"Lockington - Lines in Time"

Hello again Everyone,

We've been looking back at the newspapers of the day to learn how people fared in our district, from the Selection Era of the 1860s and 70s until Lockington township was As the end of 1894 approached, weather conditions generally had seemed conducive to an above average harvest. However, the seasons seem never to have been trouble-free for this district's settlers. Though rain so often evaded them, it had come in 1894 but, by late October, crops "out Pannoomilloo and Tennyson way" were showing occasional "patches of smut" and "in odd places a trace of rust." As reported by the Tennyson correspondent to the Bendigo Advertiser on 26 October 1894, farmers now wanted a few weeks of fine dry weather. However, one can have too much of a good thing. Heat and scorching wind were experienced in late November, and "apparently healthy, fine crops ... suddenly withered away in patches," as reported in the 1894, in the evening, on 22 November, Thomas, the nine-Advertiser on 24 November. The *Leader*, on 15 December, reported that for most of the region, the Pannoomilloo, went with several other boys to swim in a sudden change to hot dry weather had been "most dam near the Tennyson State School. When he suddenly unfortunate," but crops on the Terricks and Torrumbarry plains, being more advanced than those further south, were less damaged by the heat. However, just days happened to be working nearby. later, the Bendigo Independent published a report repeatedly in an effort to find the boy, with Mr Windridge from Terricks East, stating that a heavy fall of rain eventually bringing him to the surface. had interfered with harvesting, and yields were "not resuscitate him were unsuccessful. as good as was anticipated.

the recent shipments of mutton have realised, have induced Messrs. A and M Whinfield, of Lucerne Farm, Bamawm, to try the experiment. Accordingly, yesterday a nice truck consignment of "freezers," numbering 1,000 head, was sent away by them from the Rochester station. This consignment, which consisted of very prime merino 4 -tooths, is entirely at the risk of the Messrs. Whinfield, who, should the venture prove profitably remunerative. intend devoting themselves to the business in future. The Weekly Times of 24 November, stated that the 1000 Merino wethers sent from Bamawm would "be killed and forwarded to the English market in the form of frozen mutton. The sheep in this consignment are a fair average sample of what the district can produce, and the result of the experiment will be eagerly watched."

A number of bushfires occurred across the north as a In Bamawm, farmers had turned their attention to another result of the hot weather, one of the earliest of these being at Bamawm on 27 November. This fire broke out on the farm of Mrs Burge, and spread to properties owned by Mr Hilton and Mr Whinfield. An 80-acre crop of fine wheat was destroyed, as well as about 200 acres of grassland and about six miles of fencing. Reports of the fire were carried in the Riverine Herald of 28 November 1894, and in the Bendigo Advertiser the following day. The hot weather abated but was followed by heavy rain that delayed harvesting operations, and in some instances, severely damaged crops. In summarising, on 29 December, the Australasian described yields in the Terricks, and along the Murray generally, as "only moderate." While "a good average harvest" was reaped around Rochester, the overall yield was expected to be less than that of the previous year. In other farming news, foxes were becoming numerous throughout the district and rabbits were still to be found in large numbers. Creameries and butter factories were doing well, and the various irrigation trusts were "kept busy supplying the requirements of their constituents.

> As the year drew to an end, an outbreak of influenza, reported by the Bendigo Independent on 18 December 1894, caused some concern but it appears to have remained well contained. On 20 December, it was the Independent that recorded the passing of Mrs Elizabeth Luelf who, with her husband, Herman, had run a hotel on the Terricks from very early in the settlement period. Mr Luelf died about three years before his wife, who had then let the hotel and moved to the Mallee where she lived with some of her adult children. Mrs Luelf's funeral took place in Echuca, where Father Allen officiated at the grave. As she had been so well-known throughout the district, there were many sympathisers for the family in their bereavement.





If you're not sure, and don't want to trim, please cut a large margin (perhaps ¼ of the envelope), or give the whole envelope.



FARE CUTS WITHOUT A PLAN ARE FAST TRACK TO BIGGER STATE LOSSES WARNS WALSH

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says he wants to know how the Andrews Labor government will offset low regional rail fares - its latest budget-busting promise.

Mr Walsh says as important as it is to give regional Victorians all the help possible, independent analysis has already discovered a \$155 million funding shortfall in its promised cheaper V/Line fares.

He says a government fast-tracking Victoria towards bankruptcy is now splashing out cash it doesn't have like a spendthrift with a sense of humour.

"Parliamentary Budget Office figures show the true cost of Labor's cheaper V/Line fares policy to be \$358.1 million in the next four years, a massive \$155 million more than has been budgeted by the Andrews Labor Government to date," Mr Walsh says.

"This budget shortfall is anticipated to reach more than \$900 million in the next decade, so even before the first person in my electorate hops on a cheap train the ongoing viability of cheaper public transport for regional Victorians is at serious risk," he says.

"Victoria's net debt is set to exceed that of NSW, Queensland and Tasmania combined, and the interest bill to service Labor's debt is more than \$10.5 million every day - and climbing.

"You have to be in a class all of your own to be this bad at managing an economy and Daniel Andrews has always thought he was one of a kind. And he is, he's the one who spent two long years through Covid doing his best to wreck the economy and the very social fabric of this state - and now he is going to bury whatever survived under a mountain of debt.'

Mr Walsh says the current cheaper fare plan is "wasted money" which could be better spent on delivering better. more frequent rail services while keeping fares fair but affordable.

He says with regional Victorians set to access his cheaper V/Line fares from this weekend, the Premier must come clean on how it intends to fund the policy long-term.

"The funding shortfall for regional public transport services was another consequence of Labor's financial failures," Mr Walsh added.

"And Labor's financial failures mean it can't afford to keep fares low in the medium, let alone the long term - I reckon people in my electorate would simply be happy if the track was fixed so the trains could go faster than pushbikes - and that there were a few more of them each day," he says.

"People from every corner of our state deserve cheaper fares and better services to get to important appointments, events or to see friends and family.

"Eight years of mismanagement and incompetence means that important services could be at risk. What services will be cut or when will V/Line fares be increased again?

"Labor is still yet to answer one simple question. How does it intend to deliver cheaper fares indefinitely without raising taxes or cutting jobs to make up the billiondollar shortfall?'
