Hello again Everyone,

We've been reading early newspaper reports about our district in 1888. In the middle of that year, before the drought had set in, a number of visitors to the area recorded their impressions. Short of having photographs, their descriptions paint pictures to help us envisage just how it might have looked at that time. The earliest was a correspondent to the Bendigo Advertiser on 5 May 1888. He was visiting the area after an absence of six years and was "disagreeably how well Mr Mitchell had done with his Leicester sheep-breeding surprised to note the changes for the worse that have taken place in program, and he also remarked on Mr Scott's fine orchard. The "hamlet" of Terrick Terrick appeared deserted but for "Mr Davies and his family." The writer noted that "Mr A visitor from the Melbourne Advocate, in August 1888, was Jewell" had "enlarged his borders considerably," by having purchased impressed with the "bustling little township" of Mitiamo, relocated several of the surrounding properties, and he also noted that "the old township of Mitiamo is now reduced to one hotel... the tradesmen having all removed to the new town at the railway station." Before there are less than a hundred inhabitants in the township, yet the returning to Bendigo via Elmore, the writer stayed overnight at Pine Grove, and was "pleased to find that the inhabitants are thriving ... There are but few living on 320 acres, as most of the land is held in prosperous condition of the township is but a reflex of the farming what may be called family groups."

Another visitor, this time to Milloo, recorded his impressions in the Leader, on 12 May 1888. He described Milloo as being "one of the oldest settled parts of the Terricks district, and also one of the most populous and prosperous," and he went on to name some of its large area of land under cultivation but in addition to this, Mr Hogarth with the new station buildings, is quite an ornament to the town." had a successful dairying operation; Mr Mitchell went in for sheep breeding "and usually carries off quite a number of prizes at the surrounding shows," and "Mr. Scott does a good deal of pig breeding, and his young swine are eagerly sought after throughout the entire district. He also pays a large amount of attention to his fruit garden, which is one of the very best in the district."

The next descriptive article appeared in the Weekly Times, on 23 June 1888, and was written by a 'Traveller' who visited the parishes of Pannoobamawm and Bamawm, and found them to be very like the Goulburn Valley, with similar soil and the same kind of timber. Because the land was more productive, farms in these parishes were smaller than those out on the plains. The 'Traveller' named Messrs. Francis, Bartrop, Chisholm, Piper, M'Dowall, and Milton as being among "oldest and best-known" of the local settlers. He then went on 'Bye until then, to say that he did "not know of any places where more charming landscape views are to be obtained than around Pine Grove," which Marg O'Brien. place he next visited. "Some of the leading settlers are Messrs Reigal, Bishop, Crawford, Chappell, Lamb, Yeoman, Cant, and Allan... Horse breeding is gone into enthusiastically around Pine Grove. Old Lord Clyde, the celebrated imported Clydesdale stallion,

stood at Mr Crawford's homestead for some time." "Mr Reigal," the 'Traveller' said, was "generally looked to as one of the best authorities in the district on any and all subjects relating to farming." South-east of Pine Grove was Pannoomilloo, a parish closely resembling Bamawm, with successful farmers there including Messrs Raper, Cochrane, Yeoman, Davies and notably, Mr Todd, whose vines the 'Traveller' said, had "done particularly well." Like the visitor from the Leader a month earlier, when he visited Milloo, the 'Traveller' noted Hughes, Brereton, Thomas, Marwood, Lea and Orchard.

> Though the 1887-88 harvest had been disappointing, the Terricks Plains had experienced a very acceptable "Autumn break" in early May 1888. However, though some rain fell over the ensuing months, it was barely adequate. On 26 July, the Pannoomilloo correspondent to the Bendigo Advertiser reported that conditions were exceedingly cold and wintry for the staging of the Diggora Ploughing Match on 21 July, and the inclement weather had "materially affected the takings" for the day. Along with those compliments for Mitiamo in the Kerang Times and Swan Hill Gazette on 14 August, (mentioned above), the Pannoobamawm correspondent reported that the crops there were "still very backward." We'll have to hear about the remainder of the vear next time.

Have you voted for your preferred option for the Lockington Sewer Services?

Last Wednesday, 6th April, 2022 Coliban Water held a meeting in Lockington.

Coliban Water is now preparing the next Pricing Submission for 2023-2028 and reviewing the town choice previously for septic tank cleaning.

The two options we now have are:

OPTION ONE: Sewer Rebate: This rebate provides customers with a sewer rebate of \$124 per annum. The rebate will be applied to the fixed Sewer Service Fee. Customers can continue to use their preferred septic tank contractor at their own cost.

OPTION TWO: Septic Tank Cleanout: This option offers customers a free clean out of their septic tank every three years at the cost of Coliban Water. Customers must use the contractor Coliban Water engages. Customers need to liaise with Coliban Water to arrange a time and date for the contractor to access their tank. Customers will continue to pay the normal sewer access charges. This is the Option Lockington currently has in place until 30 June 2023.

(Most septic tanks you will find don't need cleaning every three years but this depends on the size of your household. (note added by Fay).

If you haven't had your septic tank cleaned out for free as yet, there is still time to do this before the 30^{th} June, 2023 under the original five year vote of 2018 - 2023.

The \$124 sewer rebate is not implemented until 1st July 2023

Customers with a sewer account in Lockington are eligible to vote for the option they prefer. The option with the most votes will be implemented for the town.

You can vote on line or return your Ballot Form received in the mail before 15th April, 2022.

Coliban Water is contactable on 1300 363 200 for any further information.

Each sewer account is entitled to one vote. If you own more than one property you can submit a vote for each property. You can include multiple addresses on the one Ballot Form or submit a new ballot for each property.

Coliban Water has not given much time to get your vote back to them so if you are going to vote it will have to be done asap.

The meeting was poorly attended and I believe many did not get their notice of the meeting till after the event which is why I have submitted this article. The information I have put together comes from the information and papers given out at the meeting on the night of the meeting and sent in the mail to you.



WHAT ANZAC DAY MEANS TO ME

For years I have been researching my family history and Albert re-enlisted twice, firstly working as a Permanent over the last 18 months I went a step further and completed a formal qualification, a Diploma in Family History. Prior to studying I had accumulated many records, documents and certificates, many of which were related to my ancestors serving in the two world wars. But there was one person in particular that I never knew about until I delved a bit deeper though the Families and War unit as part of the Diploma. I discovered Albert Ernest Sheldrick (who was my great-grandmothers sister's son) had landed on Gallipoli on that fateful day and survived to tell the tale. Using a range of war records, Trove newspaper articles, websites and war diaries I was able to compile a picture of who Albert was and where he served.

Albert was born in Melbourne in 1887 but soon became a country lad living in Colac and then moved to the Mallee to work on the railways as a Conductor. Albert was part of the Nhill/Eversley/Kaniva community and in August 1914, at the age of 27, he was one of the first to sign up to serve in WWI. He was given a local hero send off, first at the Fire Shed and then the town marched and cheered as they chaperoned Albert and other local enlistees to the railway station to see them board the train: bound for the Broadmeadows Training Camp.

Like many men, Albert thought the war would be all over by Christmas so was surprised that it wasn't until Christmas Day that he finally found himself on a ship heading to Egypt. After finally arriving at Port Said, Egypt

he then spent time under the shadow of the Pyramids completing more training before heading off to Lemnos in April 1915.

As Albert waited in one of the 200 vessels that left Lemnos on 24 April 1915, he would not have known he was about to be part of one of the most significant, difficult and confusing moments in World War One. He would not have known that as he and his fellow soldiers edged closer to the Gallipoli coastline that this fateful day will long be considered as a failure but also be forever commemorated for what was sacrificed by so many.

By 8.30am on April 25, 1915 Albert had left the safety of his small vessel, made his way into a small barge, then row boat, then navigated the rocky beach with his heavy pack to be faced with rugged terrain, heavy shrapnel fire and hand-to-hand bayonet fighting against the Turkish 19th Division. Albert survived the landing but on the following day he was victim of bayonet combat which injured his left thumb, as well as being blasted by shellfire sending him over a ridge. His injuries were significant and he was taken on board the hospital ship 'Itonious' and admitted to the 17th General Hospital in Alexandra.

Albert recovered from his wound and returned to the front line on May 15, 1915 but only ten days after joining his battalion back at Gallipoli he become unwell with appendicitis and headed back to Egypt. He had his appendix removed on board the hospital ship but didn't recover very well and took weeks to get over his operation. With significant ongoing health issues, he had to return to Melbourne and his time on the frontline was over.

Albert was discharged from the A.I.F on 31 October 1915, spending more time in hospital on his return. He did manage to attend Welcome Home festivities in Colac and Nhill, his parents, along with the communities who followed his service through the local papers, were proud of his service.

Guard and then as a Base Records Clerk at the City Barracks until 1919. He went on to work for Melbourne City Council. In 1942 he passed away at the age of 55.

This Anzac Day, I will be thinking of Albert and the person I got to 'know' through my research. I will be reflecting on his willingness to serve his country and his ordeal at Gallipoli and the ongoing health issues when he returned home. It will also be about the small communities such as ours that were so proud to see their boys sign up and then celebrate their return. But also, the communities so devastated when the newspapers listed the local men killed in action, the families who received the telegram stating the unbearable news and the memorials that listed their names forever more.

I am happy to assist anyone who would like to research their ancestors who were involved in active service.

This article is a summary of what I discovered, there was so much more to his story.




LIFE MEMBERSHIP FROM THE LOCKINGTON BAMAWM UNITED LAWN TENNIS CLUB INC.
