RURAL AID ARRIVES IN LOCKINGTON FOR OUR TOWNS WEEK

Tuesday May 17

Rural Aid's "Our Towns" makeover week has begun in Lockington, with dozens of volunteers starting work on the town's nominated projects.

Lockington is one of 10 towns across Australia chosen to receive \$100,000 to help deliver a range of community-building projects.

Small town expert Peter Kenyon from the Bank of IDEAS worked with Lockington's local leaders and Rural Aid staff to create a Community Development Plan to guide the town's priorities and projects.

43 Rural Aid volunteers are now helping to deliver the plan by completing a number of dedicated projects.

The Rural Aid team is this week working on Lockington's bowls club, Senior Citizens Hall, tennis club, rail trail, heritage centre, boardwalk and pony club.

Lockington local and Our Town coordinator Wendy Sims said the town was buzzing.

"It's wonderful for the Lockington community to see this project arrive," she said.

"It's so satisfying to know that other people have belief in us and see us as important."

Rural Aid works coordinator Grant Miskimmin said the team has been welcomed with open arms by the Lockington community.

"It's a pleasure to help the Lockington community with this project," Grant said.

"We're honoured to be able to give some treasured local assets a real boost over the next week and help support the people of Lockington, our mates in the bush."

Locals are encouraged to say hello to Rural Aid's friendly team around town this week.

The Rural Aid convoy arrived in Lockington on 15 May and will leave on 21st May.

Hello again Everyone,

We've been reading early newspaper reports of life in our district in 1889. From an agricultural perspective, the weather conditions in the first six months of that year were ideal, and it seemed this would be the first season since 1875 to live up to the expectations of the early selector settlers. According to the *Elmore Standard* on Friday, 5 July 1889, a light fall of snow took place at Pannoomilloo on the previous Sunday. July was cold but still wet and the crops, though checked by the cold weather, continued to look well.

The social life of the district was looking well, too. On 9 August 1889, it was reported to the *Rochester Express* by the Pannoobamawm correspondent, that a Mutual Improvement Association had been formed with an initial enrolment of 21 members and, at the local rifle butts, members of the Pannoobamawm Mounted Rifles participated in a contest for a five guinea trophy. Recent weather had been "beautiful," and they hoped that would continue so as to ensure the success of the military ball they planned to hold on 7 August 1889. Presumably, their hopes for that evening were realised but, two days later, the *Bendigo Advertiser* reported that a "terrific hailstorm" occurred at Pannoobamawm on 8 August. Otherwise, fine conditions were maintained until the end of the month when heavy rain commenced falling on the evening 29 August, and it was followed by a steady downpour on the 1st and 2nd of September. As a result, the *Advertiser* reported on 2 September, parts of the district looked like small lakes. The 'lakes' were considerably larger further north.

Early in the morning on 2 September 1889, the Campaspe River overflowed its banks at Echuca and water spread across the plains, "in some places to a depth of several feet," according to the report that was published in the *Argus* that day. In fact, severe flooding continued to affect the countryside around Echuca for the following two weeks, with reports appearing in all of the Melbourne daily newspapers. At Pannoomilloo, the steady rain was appreciated but it left the roads "in a pretty plight," according to the report in the *Elmore Standard* on 13 September. Sadly, that paper also reported the district's most recent loss to diphtheria, the John Anderson Family's youngest child, George.

The weather continued to be bleak – "Wintry in the extreme," wrote the Tennyson correspondent to the *Elmore Standard* on 20 September 1889, but "the prospects were ever brighter from a farmer's point of view." He then went on to say "As showing what may be accomplished by energy, perseverance, and good management, even on these

despised arid northern plains, it is very gratifying to notice that the first prize and also the Grand Champion Prize of Australia for the best 140 lbs. of salt butter (suitable for export), was awarded to Mr. C. Yeaman, of Wanurp, at the late National Agricultural Society's Show at Melbourne."

It was not rain but wind that next struck the district, in a "fierce thunderstorm" that "broke ...with tremendous force, accompanied by lightning," on 26 September 1889, as reported in the *Bendigo Advertiser*. It left a trail of damage in its wake. The chimney of the Terrick Terrick State School was blown down. At Pannoomilloo, trees were "uprooted and torn off about halfway up the stem," and the verandah of Mr Walker's house was lifted and carried 50 yards away, with loose sheets of iron being blown even further. Two tiers of bricks fell from the chimney, which was pulled so much out of line that it would need to be rebuilt. Some local crops appeared as if flattened by a roller. In Pannoomilloo, trees of eighteen inches in diameter were levelled like twigs for a width of about 8 or 9 chains. However, the situation could have been worse, and a report in the *Bendigo Advertiser* on 16 October, stated that, in most parts of the district, the crops looked "splendid," though there were rumours of rust and take-all occurring at Pine Grove.

For a while the campaign for railway facilities in the district had faded from the headlines, but some progress was reported by the *Rochester Express*, on 9 August 1889. "The flying survey party at present engaged on the route of the proposed railway to Cohuna has got as far north as the [Pannoobamawm] State School. The track has been marked out from Elmore, Bagshot, and Huntly, which are the different points at which it is desired to effect a junction with the main line." Then, on 14 October, the Vigilance Committee at Elmore discussed a proposal from Pannoobamawm that another railway demonstration, similar to that held in October 1888, be held to arrange "for the completion and despatch to Melbourne, of the Heathcote to Elmore Railway petition." If completed this line could provide a shorter route between the Murray River, at Echuca, and Melbourne. This meeting, reported in the *Elmore Standard* on 18 October 1889, also discussed the provision of cool storage facilities at railway stations in northern Victoria, and cool railway trucks "for the purpose of conveying perishable produce from the sheds to Melbourne."

BEVERLEY PENTREATH

Pentreath, Beverley Maude.
10.12.1939 ~ 20.03.2022

Beverley was born on 18th Dec 1939 at Murray House, Echuca to Dick & Maude Dinsdale.

The nurse asked Maude what the baby's second name was and she said, "We haven't got one yet."

When the nurse asked, "What's your name?" her reply was, "Maude."

The nurse then said, "That's a nice name," so Beverley Maude she became.

Maude was a family name – both her grandmothers and aunty had Maude as their second name, and there was a great Aunt Maude as well.

Bev said in recent years that all the old names have come back for baby names - but not Maude!

The three boys often called her Maudie.

Bev grew up on the family dairy farm at Bamawm Extension with siblings Edna and John. Unlike them, Bev never liked milking though.

They attended the Bamawm Extension school, riding their bikes, and made long friendships with many of those fellow students.

Bev would holiday with cousins, and they would often visit the farm – the Pomfrets, Thorns, Dinsdales, Truscotts and the Dyers. It was Jack Dyer who brought up Richmond jumpers for the Bamawm Extension Football Club. Bev was a Richmond fan but she also liked Bobby Skilton, so South Melbourne was a favourite team earlier.

As an infant she drank dishwashing liquid which was immediately treated with milk and then to hospital – perhaps that's why she always disliked milk.

There was a tennis court on the farm and visitors would come to play tennis and Maude would cater.

Bev had plaits as a young girl but they often became victim on the school bus being tied to the back of the seat.

It was on that school bus she used to wave to a young Lockyite, Gerald Pentreath.

After going to High School, Bev went to the Tech where she learnt dressmaking and later made many of her dresses including her wedding dress. During this time she became a Prefect.

Like many youth in the area, Bev was a member of the local Social Club going on trips such as to the snow.

Although she didn't like snakes and lizards, frogs were a real phobia and the subject of many gifts – magnets, tea towels etc.

In 1956 it was off to Melbourne to see the Olympics where she had her photo taken with a member of the Hungarian team.

With cousin Margaret and aunt Jessie Dinsdale, they went on holidays to the Sunshine Coast and Tasmania.

Sport was limited in those days but Bev, with Edna, played Basketball/netball in the Bamawm Extension Basketball League playing at Country Week in Melbourne.

Bev attended many social dances winning a Belle of the Ball for the Echuca Football League.

The Echuca Memorial Pool had a fundraising queen competition to build the pool. Bev won the fundraising with more than 50% of the total money raised by all entrants. Mr Cliff Spiers was a driving force behind the Bamawm Extension entrant and she always respected him.

Bev was asked to enter the Miss Australia competition, again raising monies. Some of the funds raised were from selling calves and a pony raffle.

As was the trend, Bev made her deb with John Stuart as her partner.

Bev became a nanny looking after local children in their homes; amongst them the Williams', Jaspers, Clymos, Fiedlers and the Coghills. When she first started at the Coghill's she asked a very young Wayne (now known as Pooh), "Where does Mummy keep the tea towel." The answer was pretty definite, "Behind the fridge you bloody idiot." That story kept getting told, and laughed at, for decades.

Bev and Gerald married at St Canice's Church on 12th Oct 1963

When Bev and Gerald went to Shepparton to live, Bev worked at a dress shop. Pauline Turner worked there also, and with her family became lifelong friends.

They lived at Mooroopna and Shepparton eventually buying in Halpin Cres. Times were tough but the occasional Friday night fish and chips were a treat.

Soon after Bob and Val Arnup and family moved next door and the children, all being of similar age, grew up together.

Gerald started umpiring with the Goulburn Valley Umpires. At one match Bev was in the car and some hecklers started abusing Gerald for being slow. Bev quickly wound down the window and said, "He's the fastest umpire in the league," to which the abuse was turned to her. She wound up the windows and locked the doors and never did that again.

They played tennis at Mooroopna on weekends and Bev played squash during the week.

The children started arriving between 1965 and 1970 - Steven, John and Daryl.

With Val Arnup, Bev collected for the Salvos at least one year saying, "You never know when you'll need them."

In 1973 the opportunity to buy the Lockington butcher shop came up and it was back to the butcher shop for Gerald with Bev taking over Jessie's adjoining Roma Café "for a couple of years," she said. That became 17 years.

In an age when most adults were addressed as Mr and Mrs, Bev was always called Bev, regardless of the customer's age.

Full of fun always, Bev didn't mind playing tricks.

One day she saw Bet Mustey coming to the shop so she crouched down behind the door and as the door opened she grabbed the incoming leg. Unbeknown to Bev, Bet had gone to the butcher's shop instead. Bev had grabbed the leg of a male customer.

Bev became involved and active in many community organisations, regularly holding executive positions—:

- Lockington Social Club
- Scouts & Cubs
- Tennis – winning Section two aggregate one year
- Netball – a highlight was playing with her nieces, about half her age.
- Lockington Football ladies committee (receiving Life Membership)
- Swimming Pool
- Bush Nursing Centre Hall Committee
- Community News volunteer
- Business Centre volunteer
- Deb Balls – where she was comfortable in various roles: organising, catering, MC or Chaperone
- Lockington Golf Club – making many friends and enjoying trips away
- Elmore Ladies Tennis
- Senior Citizens
- Country Music Festival host
- Miss Australia with entrant Jackie Mills, winning the regional fundraising and going to the state final
- Huntly Football Club committee

On top of this Bev supported Gerald with the many organisation he was involved in.

9.5 for more travelling with a variety of friends, including many with the Stones, Malones and Lees. This meant Gerald's dream holiday of going to McColl (which is near the Locky tip), became Bev's dream holidays to the Whit-sundays, Fiji, Darwin, Tasmania, Western Australia, Thailand and Singapore and various places in Victoria.

Every time the boys went out shooting, Bev would have her special scones with jam and cream ready for us when we got home.

Bev always welcomed the boys' friends into the house with open arms and she always put on a magnificent feed.

About this time the daughters-in-law came on the scene. Kim, Lois and Lindy and all got on famously with Bev. Then grandchildren with Ryan, Kyle, Kane, Abbi and Shawn. The kids spent lots of time with Bev and Gerald, and Bev made birthday cakes for every child's birthday. At Christmas time Abbi and Jake announced to Nan that a great-grandchild was on the way.

In the last years Bev's health declined leading to the diagnosis of Epilepsy and more recently Dementia. Gerald's support of Bev is known to all. To everyone that assisted and supported in any way, the family is so grateful including the caring organisations Lockington Bush Nursing Centre, and at Rochester, Echuca and Moama, then finally at Cooida in Benalla.

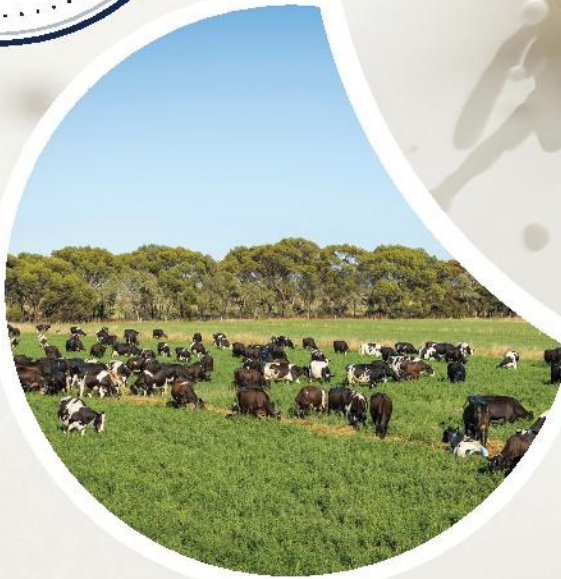

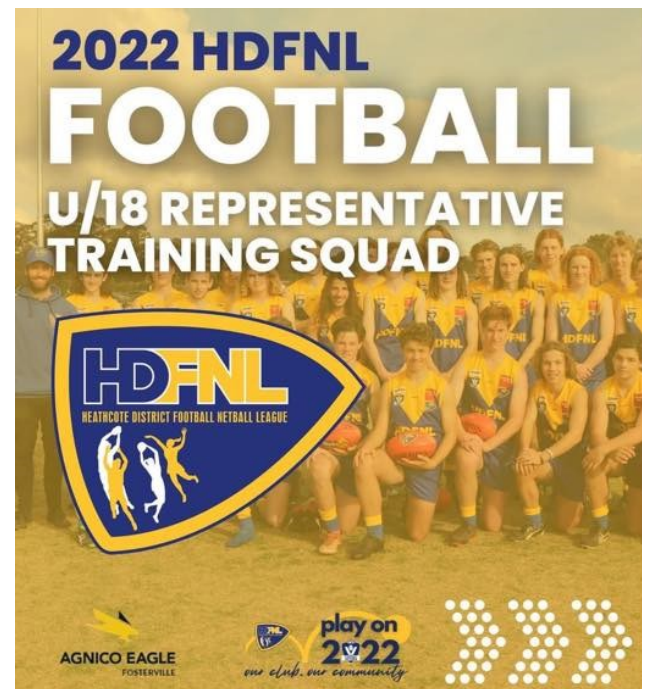
