Hello again Everyone,

We've been looking back at early newspapers to learn the story of our district from the Selection Era until Lockington was gazetted as a township. In June 1890, it seemed that a railway service for which the local people had campaigned since 1876, and which would be of enormous significance in Lockington's story, would become a reality. Construction of a line from Elmore to Gunbower was included in the Railway Construction Bill introduced in parliament in mid-1890, but that Bill did not receive support. A subsequent Bill was passed in October 1890, to authorise the appointment of a Railways Standing Committee to gather evidence concerning the cost and merit of the lines included in the Construction Bill, in addition to others that had been surveyed but were not included in the Bill. Once again, our local residents could only wait and hope.

On 15 April 1891, the Standing Committee began taking evidence about proposed railway lines in this part of the State; beginning at Echuca, with regard to a line between there and Torrumbarry. The outcome of their inquiry was reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 16 April. At the Echuca Borough Council Chambers, the Committee met with a group of officials including the Mayor, with Mr J M Chanter MLA, and with the Echuca Shire Engineer. These witnesses claimed that the costs as estimated in the Construction Bill were excessive, and that the route as it had been surveyed could be bettered. It was also claimed that farmers to be serviced by the line would be prepared to accept slight increases in freight charges until the line became a payable proposition, and that the anticipated introduction of irrigation to the district would bring increased population and increased production along the route, thus improving its prospects. Further investigation was then postponed until later that month and the Committee returned to Melbourne, rain having made it impossible to travel by road to the other towns where it was intended that evidence be heard.

The *Elmore Standard*, of 24 April 1891, outlined the new itinerary for the Standing Committee's tour through the area, as provided to the paper by Mr J H McColl MLA. The Committee would arrive at Elmore on the night of 28 April, and would depart for Cohuna next morning. En route to Cohuna, they would take evidence at Pannoobamawm, Tomara and Gunbower before proceeding to Gunbower Station where they would stay overnight on 29 April. The Committee would then travel to Cohuna early on 30 April, to take evidence there at 9 a.m., before travelling to Macorna for their return train trip to Melbourne.

As planned, the tour began on 29 April 1891, with members of the Elmore Railway League providing transport for Standing Committee members on the first stage of their journey. They followed closely the surveyed route of the proposed railway line until they reached Pannoobamawm. On 1 May 1891, the *Elmore Standard* reported that Committee members had expressed themselves as "much pleased with the appearance of the

country." A large number of farmers had gathered at the Pannoobamawm State School to present evidence of the favourable prospects on offer for a railway line through the district. The Committee heard of the types of crops grown, number of acres under cultivation, numbers of stock, numbers of creameries, schools, etc. The Echuca Shire Engineer gave evidence "from a constructive standpoint," and samples of the ballast which could be obtained in the district were produced. According to the *Standard's* report, local landholders indicated they would be prepared to play some part in meeting costs "if the railway was constructed and produced no revenue." Luncheon was provided for the visitors before they continued on their way.

On 2 May 1891, the *Leader* reported on the remainder of the Standing Committee's tour of inspection. At Tomara, they were met by a large number of farmers residing in that district, and by members of the Echuca Railway League. The suggestion was made that construction costs might be reduced if the railway line followed the main Terricks road rather than purchasing land. "All the farmers present agreed to guarantee to make up loss — if any — the department might suffer." Farmers also gave evidence at Gunbower, again suggesting that the route follow the main road, and agreeing to guarantee the department against loss of interest should the line not pay. Statistics of probable traffic and income were provided. On the morning of 30 April 1891, at Cohuna, the Committee took "corroborative evidence," before driving to Macorna to gather information in respect of a proposed Mitiamo line, and meeting the train for their return to Melbourne. Our district's residents had now to wait for the outcome.

A more immediate concern had emerged on the local scene, with the presence of numerous hares and foxes being reported to the Bendigo Advertiser and the Elmore Standard by their Tennyson correspondent. Both papers reported (on 15th and 19th June 1891) that, despite there having been "fairly good percentages" of lambs obtained in the current lambing season, foxes were responsible for heavy losses on some farms. Poultry had also been ravaged. On 3 August 1891, the Tennyson correspondent reported to the Bendigo Advertiser that a very successful day of hare shooting had seen about forty of the district's farmers dispense with 300 to 400 of the pests, but the fox nuisance persisted. On the wider scene, the Bendigo Independent had reported on 1 July, that the Shearer's Dispute was making inroads into Victoria. Until then, most of the strike action had taken place in Queensland, but the Amalgamated Shearers' Union had now stationed pickets at crossing places along the Murray River. Their purpose was to intercept straggling shearers and form them into camps to keep them back from shearing sheds.

#### **COLIBAN WATER UPDATE**

We are upgrading the Lockington Water Treatment Plant. The upgrade will include installing a Booster Pump Station to improve your water pressure, particularly during hot weather when there is increased demand on the network.

We conducted exploratory works on the site in preparation for the installation of the Booster Pump Station and have identified a series of electrical upgrades at the plant that are needed before the Booster Pump Station can be commissioned. The upgrades will include the installation of a backup generator to ensure the continuation of supply during a power outage.

The electrical upgrades will delay the commissioning of the Booster Pump Station, but this is necessary to ensure you receive long-term improvements to your water pressure.

We anticipate the Booster Pump Station will be commissioned mid-2023.






