THIS SPRING

Mallee residents are encouraged to look out for Queensland fruit fly this spring.

The pest was found in Warracknabeal earlier this year and is present in other towns in the region such as Wycheproof and Charlton.

Agriculture Victoria Fruit Fly Action Plan Senior Project Officer Jane Ryan said Queensland fruit fly was a serious horticultural pest that can destroy home gardens and commercial horticultural production if not managed.

"Fruit flies are usually active from September to May, so now is the time to keep a look out in your garden or on your farm to see if they are present," Ms Ryan said.

"Fruit flies can spread quickly, so community involvement is essential to monitor and control them.



"One way fruit flies can spread is through movement of gazebos and bags fruit and vegetables, so it's important not to travel with home grown fruit."

Ms Ryan advised all Victorians not to accept accept home grown fruit and vegetables from friends or family travelling from infested areas.

"Infested fruit must be disposed of properly, such as putting it in the sun in a sealed plastic bag to destroy eggs and maggots – do not put it in compost," she said.

"Male monitoring traps can identify whether Queensland fruit fly is in the area, and let you know whether it's time to ramp up your management.'

For the greatest chance of successful control, speak to your neighbours for a consistent approach and use the following techniques in your garden by:

- •following good garden hygiene such as picking fruit and vegetables as they ripen
- disposing of unwanted fruit and scraps carefully
- regularly monitoring for presence in your garden
- protecting trees, plants and produce through netting,

- baiting and trapping
- using insecticide control

"If you have fruit trees in your garden but don't manage them, it's best to remove them so they don't become a haven for fruit fly and grow a population in your area," Ms Ryan said.

DANIEL ANDREWS NOT LISTENING TO FARMERS ON RURAL CRIME

The Andrews Labor Government still is not listening to farmers across the Murray Plains electorate and is missing another opportunity to employ dedicated frontline police officers to tackle rural crime.

The Andrews Government announced the Farm Crime Co -ordination Unit this week, but despite Labor's claim it has created 70 new positions, in reality it has offered no additional resources, instead just rebranding the existing Agricultural Liaison Officers (AGLOs).

Victorian farmers have been calling for a dedicated rural crime squad to better protect their family, business and Mr Walsh said that Landcare is much more than livelihood from rural crime but the Andrews Government just isn't listening.

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh said changing a job title won't help Victorian farmers.

"Daniel Andrews has once again demonstrated why he is Premier for Melbourne, failing to properly tackle worsening rural crime and protect our farmers," Mr Walsh said.

"Without a commitment from the Government for new frontline roles and a dedicated, specialist rural crime unit, this is just Labor shuffling the deck chairs.

LABOR'S FUNDING CUTS THREATEN LANDCARE JOBS

Victoria's Landcare networks could be forced to lay off their facilitators next year after the Andrews Labor Government failed to fund the positions.

The news comes as Landcare marks its 30th anniversary as a national organisation this week.

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh said The Nationals and Liberals first funded Landcare facilitators in 2011.

"Landcare groups and networks now employ 79 part-time facilitators which support 60 per cent of the 600 Landcare groups across Victoria," Mr Walsh said.

"Historically facilitators have been funded on a three-year cycle and the Landcare network was bitterly disappointed when the Andrews Government only gave them a year's worth of funding in this year's budget.


