# "Lockington - Lines in Time"

Hello again Everyone,

We've been looking back at the newspapers of the day to learn how people fared in our district, from the Selection Era of the 1860s and 70s until the Elmore-Cohuna railway line was constructed and the township of Lockington was formed. We have now reached 1893, and one of the notable events that occurred that year was the opening on 12 November, of the newly built St Patrick's Catholic Church at Tennyson. The weather that day was less than favourable but The early months of 1893 had been dry and, though good rains fell nevertheless, there was a very large attendance. The church was blessed by the Co-adjutor Bishop of Sandhurst, Rev Stephen Reville, OSA, with Prior Murray of Echuca and Prior O'Hanlon of Rochester in attendance. The Elmore Standard of 17 November 1893, announced that the building had been opened "entirely free of debt." Mr C Gray of Rochester was the architect for the new church which the newspaper described as being "very prettily decorated inside." Some idea of the interior fittings can be gained from this item which appeared in the Bendigo Advertiser on 21 August 1893. It read: -

"A neat and most artistic piece of work has just been completed by Messrs. Billets and Houghton, the contractors to the new Roman Catholic Church at Tennyson, in the form of the altar which is to adorn the building. The general design is the idea of Mr Gray, the Rochester Shire Engineer, and is characterised by a beauty and originality of form, and delicate blending of tints in its ornamentation, which make the completed work a real sample of judicious art production. The altar has a back formed of three large panels, the centres of which are filled with sacred emblems surrounded by a fringed border. The painting was the work of Mr Henry Plumbe, a local artist. The tabernacle is a piece of excellent work and artistic design. The canopy, or roof, is supported upon beautifully turned pillars mounted on Corinthian

columns, the front being ornamented with an illuminated cross surrounded by a wreath of flowers. The steps are V-carved and filled in with green and gold. The front of the altar is divided by four Doric columns, painted to represent marble, and between each column the panels are thrown out by ornamental woodwork, relieved by emblems. The whole constitutes a most elaborate piece of work and does credit to all engaged in its production."

throughout the winter months and into Spring, by 6 November that year, the Melbourne Age was reporting that harvest prospects in the neighbourhood west and northwest of Echuca were "gloomy." However, a month later, the Elmore Standard of 8 December 1893, noted that there were "good" crops around Rochester, Elmore and Goornong. Their reporter considered that the best crops were in Diggora, and possibly extended as far north as Pannoobamawm, but beyond that he felt the yield would be a poor one. To add to the farmers' worries, at that time low prices were being paid for wheat and other farm produce, leading to concern about the relatively unfair prices being charged by machine-owners for threshing the farmers' grain. The Elmore Standard reported that meetings to discuss this problem were held at Pannoomilloo on 13 November and 29 November 1893, with delegates attending from Milloo, Tennyson, Elmore and Pine Grove. Those present determined a standard for the number of hours to be worked and the rates to be paid, with printed notices of these to be circulated among district farmers.

By mid-December 1893, the grain harvest was in progress and the local stock market was in a very depressed condition. Despite the Leader of 16 December, having reported "some phenomenal yields of wheat" and an "exceptionally good" oat harvest in the Terricks district, it was not expected that the yield overall would be a particularly good one, and this was borne out as the season progressed. The Leader noted that a number of bush fires had occurred, with one on Messrs Booth and McGillivray's run having done considerable damage. At Milloo, as reported in the Bendigo Independent on 15 December 1893, about forty people had successfully brought under control a fire which broke out there on 13 December. Twenty acres of grass had been burned on the property of Mr J Orchard, before the fire spread to Messrs Mitchell Bros' property where it consumed another fifteen acres of grass. The news item praised the efforts of the firefighters, and the ladies who had kept up a supply of water to assist them, but it also noted that not all of the neighbours had come to lend a helping hand. Another fire about a week later destroyed a 20-ton haystack on the Milloo property of Mr M Patterson, as reported in the Melbourne Argus on 23 December 1893.

Lightning caused destructive fires in the Terricks district in early January 1894, with the Horsham Times reporting on 9 January, that "A large area of country was quickly under flames." Hot and dry weather continued as the New Year progressed and, on 27 February, the Melbourne Age reported another serious fire in the Terricks which had destroyed hundreds of acres of grass and several chains of fencing. Early that year, the people of the district were saddened by the loss of two of its very early pioneer settlers. On 24 January, Mrs Letitia Mellen, aged 63 years, of Milloo, died in Bendigo. As reported in the Elmore Standard on 26 January 1894, her remains were interred on 25 January, in the Elmore Cemetery. On 16 February 1894, the Standard recorded that Mr Thomas Scurrah, a long-time resident of Pannoobamawm, had died at his home there, on 7 February. He was 69 years old, and bequeathed an estate of considerable value to his wife and children.

There will be more of 1894 next time. 'Bye, Marg O'Brien.






