Hello again Everyone,

In recent issues of the Locky News we've been sharing an article about the Land Rush of 1873, which appeared in the Kyneton Guardian in August of that year. The article was very relevant to us because so many of the people who left Kyneton at that time to select farming land further north actually settled right here. The anticipation of the successful passage of an amendment to the Land Act of 1869, led to hundreds of applications to select being lodged right from the beginning of 1873.

The Guardian article described the areas where most of the selection was taking place, mainly on the northern around Kyneton. The writer went on to state: - "The eagerness to select country has led to the rise of an agency business, common enough in the United States, but new to this colony. Intending selectors are greatly assisted by some persons having technical knowledge of the country who charge a moderate fee per selection for their trouble. Of these, Mr Joseph Chappel (formerly of Restdown Station, Rochester) seemed to be largely in request, and we were rather astonished to find that an old Kynetonian, Mr George Piggins, had been resident at Echuca for upwards of three months and gone regularly into the trade of a land-hunter...The officials at the Survey office have been oppressed with work, but the office staff has been increased and the work is being got through. ... The convenience of selectors is consulted in every manner. They can, by applying to the Board of Land and Works, lodge their applications at the land office nearest to their homes, and, although no paid agent is allowed to appear for them at the Land Board, they have only to obtain permission from the Minister of Lands or the District Surveyor for permission for another applicant to appear for them."

The influx of population in the district was making an impact on the nearby towns and the Guardian noted that "Echuca is exhibiting considerable signs of progress. Several public buildings have been recently erected, or are in process of erection. The Town Hall and Court House is amongst the former, and the Masonic Hall and Echuca Shire Hall amongst the latter. It may seem strange to have a Town Hall and Shire Hall in the same town, but there is no accounting for the vagaries of The Shire Hall is placed a considerable councillors.

distance from the business part of the town, and is to cost upwards of £3000. Its erection is a sore point with the Rochester selectors, and whilst the roads in many parts of the shire are so bad that progression on horseback cannot be relied on at a greater rate than four miles an hour, the erection of the Hall, apart altogether from the question of site, seems an ill-timed proceeding. ... The bridge over the Campaspe, erected by Mr Hopwood, eight or nine years ago, for which some sort of right was given by the Government of the day to charge excessive tolls, is now felt to be a great grievance. The bridge is a particularly mean structure, only sufficiently wide for a waggon to cross. Foot-passengers are charged a penny plains around Echuca; and from whence most of the each for crossing the dirty track, and a one-horse dray is selectors came, with a high proportion having come from charged half-a-crown. From this the scale rises in a crescendo style ... As the Campaspe runs within fifty or sixty feet from several of the premises in the main business street of Echuca some notion may be formed of the nuisance this excessively dirty old wooden bridge with its golden tariff is to the town."

> The article then goes on to describe Rochester which was "advancing rapidly. There are now two banks, two flour mills, five hotels, and a number (unascertained) of houses unlicensed where liquor is sold. Messrs Hart and Harris (formerly of Kyneton) have a very thriving wheelwright and blacksmithing business. The population we did not ascertain, but it is probably between four and five hundred. The settlement on either side of the town must make it in a few years a place of importance." While the writer understood the concern of the settlers about the condition of the roads, he felt that "they must set themselves about to find stones fit for road metal. This is the great want of the district, and some plan of cheap railway carriage of metal from a distance seems the desideratum both [at Rochester] and at Echuca."

> Another concern was for the probability that labour would be difficult to obtain when "all the crops on these plains will come in at once... If the valley of the Goulburn, the Restdown and Rochester plains, and the Echuca land can grow anything well, it should be wheat, and there is land enough there to produce sufficient for the wants of the colony. But these are questions to which we must look to experience alone for a solution."


