On the weekend of 12th March, one or two reps from each of the above groups will meet with the overall Rural Aid co-ordinator to discuss the pros and cons of the proposed ideas. I will be present at all interviews to assist with consistency.

From there the Lockington Planning group will be given a strategic plan, produced by Rural Aid, that incorporates these ideas and will be the basis for the 50 or so volunteers from all over Australia that come to our town for a week in September from the 19th to 24th. These volunteers are 'hands on' workers. The town will be responsible for providing the evening meal during this week. Four organisations will be asked to provide a meal on one night, this will be a fund raising opportunity for each organisation. The fifth meal will be at the Lockington Community Hotel.

We are given funding of \$90,000 towards materials to be used on the projects etc. We get approx \$25,000 the first year and the remainder over the next four years to ensure that projects have future funding to enable them to be completed.

Hello again Everyone,

We've been looking back at the development of our district after selector settlers began to arrive here a hundred and fifty years ago. By mid-1875, east of here, the flourishing township of Rochester was taking shape on the Melbourne-to-Murray main trunk railway line, and to the west was the growing village of Mitiamo. Nevertheless, some of those early farming families must have felt very isolated, particularly as there were still virtually no made roads. In an item published by the Melbourne Age on 21 May 1875, the Rochester correspondent stated that "A strong feeling prevails in favour of having an independent shire established, with Rochester as its centre." Some five hundred ratepayers had already petitioned in favour of forming the separate Shire, with an extent of about 700 square miles, comprising portions of the existing Shires of Echuca and Waranga.

Nothing happened quickly but, on 11 October 1875, as reported by the Riverine Herald the following day, "[a] very numerously attended meeting was held last night at the Shamrock Hotel, Rochester, for the purpose of taking steps to separate the shire, and to form a new shire." The following resolution was unanimously passed: "That in the opinion of this meeting, it is desirable to form a new shire at Rochester, consisting of portions of the Echuca and Waranga Shires, including the whole, or portion of the following parishes; Rochester West, Bonn, Nanneella, Timmering, Tongala, Koyuga, Kyabram, Echuca South, Diggorra, Warragamba, Pannoomilloo, Milloo, Pannoobamawm, Mitiamo, Wanurp, Bamawm, Ballendella, Corop, Carag Carag, Girgarre; and that a petition be signed in accordance with the 38th section of the Local Government [Act], in support thereof." Lengthy discussion took place before the petition was "laid upon the table, and the meeting invited to record their names. Numbers waited until a very late hour, to attach their signatures before the meeting broke up."

It is perhaps not surprising that those responsible for municipal affairs in the Echuca Shire had not taken much account of the plains to their west and south-west at that time. Another exciting prospect had come forward. The completion of the railway line to Echuca in 1864, had done much to open up the northern part of Victoria. Now interest was increasing in the Riverina country across the Murray River. The *Riverine Herald* of 19 May 1875, has an interesting report of the plans being made to extend the rail link across the river to Moama and on to Deniliquin. Construction was to be in the hands of a new company, formed principally of Victorians. It was expected that work would begin at the Moama end of the line "in the course of a few weeks," but a decision had yet to be made concerning

the width of gauge to be adopted. The line would be about forty-seven miles in length, and the cost was estimated at between £100,000 and £150,000, including rolling stock. It was anticipated that completion of the new line would take about a year.

The New Year's Day 1876 edition of the Bendigo Advertiser, carried a lengthy article describing "Agricultural Progress on the Terricks". Whilst praising the "genuine" selectors as being very industrious, having cultivated the greater portion of their land, the writer acknowledged that those on family selections, of sufficient size in total to enable them to graze a flock of sheep to subsidise the income derived from their cropping activities, were in a better position than the "poor selector with his three hundred and twenty acres." He noted that many of these were in such "reduced circumstances" that, without the little extra income they had been able to gain by agisting sheep for a nearby "boss cockie", "they would have undoubtedly to allow their holdings to be forfeited or else arrange for their disposal to squatters at the end of three years, the period for which they are compelled to hold their land."

It was felt that the 1875-76 season having been more favourable than the last, had boosted the hopes of the selectors and they were delighted with the yields they had obtained from the current crop. The only difficulty encountered had been "a scarcity of labour. However, the introduction of reaping machines has saved many a farmer his crop. Dozens of threshing machines have been hard at work during the past week or two."

The article went on to state: - "There has been no scarcity of water, and it is exceedingly fortunate for some of the selectors away from the creeks, who have not had time to form waterholes, that the season has been such a wet one. A drought would play sad havoc with the selectors' sheep, in places where water is not easily obtained or even retained after holes are excavated, through the porous nature of the ground. Well-sinking has been commenced in various localities, and, with very few exceptions, water has been struck in large quantities in the drifts at no great depths." The other great shortage was one of trees, "The scarcity of timber on the plains is a great drawback to the selectors, as they have to travel long distances to secure posts for fencing. For miles along the roads not a tree of any description is to be met with."




