"Lockington - Lines in Time"

Hello again Everyone,

We've been looking back at the newspapers of the day to learn how people fared in our district, from the Selection Era of the 1860s and 70s until the township of Lockington was formed. The provision of a branch rail service, connecting with the Bendigo-Echuca main line at Elmore and extending through this district to Cohuna, was to be a vital factor in Lockington's story but, though vigorous campaigning had taken place from as early as 1876, by the mid-1890s, the muchneeded facility was yet to be provided. In the meantime, farmer settlers throughout the region battled on, transporting their supplies and their farm produce along deeply rutted and dusty roads that became absolute quagmires on those few occasions when it rained.

However, there was progress on the social scene. The people themselves had built small churches throughout the district, and these drew together vibrant groups of supporters for church functions, but also for tea meetings, harvest festivals and Sunday school picnics. In addition, each locality had its own State School, where the local people gathered for school concerts and sports days. These schools were also used as venues for public meetings, and for meetings of such groups as the M I A. On 14 February 1896, the Bendigo Advertiser published a report from its Tennyson correspondent stating that the local Mutual Improvement Association's fortnightly meetings at the Tennyson school were well-attended and that the association, which had been in existence for seven years, had "increased its attractions by the addition of an excellent circulating library." Another meeting which took place at the Tennyson school 23 May 1896, was that at which it was decided to form the Tennyson Philharmonic Society, with Mr A L Haslam as conductor. Office bearers appointed were Mr G

Wallace, president; Mr A Munro, vice-president; and Mr W Woolcock, secretary. Miss G Anderson was appointed as librarian, and Miss Harrison, as accompanist.

Mr Haslam had been mentioned in the *Elmore Standard* on 17 April 1896, as the teacher of child musical prodigy, Miss Daisy Bray, of Milloo, who at the age of eight years had been appointed as the organist of the Milloo Church of England. Some time earlier, Daisy, then aged seven years, had played Mozart's "Gloria" at a concert at the Rochester Shire Hall, and her musical skill was regarded as exceptional. Her performance was highly commended, with predictions made that she would enjoy considerable success in later years, and Mr Haslam was congratulated for "bringing her on." The Tennyson Philharmonic Society continued to do well and, with their membership growing to thirty, they met every Wednesday evening for rehearsal in preparation for their first concert which was to be held in November that year.

Several weddings of local interest took place in 1896. Wednesday, 15 April," as reported by the Bendiao Advertiser on the following Wednesday, "a wedding was celebrated at the Wesleyan Church, Pine Grove, the contracting parties being Miss Rosina Chappel, eldest daughter of Mr Joseph Chappel, of Pine Grove, and Mr Jos. Squire, second son of Mr John Squire, of Wanurp ... As this was the first marriage solemnized in the new church, the trustees presented Mr and Mrs Squire with a very handsomely bound family Bible and hymn book." Two weeks later, on Wednesday 29 April, once again reported in the Advertiser, "an interesting wedding was celebrated at Pannoomilloo, the contracting parties being Mr James Stanley (of the Education department) and Miss Nellie Raper, eldest daughter of Mr Charles Raper, of Pine Ridge estate, Pannoomilloo." On 3 June 1896, there was another wedding of local interest, this time at Yallook. As reported to the Bendigo Independent of 5 June, by its Tandarra correspondent, this wedding "took place at the home of Mr John Harry, uncle of the bride, when Mr Thomas B Harry, of Milloo. was united in wedlock to Miss Jane Peters, daughter of Mr William Peters, of Dunolly, but who for many years had lived with her uncle." At the end of the celebrations, "the happy couple departed for their home at Milloo amid a salute of rice, old shoes and crackers, and with the best wishes of friends and relatives for their continued welfare."

The Bendigo Advertiser on 8 August 1896, carried a report of the wedding of Miss Margaret (Maggie) Joyce, eldest daughter of Mr Edmund Joyce, of Pannoobamawm, and Mr Owen O'Brien, eldest son of Mr Michael O'Brien, of Tennyson. This ceremony took place at St Patrick's Catholic Church at Tennyson, and quests attended the wedding breakfast which followed at the home of the bride's parents. "The happy couple left Prairie by the evening train for Gippsland, amid the hearty wishes of a large number of friends who assembled to see them off." On 11 September 1896, the Elmore Standard reported the marriage of Robert Henry, eldest son of Mr Robert Nankivell, surveyor, of Pannoobamawm, to Esther, second daughter, of Mr Walter Elliot, farmer, of Pinegrove East, which took place at Echuca on 8 September. On 16 October, the Standard reported the marriage of Mr James Ironside, of Auburn, to Miss Elizabeth Scurrah, daughter of the late Mr Henry Scurrah, of Pannoobamawm, which took place at the residence of the bride's mother on 13 October 1896. Afterwards, "a most recherche breakfast was provided in a large marquee" on the property, and the young couple left Rochester by the 5 o'clock train.

That long-sought-after train line through our district would have meant newly-weds need not have had so far to go to catch a train, but it would be many years before it would be provided.

[Recherche means exquisite – I admit I had to look it up!] 'Bye until next time, Marg O'Brien.



The most important message put across was HOW IMPORTANT IT IS FOR BREAST SCREENING. Ladies and men develop breast cancer, so look and feel.
