EULOGY OF BRIAN APPLEBY

Brian Frederick Appleby was born at Inglewood on the 19th January 1937 the eldest child of Eileen and Fred Appleby. He is survived by his sister Brenda, however, vounger brother Graeme had passed away a number of Dad longed for more challenges in the Police Force and in years ago.

He commenced his education at St Mary's Catholic School where he attended to Grade 6 then continued on to the Inglewood Higher Elementary School where he completed Form 4.

Brian not only excelled at school, but he was also a great many Championships. He won the Rheola Gift held on an Easter Monday each year, confirming his athletic team which played against other schools in the region. He was a triple Premiership player for the Inglewood Football Club in 1954, 1956 where he scored 2 goals, and At 17 years of age, he was one of the also in 1958. youngest players to play in the 1954 Grand Final.

He was always a great worker, after school he would go picking tomatoes, and during holidays helped in several shearing sheds in the area as a rouse about, there was not a lazy bone in his body. He learnt to fish and hunt at a excelled at clay target shooting, hunting was a passion.

After leaving school in 1953, he went to work in Appleby's Garage at Inglewood where he was responsible for the administration work of the business.

A couple of years later, he then left the Garage and worked as a bricklayer with Jack Bradley around Bendigo and country areas. At this stage of his life, Brian was searching for what he thought would be his lifelong career, and at this time he met his future wife Lorraine. He and a group of young lads from Inglewood used to travel to the Saturday night dances in Maryborough which is where they met.

On the 15th September 1958 he graduated as a Constable in the Victorian Police Force where he had trained at the Police Academy in Melbourne. His first appointment was Russell Street Headquarters in Melbourne and in May 1959 he transferred to the Fitzroy station.

Shortly after Lorraine moved to Melbourne to work and the relationship continued, then in March 1961 he transferred Bendigo Police and Lorraine followed shortly afterwards. In September 1961 they became engaged and on 13th October 1962 they were married in All Saints Anglican Church Maryborough.

March 1963 they moved to Ouyen where he took up a vacancy at the three-man Station, which led to his promotion to First Constable in December 1963. The family had some wonderful years at Ouyen joining in community sports and activities and still have friends there. Brian did start to play football with Ouyen, but unfortunately, he did his knee and never played again. sports person in both football and running where he won After that he took up umpiring which he did for many He was also secretary for the Mallee Football League. Brian became involved in harness racing when credentials, and was also Captain of the school football he befriended the now late Jack Caldow a very wellknown and respected Trotting Horse trainer. He loved the horses and used to help Jack with working the horses early of a morning. He was also the official timekeeper at Ouyen Harness Racing Club, and began acting as a casual regional steward with Harness Racing.

During this time at Ouyen, the family had many trips up the river fishing and camping, they had an old caravan which they left up there during the summer to stay in over weekends or for holidays. Brian had his small punt boat young age, was a very good shot with the rifle, and he tied to the roof of the car and would take off at any opportunity and spent many hours on the river chasing Red Fin Fish and Murray Cod.

EULOGY OF BRIAN APPLEBY (CONTINUED)

All three boys were born at Ouyen, Brendan in 1965, Gavin in 1967 and Gary in 1971.

In January 1972 Brian was appointed Officer in Charge of the Murrayville Police Station, which was a one-man station, his first solo role in the Police Force. He was also appointed a special constable of the South Australian Police due to the border posting. This life was very different with the house being right next to the Police Station. Many times, serving breakfast to the occasional prisoner held overnight was a task we as kids learnt to live with. When we first arrived, there was no police car and Brian had to use his own car for all police work, so you always felt you were on duty when we were travelling around in the district.

The Family spent 11 years in Murrayville and made many lifelong friends. Dad coached the football team for one year when they did not have a coach and became an active member of the community especially the local pub which he frequently acquainted. Brian being an outdoors person loved this posting, it allowed him to mix work and pleasure with the desert country either side of the town, so many frequent visits into these for "inspections" was a big part of his day

He also became the unofficial swimming coach, early morning dragging all the young local schoolkids up at 7am to swim in a non-Heated pool and train for the summer swimming events. Both Brendan and Gavin became so interested in swimming that Dad was travelling around country Victoria taking us to various swimming meets, it was never a problem, he was always ready to support us in any endeavour we wished to chase, similarly with mine and also Gary's football.

During this time at Murrayville Dad was introduced to the Coorong, the wonderful strip of water from the Murray Mouth to the Sea. He used to travel down to a spot out of Meningie to go night flounder fishing with us kids. He thought this was a piece of paradise and the whole family regularly started to go camping there. They found a spot near Sheppard's Shack as a base and when their friends Dawn & John Sheppard retired as fisherman, they offered to sell it. Mum and Dad could not resist the offer and the deal was done. The Shack as it was known was the regular getaway spot for Dad and Mum. His last visit was in March this year, and even though he was not well and could not venture too much, his local Friend's all rallied around to make it as enjoyable as possible.

On the 5th January 1983 he was appointed as Officer in Charge of the Elmore Police Station. This was a less remote role, but Dad took this on just as he knew how to and that was to absorb into the community. Very quickly he became involved in the local racing scene becoming club steward for the Elmore Harness racing and also the Elmore Racing Club which he became Vice President of for many years as well as being Club Steward. Dad's love for the land and farming also led him in March 1984 when he purchased the Brick Church Road block, a 45-acre property where he ran cattle as a sideline interest.

Brian retired from the Police Force on 4th January 1987 when early retirement was offered. (Pictured right)

He immediately purchased a dairy farm on Prairie Road, Ballendella, 40 Jersey cows and with his Brick Church

Road block, Brian Appleby was now a farmer. This was a new and challenging adventure as neither Dad or Mum had any experience in dairy farming, but they quickly grew the herd to more than 120 dairy cows and were committed

to this way of life forward. Gary was instrumental in getting it all started, also, and completed his apprenticeship as a farmer and then ran the farm.

Mum and Gary would manage the milking. Dad continued to work in racing for many years and was less involved in day to day farming allowing Gary who was interested in the genetic side of the business to build up a successful herd of dairy cows with Al. However, when Gary passed away in 1999, it became too hard and the dairy herd was sold in March 2000. Dad then decided to purchase beef cows and since then has run a successful beef farm with the 3 farm blocks, he had to work with.

Dad was never one to aspire to travel outside of Australia, his only venture was the Coorong in SA and a number of Queensland visits. However in 2003 he and Mum visited Gavin's wife Marianne's parents in Norway, travelling via Singapore, a wonderful trip, and while Gavin was living in Dubai, several other visits and opportunities to visit Sheikh Hamden's and the Godolphin Stables, being granted the chance to present the awards for the day in the parade ring for the Jebel Ali Races, four Dubai World Cups behind the glass and the experience of the Middle East were trips he was always wanted to talk about. He also had the opportunity to visit Fiji for Brendan's & Elizabeth's wedding in 2014 so we can safely say Dad you did some travel in his life

Brian started at this stage of his life to slow down as he was already 76 years of age, but still had reasonable health. He continued to enjoy his life in the local area and his farming stock and being a part of the local community. His Friday night beers with friends, a quick trip to the pub for a beer and driving around in his white ute having a chat with the locals and always still keeping an eye on the community, keeping tabs on his cattle, and loving every moment of the very enriched life he lived.

Unfortunately, in April 2016 he was diagnosed with Prostate cancer and was treated with Chemotherapy, which to our amazement he handled well. For the next 4 ½ years he had up and down moments with many other ongoing health issues, which included many trips to hospital.

In the past 4 ½ years, Mum has been a tower of strength for Dad in the period of sickness, but also so have the people of the local Lockington, Bamawm and Rochester community, the very committed healthcare professionals at Rochester Hospital and Dr Eji, Palliative Care of Echuca Hospital and more recently the Lockington Bush Nursing Centre and Acute Care. Also, Bendigo Health and in particular Dr Rob Blum who was with him all the way through his illnesses. The family is indebted to everyone for their assistance and commitment to assist Dad in this time and we are eternally grateful and thankful.

A better deal

FIRES ARE ALREADY A THREAT ON OUR REGIONAL ROADSIDES SAYS WALSH

THE fire season is just around the corner and the Member for Murray Plains has warned alarm bells should already be ringing because of roadside grass across his electorate – and northern Victoria.

Mr Walsh told Parliament this week VicRoads needed to urgently accelerate its roadside slashing program.

He said he could not see any evidence – anywhere – that VicRoads has done any slashing ahead of the fire season.

"There are dangerous fire conditions on the sides of VicRoads roads right across my electorate – and from where I have travelled in recent weeks, across much of Victoria there is no sign VicRoads is taking this early fire threat seriously," Mr Walsh said.

"I've been along the Murray Valley Hwy, Northern Hwy and the Loddon Valley Hwy and more class B and class C roads I care to remember; and nothing convinces me VicRoads, or its master Roads and Road Safety Minister Ben Carroll, have done anything pre-emptive in my electorate," he said.

"I have also been contacted by people with the same concerns – one email from a woman who had driven from Cohuna to Echuca mirrored my concerns.

"She said 'we are horrified at the huge amount of dry wild oats lining the roadside. In places as high as our car's windows. One cigarette causally discarded and all the farms will be destroyed. On a windy day a fire will roar across the plains. Come for a drive, it's a disaster waiting to happen'."

Mr Walsh said a woman from Dingee told him grass on the side of the road from Boort to Rochester is already 1m high and bone dry.

He said the woman told him she does not feel fire ready at all.

"She wants VicRoads or whoever is responsible – and it is VicRoads for this road – to 'attend to it before disaster strikes'," Mr Walsh added.

"On behalf of not just these people but all the people in regional and country Victoria; I would urge Minister Carroll to give VicRoads an absolute shake-up and tell them to get off their whatchamacallits and get out there and slash the roads to make sure the fire risk is actually reduced," he said.

"In some parts of the state it is probably almost too late. They will need fire trucks at the same time because the grass has started to dry off, and we do not want to see them starting a fire when they are slashing.

"Please, Minister Carroll, give VicRoads a good kick in the you-know-

what and get them out there slashing the sides of the roads before we have an absolute disaster this year with wildfire."

"DIET SOFT DRINKS BETTER THAN LOCALLY GROWN FRUIT JUICE" - ARE YOU SERIOUS, SAYS WALSH

MEMBER for Murray Plains Peter Walsh says farmers in his electorate have been incensed by the latest release of health star ratings which make diet soft drinks healthier than natural fruit juice.

Mr Walsh is demanding Health Minister Martin Foley step in and act immediately.

"What sort of message are we sending our children when cans of diet soft drink are given a higher health star rating than natural fruit juice?" he said.

"Because that's what happening right now - and it is wrong."

Mr Walsh has now taken the fight to Parliament and this week spoke out against ratings he could only describe as "perverse".

"I raised the concerns of farmers in my electorate with the changes the forum on food regulation are making to the health star ratings for vegetable and fruit juice," Mr Walsh said.

"At present fruit juices average 4.9 stars, but with the new health star ratings most juices will fall to a rating of between 2 and 3.3 stars," he said.

"By contrast, diet soft drinks will increase their rating from 2 to 3.5 stars, higher than the health star rating for 100 per cent fruit or vegetable juice that has no added sugar.

"This is sending all the wrong messages when it comes to promoting a healthy diet – soft drink rated higher than fruit juice.

"It has juice manufacturers who buy fruit and vegetables from farmers in my electorate questioning the value of even being involved in the health star rating system when it delivers such a perverse star rating as diet soft drinks being healthier than fruit juice."

Mr Walsh then called on the Health Minister to "take these concerns to the forum on food regulation and have this crazy situation corrected".

"The farmers in my electorate and the fruit juice manufacturers in my electorate just believe that it is plain wrong that you have a higher star rating for diet soft drinks than you do for 100 per cent pure fruit juice."

The Lockington Youth Action Group are happy to be back participating in the program after COVID-19 restrictions prevented them from coming.


