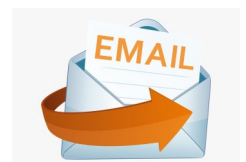

Hello again Everyone,

We've been looking back at early newspapers to learn the story of our district from the Selection Era until Lockington was gazetted as a township. The provision of railway services in the region was vital to its over-all development, and of particular significance to Lockington, but the rail lines took many years to arrive. Our story has reached June 1890, when the Railway Construction Bill passed its first reading in the Victorian Parliament. To the great satisfaction of our local people, who had been campaigning for more than fifteen years for a local rail service, the Elmore-Tomara railway extension was among those named for construction. The second reading of the Bill would have been anxiously awaited.

In the meantime, the weather and its effects provided the main topic of local conversation. On 27 June 1890, the Pannooabamawm correspondent to the *Rochester Express* wrote: - "Less than four months ago we were grumbling loudly about the heat and want of rain! Now the complaint is that the roads are almost impassable on account of mud and slush.... Crops are coming on nicely on high and dry land, but all swampy ground is under water, and so is the young crop. The paddocks are just like a pulp." The children at the Milloo State School would have been very glad of the shelter shed that had been approved in early April. In its report of 4 April 1890, the editor of the *Elmore Standard* drew attention to the need for such a facility at the Elmore school.

The wet weather continued, which was something unusual on the Terricks Plains. More than an inch [25 mms] of rain fell in the first week of July, and the Tennyson correspondent to the *Elmore Standard* commented on the situation in his report published on 11 July, stating that they had recorded "a total of 11 inches and 18 points [283.97 mms] since the beginning of the year ... June, 350 pts [88.9 mms] – the highest June rainfall recorded for fifteen years ... Crops of all kinds are, generally speaking, looking well, and are making good progress. Feed is also plentiful, and all kinds of stock as a rule, are in forward condition."

The "heavy" roads did disrupt the social scene a little. The quarterly elections for the Pannooabamawm Mutual Improvement Association had to be rescheduled, but there was an attendance of "upwards of 30 members" when they were held on 28 June 1890. On 18 July, the inaugural meeting of a Mutual Improvement Association

established by the Pannoomilloo Wesleyan Church was held, with about 30 people present. Reporting the event to the *Elmore Standard* on 23 July, the Tennyson correspondent felt there was "ample room for a society of this kind in every parish," adding that "'Imitation is the sincerest flattery' so ... the senior society should take the newly established one as a compliment to themselves."

In the meantime, the second reading of the Railway Construction Bill had taken place on 15 July 1890. Information provided to Parliament by the Railway Commissioners indicated that the Elmore to Tomara extension railway line – amended now to terminate at Gunbower – would cover a distance of 30.2 miles at an estimated cost of £124,615, and would service a population of approximately 3,200 people. The extract from the surveyors' report stated: - "The district passed through by this line consists of land all of good quality, and suitable for agriculture. For the first eight miles it is chiefly used for grazing purposes, but between this point and the terminus the land is well settled, and a very large proportion of it is cultivated. There is also a large area of good land beyond the end of the line, the owners of which would be accommodated thereby."

On 23 July 1890, the Milloo correspondent wrote to the *Bendigo Advertiser* about the ongoing rain. "The roads are in a filthy state, and some of the formations are almost rendered impassable. Fallowing operations have been prevented by having so much rain: only new land has been turned over up to the present, as the old land is so saturated with water that it will not carry the teams." In other district news, the local candidate, Paul S Penrose had polled successfully to fill the vacancy in the South-west riding of the Echuca Shire Council, caused when Cr S Hughes left the district to move to Melbourne. In other news, there had been two reported local incidents of typhoid fever; crops and livestock were doing well, but foxes were becoming prevalent; the head teacher at Tennyson, Mr Dawborn, was moving to Coranderk School; and the Pannooabamawm M I A was planning to set up a local library. Everyone waited anxiously for the outcome of the Railways Construction Bill's passage through Parliament, but there had been a hitch. There will be more about that next time.
