Hello again Everyone,

Lockington township owes its very existence to the coming of the Elmore-Cohuna railway line about a century ago. Local residents waited a very long time for that line. In the mid-1870s, they began agitating for a railway to be provided through the district, and over the intervening years their hopes were dashed time and time again. We've been looking at the newspapers through those years, to read what was happening here, and to learn how our forebears coped. When last I wrote, our search had taken us up to May 1890 and, by mid-year, the crops which had been growing satisfactorily, were attacked by locusts. We will now see how the rest of the year turned out.

On 2 June 1890, the *Bendigo Advertiser* reported on the opening of the final section of the Sandhurst (Bendigo) to Swan Hill railway line. This particular extension had been sought since 1876, and in October 1878, the response was a decision to construct a line from Eaglehawk to Kerang, with the possibility that an extension to Swan Hill might be considered in the future. Right up until November 1881, with work on the Kerang line about to begin, the people of our district kept up an opposing campaign in the hope of having the line re-routed. They wanted the starting point to be at Elmore so the line would pass through here en route to Kerang. They failed in their quest, so in September 1883, when the line was completed as far as Mitiamo, they began a new campaign; this time, to have a siding provided on the Kerang line at the point most convenient to Pannoomilloo. Prairie Railway station is the outcome of that particular effort. It was only after the line had been completed to Kerang in October 1884, that the Victorian Parliament agreed to the construction of the extension to Swan Hill. Progress since then had been delayed due to flooding and other problems, so the opening on 30 May 1890, "was truly a red-letter day in the history of Swan Hill." As reported in the *Bendigo Advertiser* on 2 June, "the people knew it and made a great demonstration in honour of the occasion."

June 1890 brought encouraging, railway-related news for the people of our district, too. It was reported in all of the metropolitan daily papers on 18 June. On 17 June, the Premier, Mr Gillies, had introduced the Government Railway Construction Bill in the Legislative Assembly, and the Elmore-Tomara line was included in the forty-three country lines listed to be built. The Bill had been referred to the Railway Commissioners for consideration and for details of estimates, etc., before its second reading. To say that the locals were pleased would be an understatement. The *Bendigo Advertiser* of 27 June 1890, reported that on 24 June, "A large and enthusiastic meeting of the residents of the parishes of Bamawm, Pannooabamawm, Wanurp, Diggora, Pannoomilloo, Milloo, Torrumbarry and Terrick Terrick East, was held at Pine Grove East"..."to express the gratification of the people interested at the inclusion of the line from Elmore to Tomara in the New Railway Bill." A resolution to that effect was passed, along with another stating

that "this meeting desires respectfully to point out to the Government the great desirability of extending the proposed line some distance further, as by such extension an additional rich district will be reached from which a large amount of ordinary agricultural produce, as well as products raised by irrigation, and also large quantities of red gum timber will be sent away, ensuring a profitable traffic from the very completion of the line, and requests that such extension may be added to the bill". A third resolution expressed "hearty" thanks to Mr. J. H. M'Coll, M.P., for his attendance... "and for the readiness and ability with which he has on all occasions endeavoured to forward the interests of the constituency."

Similar votes of appreciation and thanks were passed at a meeting of the residents of Gunbower and the adjoining parishes which took place on 26 June, according to the *Melbourne Argus* on 30 June 1890. Those present there also urged that a further extension of the line, beyond Tomara, be considered as "absolutely necessary ... to make the line at once profitable." The distance of the proposed line was 30 miles, and it may be that nominating Tomara as the terminus was a cost-saving gesture; thereby, rail transport would be made more accessible for residents beyond that point, especially grain-growers, without the expense of providing any more infrastructure. Tomara had been gazetted as a village in 1876, but very little development had since taken place there, apart from the provision of a Council tank/dam and Mr Leulf's hotel. At the other end of the proposed line, it was being suggested that Bagshot rather than Elmore, should be considered as the point of take-off from the Sandhurst-Echuca main trunk line. However, "the feeling of the landowners and farmers between Elmore and Cohuna is decidedly in favour of the junction at Elmore, as bringing them nearer (via Heathcote) to the metropolitan markets and the seaboard," according to the *Elmore Standard* on 27 June.

As reported in the *Argus* on 15 July 1890, the Victorian Premier, Mr Gillies, moved the motion for the second reading of the Railway Construction Bill to take place that day. He first circulated the report of the Railway Commissioners on the lines proposed; estimates of cost, reports of surveyors (with reference to any anticipated engineering difficulties), and a table giving particulars of the value of the rateable property, the number of live-stock, the acreage under cultivation, the character and quantity of the produce raised, the value of the improvements on farms, and also that of the farming machinery and plant in the respective districts which were likely to be served by the proposed county lines. From this, members of the Legislative Assembly were left to draw their own conclusion as to the amount of traffic that was likely to take place on any of the lines on their completion.

Andrews finally sees the light and backs our plan for youth mental health says Walsh

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says the Andrews Labor government did a 180-degree turn this morning and endorsed the Liberals Nationals plan to unlock 2000 counsellors to immediately help kids struggling with their mental health.

Except, he says, it won't be as immediate as it should – Labor only agreed to a start date in September next year – still well ahead of its frightening 2026 original plan to support most schools.

Mr Walsh says the Liberals Nationals first proposed the common-sense change in September last year and it has taken Labor this long to realise the Opposition was right – but they still haven't grasped the simple immediacy of the strategy.

He says the youth of Victoria will get access to extra workers after changes introduced to the Victorian Parliament this morning as part of the Mental Health and Wellbeing Bill will finally see the definition of a mental health practitioner expanded to include counsellors.

"When we put this plan forward as a Private Member's Bill in September 2021, and tried again in the October, it was stopped both times when Labor MPs voted against it," Mr Walsh says.

"The same MPs who this morning approved it," he says.

"The Labor government's backflip – nine excruciating months later – is a red flag that Daniel Andrews was playing politics with the mental health of Victorian children. And the 12-month delay shows he still is.

"The Liberals Nationals have proudly supported the advocacy of the Australian Counsellors Association for this positive change, which is a long overdue win for better mental health of Victorian children."

Mr Walsh says by expanding the definition giving schools access to so much more support, it will go a long way to relieving desperate workforce shortages and for existing staff already fatigued from the extra demand on the sector as a result of the pandemic.

He says sadly, these counsellors could have been supporting our kids to recover for the past nine months, but Labor's delay with its political shenanigans is just another fumble for all the world to see.

"Abandoning Victorian children who are still struggling to come to terms with the social isolation and disruptions of Labor's six lockdowns is a low act of political bastardry," Mr Walsh added.

"Even now, Labor's delays mean many schools will still be unable to fill positions that have been allocated through the Mental Health Practitioners in Schools Fund for at least a year," he says.

"The Australian Counsellors Association and their members should be proud of their tireless efforts to fight to be recognised for the positive contribution they can make for Victorian's mental health.

"But there's more to be done to build the mental health workforce. Only a Liberals Nationals government elected in November will launch the nation's largest recruitment drive to unlock more workers to support Victorians to recover good mental health."

\$250 power subsidy for every house in my electorate: Walsh

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, is advising every household across his electorate – and the state – to go after a better energy deal on Victoria's Energy Compare website.

And pocket a \$250 Power Saving Bonus at the same time – to help offset rising power costs.

Mr Walsh says the new \$250 payment is available from today to all Victorian households who visit www.compare.energy.vic.gov.au to compare their energy deal and seek out a better price.

He says every household who visits the website is guaranteed a \$250 bonus.

But the bonus may only be claimed once per household.

"The quickest way to submit an application for the \$250 Power Saving Bonus is through the website but local residents who do not have access to a computer or the internet should call the Victorian Energy Compare helpline on 1800 000 832," Mr Walsh says.

"Residents across northern Victoria continue to pay some of the highest prices in the state for their electricity and gas," he says.

"User data shows seven out of 10 households across Victoria can save money by switching energy offers, with typical annual savings of \$330 on energy bills in the first year of switching.

"There remains, however, few opportunities available to change suppliers and reduce costs locally due to the inaction of the Andrews Labor Government – so the opportunity to receive a one-off \$250 bonus shouldn't be missed."

Mr Walsh says with its previous \$250 bonus, the Andrews Labor government made it a 100 per cent online opportunity, which disadvantaged thousands of people across his electorate and tens of thousands across the state.

He says with cost of living on the rise – and power prices in Victoria climbing too fast because of bungled industry management – every extra dollar helps alleviate strain on the household budget.

Households that have previously claimed a \$50 or \$250 Power Saving Bonus will be eligible for this new one-off payment, which will be available until June 30, 2023.

"We are told the \$250 Power Saving Bonus is separate to the Non-Mains Energy Concession, which remains open. Concession card holders who source non-mains energy for their heating, cooking and hot water can apply for this concession to help cover their yearly energy costs until December 31," Mr Walsh added.

"To be eligible for this payment you must hold either a Pensioner Concession, Health Care or Veteran's Affairs Gold Card and be able to provide copies of invoices and receipts for payments made.

"So remember, if you don't have digital access, or you know someone who doesn't, you can either help them locally or get them to dial 1800 000 832 for assistance.
