BAMAWM WAR MEMORIAL PARK UNVEILED.

On Sunday, April 18 a wall depicting the site of Bamawm's War Memorial was unveiled by WGCdr John Glover RFD, and Margaret Davis, President of Bamawm CWA. Recreation Reserve President Garry Mundie welcomed all present. Shire of Campaspe Mayor, Cr. Chrissy Weller expressed her pride in what the local community had done, then Tom Davis gave a history of the site. 'In 1911 3 acres were annexed off from the Recreation Reserve for the RSL. In 1922 a memorial was dedicated followed by an evening service in the hall. This was updated in 1995 to include the 2nd World War. The memorial wall was a vision by the Bamawm CWA'.

John Glover in his dedication listed our local heroes whose names are listed on the memorial, detailing when they died, and where they are buried, if known. He said, 'Since time immemorial women have borne the brunt of domestic tasks when their men have gone to war. No-where was this more apparent than in agricultural communities. Their greatest task, though, was managing the immeasurable grief when formal telegrams were delivered conveying the most dreadful of news: killed in action, missing believed killed or wounded in action. Many succumbed to the grief whilst others stoically tried to cope. We can only imagine the pain, the heartbreak and the fearful futures they faced.'... 'War is never nice or clean, death in war is inevitably indescribably obscene, ugly and inhumane.'... 'In the time-honoured Binyon's *Ode to the Fallen* known to most of us we say "We Will remember Them". This Memorial Wall is Bamawm's way of saying "Thank You" to those veterans who enlisted from this area and is a declaration that we will remember them. You have not failed the men whom you honour. These men were long-honoured in the hearts of their families, most of whom have now passed away, but this memorial demonstrates for ever that they are still

honoured in the community from where they departed in order to serve.'

Hello again Everyone,

We've been looking at the story of settlement on the Terricks plains in the 1870s. New settlers who came to the area with high hopes of establishing family farms faced considerable hardship. Initially the only townships were those at rail stops on the Sandhurst (Bendigo) to Echuca railway – at Goornong, Runnymede (Elmore), and Rochester. There were no made roads, no churches, halls or meeting places, no schools, post offices or police stations, and no medical facilities. As the decade progressed, the small townships of Mitiamo and Terrick Terrick took shape and, when schools and post offices began to be provided, they became central to smaller communities, a network of which grew across the plains.

The situation changed constantly, for the villages as much as for individual farms and settlers. The variable weather conditions were largely responsible, but much depended on the settlers' own resources. A strong support base of family members, or close friends working together, could be invaluable; and farming experience, particularly with financial assets, or assets in the shape of farming equipment, played a significant role. The settler who started with nothing but a dream, and the determination to work hard, might succeed but his chances on the Terricks plains were limited. However, despite the harsh climate, settlers persevered, and settlements continued to change and develop. A post office was opened at Milloo in March 1878, and another at Baldrack in June. In June also, the police stations that had been provided at Torrumbarry and Terrick Terrick, were removed, and new stations were established at Gunbower and Mitiamo. On 11 September, the *Bendigo Advertiser* stated there was still an unmet need for a medical practitioner in the Terricks district. At least, the need for schools was continuing to be addressed as, on 30 October, the Education Department announced in the *Argus*, that new schools were to be provided at Diggora, Pannoobamawm and Warragamba.

The drought of 1877-78 struck a blow from which some settlers did not recover. Many of those who did survive the experience, realised that they owed a debt of gratitude to the pastoralists. Some selector farmers had drawn water from wells on the East Loddon Station, whilst the inhabitants of Mitiamo had been "entirely dependent" on a dam that belonged to Mr Austin Mack, of Prairie Station, who freely allowed people to cart water away. On 20 August 1878, the *Bendigo Advertiser* reported on a large gathering of local farmers held at O'Brien's Hotel, Pine Grove, to honour Mr J H Wheeler, J.P., the owner of Pine Grove Station, who "had saved the district by placing all his wells at the disposal of the neighbouring farmers, whose cattle, but for this would all have perished for want of water."

There were a couple of unusual happenings in the district in 1878. In September that year, the *Riverine Herald* reported on a bunyip! "The long-lost bunyip has again made its appearance, but this time not in solitary grandeur, as is its wont, an invasion of a whole tribe of bunyips having taken place. The locale of the mysterious animal is in the parish of Wanurp, near Mitiamo. In this parish there is an overflow in the Picaninny Creek, which runs back across the plains for several miles, and leaves a series of marshes dignified by the name of a creek. The selection of Mr. Isaac Chambers appears to be the favourite haunt of the animals, and most of the neighbouring selectors have heard their mournful noise, although none of them have as yet seen the animal. The noise is said to resemble the bellowing of a bull, toned down by distance. This booming noise is heard irregularly throughout the night in the swamps, and is sometimes answered in two or three other places. Some of the animals appear to have a softer tone of voice than others, hence it is surmised that female bunyips exist. One and all round declare they have heard the noise, which is the more mysterious as no mortal eyes have yet rested upon the object which produces the sounds."

The other interesting report was published in the *Argus* on 26 November 1878, and said: - "The Terrick Terrick correspondent of the *Riverine Herald*, writing under date of the 22nd inst, says - "A slight shock of earthquake was felt in this locality on Tuesday last, about 5 o'clock in the evening. I was in the house at the time, and I felt the shock most distinctly. It appeared to travel in a south easterly direction, and was accompanied by a low rumbling sound, lasting for several seconds. The whole house trembled, and the windows rattled in their frames. The shock was felt by several people in the neighbourhood. The weather during the day had been very sultry and oppressive."

The year ended on a gloomy note, with reports that rains had come too late to help the crops. On 2 November 1878, the *Ballarat Courier* carried the following: - "A correspondent writing from the Terricks to the *Creswick Advertiser* says "I am sorry to state the weather has all the appearance of an approaching dry summer. The creeks have ceased running, and the grass is dried up and gone to seed at a very short length." And the *Weekly Times* on 23 November, reported that many settlers were "getting quite disheartened, and talk of leaving the district. Some have already gone, and others are thinking of going over the Murray as soon as they can sell out."

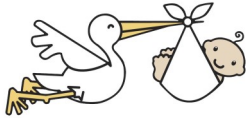

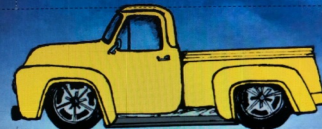

Survivors must be better supported

Vulnerable women and children in Murray Plains will be better supported by a new online reporting process that will empower survivors of sexual assault to take control of their case and help prevent future offending from occurring.

The Victorian Nationals' plan will modernise the system and better protect women in the future, by establishing a flexible and informal reporting option for cases of sexual assault.

Mr Walsh said as the only state in the nation not offering this option to women, there were already successful models Victoria could look to.

"For too long Victoria has lagged behind the nation on flexible reporting of sexual assault, making it harder for survivors to come forward and offenders to be held to account," he said.

"Daniel Andrews must now back our plan and work with the Liberal Nationals to introduce these overdue reforms."

Sexual offences have risen more than 24 per cent in Victoria over the last five years, with data also showing half of women did not seek advice or support after their most recent incident of sexual assault perpetrated by a male. It means countless cases of sexual assault continue to go unreported.

Shadow Minister for the Prevention of Family Violence and Women Emma Kealy said the new reporting option could be based on the New South Wales Sexual Assault Reporting Option (SARO).

SARO is a joint initiative of New South Wales Police and Sexual Assault and Consent Advocate Chanel Contos, aiming to empower survivors to establish a record of what occurred, act as a therapeutic tool and increase police intelligence to better inform crime prevention initiatives.

"Sexual assault survivors have been calling for an informal option to report sexual assault which will strengthen accountability for perpetrators and better support victims, and that's exactly what the Liberal Nationals will deliver," Ms Kealy said.

"Rates of violence against women are surging under the Andrews Labor Government while convictions related to family violence are falling. The Andrews Labor Government must follow the lead of the Liberal Nationals and support our initiative to better support women and hold perpetrators to account."

Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says following repeated calls from The Nationals, the Victorian government has announced learner drivers from across regional Victoria will finally be able to sit their learner's permit test online.

Mr Walsh, together with his National Party colleagues, has repeatedly called for online testing to be implemented to help manage the huge backlog of testing appointments following their cancellation due to the COVID-19.

"A lot of our young people have been directly impacted by this and have been very patient waiting for their tests," Mr Walsh said.

"A driver's licence is crucial for young people in rural and regional areas where public transport is virtually non-existent – they need a licence to be able to get to and from work or seek employment.

"Their employment and future prospects have been severely hampered by their inability to sit a test. It is extremely frustrating that while testing resumed in September, it has taken Labor a further eight months to implement on-line testing when the technology already existed and was available," he said.

While the first 500 prospective learner drivers to sit the test are from the Gippsland region; Mr Walsh expressed his ongoing frustration, on behalf of his constituents.

"While I am pleased for these Gippsland residents, they have been selected in recognition of the long distances many have to travel to sit the test in-person," he said.

"Well this also directly applies to the residents of Murray Plains, if you are in Swan Hill you have further to go than someone from Sale or Bairnsdale; from Echuca the distance is almost identical to Sale, so surely they could be spreading this around the state.

"I am calling on the Andrews Labor Government to immediately expand eligibility to include Murray Plains residents; so our young people are not left stranded and even further disadvantaged than they already are by the lack of public transport available."

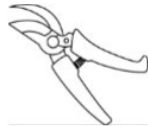
