Pannoo Bamawm Cemetery - repairs to fencing to rabbit proof


Camp Draft/Pony Club - refurbish toilet block

Hello again Everyone,

We've been reading early newspaper reports of life in our district in 1888 and early 1889. The very real fears of another drought or 'water famine' that were being experienced by the local residents had been alleviated by a couple of falls of heavy rain at the end of December 1888, but the muddy roads quickly dried out and by 25 January, local correspondents to the Bendigo Advertiser were reporting daytime temperatures of about 105°F (40.5° Celsius). Nevertheless, it was felt that the district would be "in excellent condition for feed purposes during the coming winter." Much local attention was focusing on an upcoming election, particularly as there had been a change to electoral boundaries. The Mandurang electorate had been split and the greater part of the Terricks Plains region was now in the new electorate of Gunbower. As reported in the *Advertiser* on 30 January 1889, three candidates would be contesting the new seat.

High hopes were being entertained that the Government would this year approve the construction of a railway line from Elmore to Gunbower, or possibly Cohuna, via Milloo, Tennyson, Pine Grove and other localities across the Terricks Plains. On 1 February, the Elmore Standard reported that "Mr Reigal, the president of the Elmore to Cohuna [Railway] League, accompanied by Mr Brown, a surveyor from the Railway department, visited Elmore on the 12th ult. They had that day travelled together from Pannoobamawm, keeping within sight of the proposed railway route, and it appeared that Mr Brown had said the line presented no engineering difficulties, and was one he could generally approve of." Further boosting hopes of growth in townships in the area, on 22 February, the Standard advertised a Government Land Sale of allotments in the township of Pannoobamawm. [As far as I can gather this would have been somewhere in the vicinity of the present-day Pannoobamawm (Pine Grove) Cemetery.]

By mid-March, as noted in the Bendigo Advertiser on 16 March, there was once again an emerging need for rain, but the upcoming election was still a prime news item. In the Kerang Times and Swan Hill Gazette of 19 March 1889, it was "tipped" that Mr McColl, the "water" member would poll "two to one" among district electors. He was highly regarded locally, due to his persistent efforts over many years to obtain an adequate and reliable water supply for the farming communities across the northern plains of Victoria. The Times and Gazette also reported in that edition, that the surveyors on the proposed Cohuna railway line were making rapid progress and were now working near Pannoobamawm.

It was not until 6 April, that rain began to fall in the district, but then it rained almost continuously for two days, according to the Milloo correspondent as published in the Bendigo Advertiser on the 9th. Marg O'Brien

Such rain indicated there might actually be a need for weather protection, and correspondents from Wanurp and Piavella were pleased to be able to write to the Elmore Standard, on 19 April, that after a wait of three years, the "promised" goods shed at the Prairie Railway Station was under construction at last. They reported that the local winter cricket season had commenced, but they had some bad news too, in that typhoid fever was raging in the district. Fortunately, no cases had proved fatal. Sad news was reported by the Elmore Standard on 10 May 1889. Mrs Orchard of Milloo, a pioneer settler of the district, had died from pleurisy. Other early settlers who had passed away in that twelve-month period were Mr Hipwell Snr., of Wanurp, and Mrs Penny, of Diggora.

With the arrival of winter 1889, as the correspondent from Pannoobamawm remarked in his 24 May report to the Kerang Times and Swan Hill Gazette, the district had gone from "heat and dust" to "cold and mud." But local residents were not really complaining as, since the beginning of the year 11 inches (275 mm) of rain had fallen and, without frosts, crops and pastures were growing rapidly. The report continued: - "In 1875, when many of the selectors had just settled on the land of this district, the season was much like the present one, but ever since there has been an insufficient rainfall, so that the promise of the first season has been a long time in being fulfilled." Fortunately, the next heavy rain held off until 2 June as, on 29 May, the Milloo district celebrated a wedding at St David's Church. "August Henry William Fiedler, youngest son of Mr Fiedler, Huntly, was joined in the holy bonds of matrimony to Mary Jane, the eldest daughter of Mr. Jasper, Wanurp" as reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 3 June 1889. Rain continued throughout the month, and on 26 June, the Pannoomilloo correspondent wrote to the Advertiser, "Everywhere the roads are in a frightful state and almost impassable ...Yet we ought to be very thankful we are not suffering from the effects of the floods as some other places are."

The long-hoped-for railway would not solve the district's transport problems this year, but there had been some progress with the survey of the proposed route. On 21 June 1889, the Elmore Standard relayed a letter from the Engineer of Construction (Mr. G. C. Darbyshire) stating that "trial surveys have been made from both Elmore and Bagshot to a common point of junction in the parish of Warragamba. Another survey is at present being made from Huntly to the same point. This will be finished in about a week, when the survey party will remove to Pannoomilloo, and continue the survey northwards to Cohuna."

#### Pumpkin..... A Soup Favourite

#### **Ingredients:**

- 750gm Jap Pumpkin diced
- 250 gm potato diced
- 2 medium onions diced
- 3 chicken stock cubes crumbled
- 3½ cups water
- 250ml thickened cream
- Pinch of salt and pepper to taste

#### **Method:**

- 1. Place all ingredients, except cream, into large saucepan.
- 2. Simmer until vegetables are tender
- 3. Remove from heat
- 4. Blend with a stick blender (or processor) until smooth
- 5. Add cream and stir through (do not boil after adding cream)
- 6. Season to taste





## WALSH URGES PRIMARY SCHOOLS TO APPLY FOR A LONE PINE SEEDLING

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, is urging primary schools in his electorate to apply for the chance of receiving one of just 100 seedlings from the Lone Pine at Gallipoli.

The 100 seedlings from perhaps the most famous tree in the Australian story are being given away by the Friends of Gallipoli in 2023 to help celebrate the centenary of Turkey.

The Lone Pine battlefield was named for the solitary Turkish pine that stood there at the start of the Anzac assault in August 1915.

It was also, in part, a stunning Allied victory after days of savage fighting but unfortunately the rest of the offensive around the battle at Lone Pine quickly became bogged down without achieving any other significant advances.

Mr Wash said the ensuing stalemate between the Turks and the Anzacs at Lone Pine would remain until the Allied forces were withdrawn under cover

of night, in December 1915.

"While the overall campaign was a failure, the battle itself has become part of Australian lore and its capture certainly saved a lot of Allied lives in the last few months of the Gallipoli campaign," he said.

"The Friends of Gallipoli are giving away a Lone Pine seedling to 100 Victorian Primary Schools and I am encouraging all the schools in my electorate of Murray Plains to apply for one.

"Friends of Gallipoli chairman John Basarin tells me the seedlings will be provided in the first half of 2023 to celebrate the Centenary of the Republic of Turkey."

Mr Walsh said RSL Victoria has endorsed the project but schools should note the seedlings will be allocated to schools on a first-come, first-served basis.




#### Tyler "T-Bone" Phillips
