Hello again Everyone,

Happy New Year! As last year closed, we were reviewing the story of European settlement in our part of Victoria, particularly following the passing of the 1869 Land Act, and looking into the practice of 'dummying' in the early to mid-1870s. Instances of 'dummyism' by former pastoralists are thought not to have occurred in our area, but 'dummying' by "Boss Cockies" did occur in the Echuca Land District, with at least one notorious instance happening not too far from here. This occurred when a number of selectors joined together as the 'Marathon Co-operative' and selected adjoining allotments south of Echuca. Their scheme was discovered and they appeared before a Land Board Enquiry, the following details coming from an article which appeared in the *Leader* on 11 September 1875: - "The expenses were to be incurred on, and the profits from the four blocks were to be shared in common, but the several parties were to hold and enjoy possession of their respective selections. They appointed, it was alleged, a Mr. Brown, once a bank manager, to superintend the improvements." The group forfeited their selections. Another notorious instance concerned the 'Flying Huts' of the Terricks. These were flimsy, transportable structures that were moved from 'selection' to 'selection,' mostly west of the Picaninny Creek. They kept just ahead of the Crown Lands Bailiff, George Tattam, as he made his inspections, and were intended to meet the 'residency' condition required of selectors. However, George Tattam was not convinced, and many of these selectors also forfeited their allotments.

There were people who succeeded in manipulating the system; who played their hands very carefully, and appeared to meet all the conditions required, with the help of family members and/or trusted employees. These latter were not really ambitious of becoming farmers themselves and didn't mind lending a hand – and their name – to the selection documents. Mr Tattam was suspicious of some of them but he was unable to prove any wrong-doing. Nevertheless, he saw that larger holdings were being carefully acquired by some individuals who would, he predicted, become the district's leading farmers in the future. It would take a long time for officialdom to admit that settlement on the northern plains was never going to be easy. The fact emerged eventually, that the 320 acre allotment was too small to provide a family with a living; the land and the weather conditions were far from ideal, and there was a serious need for a reliable water supply.

In the meantime, selectors continued to arrive on the Terricks plains, and settlements continued to develop. Rochester had been described as 'decidedly prepossessing' by a *Bendigo*

Advertiser reporter who visited in December 1874. "A handsome block of double-verandahed houses has been lately completed — modelled upon the pattern of the Shamrock; the corners occupied by the Union Bank and Sutton's Hotel, a handsome chemist's shop and a draper's establishment being sandwiched between them; next the large mill and stores of T. Spencer, covering a large area; several really good hotels and stores, and, I am informed, a population of 500 souls. Thus, I regard the town of Rochester as a place of great promise and progress." Prospects looked even brighter when, as announced in the *Melbourne Age* on 21 May 1875, "A telegraph office has at length been opened at Rochester, at the railway station, and a new post office is in course of erection there."

There had also been developments taking place in the western portion of the district, as reported in the *Bendigo Advertiser* on 21 April, 1875: - "A good sign of the increasing prosperity of any new farming country is the springing up of a small township. The most noticeable instance of this is in that part of the Terricks known as Mitiamo. Where three years ago there was no sign of civilization beyond the apparently endless posts and wires, there is now to be seen a rising country village, and one which will doubtless continue to rapidly progress. It can, at present, boast of about half a dozen hotels or shanties — there are usually more hotels than other establishments in the country districts. The principal hotel (the Homebush) is occupied by Mr. E. Boyle, who until recently kept a hotel of the same name on the Mclvor-road. Besides the hotels, there are grocers', drapers', butchers', bakers', and blacksmiths' shops. The township is situated on the western banks of the Picaninny Creek, and thus possesses the advantage of being an excellent watering place." On the other hand, "The inhabitants complain greatly of the want of police protection. At present if the services of the police are required, a journey must be made either to the Serpentine, Raywood, or Rochester, distances of more than 25 miles." And "The want of a burial ground is also very severely felt. The Raywood cemetery, which is the nearest, is fully 30 miles away — a rather tedious journey in the case of a funeral."

A lengthy dry spell which had begun to concern the local residents, ended when rain fell in late April. The *Riverine Herald* of 28 April 1875, reported that "the district has derived immense advantages from the rainfall, and many of the selectors may be said to have been saved from comparative ruin by the breaking up of the drought."

DELAYS LEAVE LOCAL FARMERS EXPOSED TO ILLEGAL TRESPASS

Laws to impose on-the-spot fines to better protect Murray Plains farmers against farm trespass still haven't been drafted, six months after the Andrews Labor Government finally agreed to the change.

A parliamentary inquiry recommended on-the-spot fines be implemented as a solution to stop extreme animal activities breaking into farms, stealing livestock and damaging biosecurity.

But more than six months since the Andrews Government agreed to the recommendation, farmers are still waiting for change.

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, said other states had already put similar laws in place so there was no excuse for Victoria's delays.

"Farmers deserve to feel safe in their own homes, but the current soft rules embolden extreme activists to break the law instead of deterring them," Mr Walsh said.

"Victorian farmers were hoping to see the Andrews Labor Government implement on-the-spot fines with the same urgency as New South Wales, but instead Daniel Andrews has kicked the can down the road," he said.

"The NSW Liberal Nationals Government has taken action to better protect farmers and it's time the Victorian Government stepped up and did the same."

The farm trespass inquiry was established in May 2019 after The Nationals took farmer's concerns about worsening illegal farm invasions to State Parliament.

Mr Walsh said the impact of farm trespass had taken a heavy emotional toll on local farming families.

"These farms are not just a business for the families who live on them, they're home," he said.

"The Andrews Labor Government either stands with our farmers or it stands with the extreme animal activists who want to destroy them.

"No more excuses – the new Agriculture Minister must ensure these reforms are drafted and ready when State Parliament returns in February."

2020 IS GONE

BUT NEVER TO BE FORGOTTEN

Our year is ending with another reminder the trials of 2020 and the pandemic are not going away any time soon.

Even as I was writing this; governments in Victoria, NSW and South Australia were rolling out new restrictions, from a hard border between SA and NSW to Victoria going back to mandatory masks.

Sadly these latest changes have also thrown many New Year's Eve plans into chaos; with acting Victorian Premier Jacinta Allan announcing this morning that numbers of people in a private home have been halved from 30 to 15 – and that number includes those who live there.

But as dramatic as the pandemic has been, we must not lose sight of the people and the regions who went through the horrors of bushfires earlier in the year and the many farmers who were on the end of two and three years of drought.

On top of that, China has launched a one-sided trade war with Australia – its campaign of banning one import after the other has rocked the agricultural industry in particular,

just as much of the farming community was finally looking at a bumper season.

I have no doubt everyone who has lived through 2020, and in the years ahead those who look back on it, will still be shaking their heads at how quickly Australia; indeed the whole world, became enmeshed in a social, medical, economic and political meltdown as everyone raced to stave off the rapidly spreading coronavirus.

To date 1.8 million people have died as a result, with, incredibly, the US being the hardest hit, with more than 340,000 deaths as of this morning. Globally at least 82.5 million people have been infected.

I think my best hope, looking to 2021, is the progress on vaccinations delivers the knockout blow we have been hearing about and lets us get on with the huge challenge of rebuilding an economy that has, literally, been thrown under the bus.

Stories about struggling businesses, people going onto the dole queue and government subsidies the difference between many others keeping doors open or sending more people into the growing jobless sector have been ongoing.

We should also take encouragement from the many people who have been highlighted in recent months for their resilience, their innovation and their determination to succeed in business, in schools and universities, in local communities and the care and compassion that have come with that.

I would like to particularly congratulate the people in my electorate of Murray Plains, firstly for their support and secondly for being such a community of achievers despite frequently being shackled to Melbourne's challenges.

Our people delivered at every turn and that effort was reflected in our miniscule number of infections; backed up by well-trained and dedicated staff in our regional hospitals and testing centres.

Regional Victoria provided the blueprint on how to best defend against a pandemic and we should all feel proud for our individual roles in that success.

But most importantly, we must also feel for the 909 Australian families who have lost loved ones to this insidious virus.

Tragically, 820 of those families are Victorian and most of those were the victims of unfathomable government incompetence. We have already had one inquiry into why Victoria could get this so wrong but that has, I believe, raised more questions than it has answered.

Most importantly we still have no idea who, within the government, set up, signed off and supervised the failed hotel quarantine system and our early contact tracing.

There are ongoing calls for a Royal Commission; and an inquiry at that level would appear to be our best opportunity to get the full story so what went wrong never happens again.

I would like to hope you all stay safe, happy and healthy in the New Year.

But it would also be remiss of me if I did not point to our road toll, which is down on 2019 – including on regional roads – but you will all have heard of the shocking fatalities just before, and since, Christmas. All but one of those have been on country roads.

And with the extended COVID restrictions, swimming is another area which has been neglected and water safety must be a priority this summer.
