"Lockington - Lines in Time"

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached the late 1890s, as we look back at the newspapers of the day to learn how people fared in our the township of Lockington was formed. While the crops expected, those in the north and west failed dismally. drought. The farmers in Pyramid Hill, Terricks and Echuca district are having holes bored in available rocks, which are charged with powder and other explosives, and when the clouds are lowering will have them fired. Many are anxiously watching for the result of the experiment." Fortunately, good rains fell naturally, from 19 June 1897, and Mount Terrick Terrick survived!

On 23 June 1897, there were to be celebrations throughout the British Empire to mark the sixtieth anniversary of Queen Victoria's accession to the throne. 

Mr Godfrey was farmers is the latest idea to meet the effects of the terrible aged just 54 years, and had been among the first of the selector farmers to arrive in Diggora in 1871. On 8 June 1897, a report of the funeral of Mrs Cath McIntyre, of Terricks East, was published in the Bendigo Independent. Mrs McIntyre died suddenly on 2 June, and was survived by her husband, James, and their two-year-old son, On 27 June, Mr Robert Henderson, of Stephen. Pannoomilloo, died at Rochester after a short illness. He was survived by his wife and a grown-up family, as reported in the Elmore Standard on 2 July. That issue of the paper also carried the news that Diggora suffered yet another loss with the death of Mr Daniel Kildea on 30 June 1897. It stated that he "was held in high respect throughout the district, and was most successful in farming pursuits." He had attained the age of 63 years, and left a widow and young family to mourn his loss.

> district weddings, both being reported by their Pannoomilloo correspondent to the *Elmore Standard* on 2 On 22 June, Miss Elizabeth (Lizzie) Raper, youngest daughter of Mr Charles J Raper of "Pine Ridge," married Mr Edmund L Ham, fourth son of Mr Henry M Ham of "Glen Devon." The ceremony was conducted by the Rev. T Neilson in the Pannoomilloo Presbyterian Church, and was followed by a bridal party at the residence of the bride's parents. Guests then drove to Rochester, where "amidst showers of rice and good wishes," the young couple left by the evening train for the metropolis. The second wedding was that of Miss Annie E Orchard, second daughter of Mr Joseph Orchard of Piavella, and Mr James Marks of Pannoomilloo. The ceremony, and the reception which followed, took place at 'Piavella Park' on 23 June. "In the evening the happy couple left for their future home at Kamarooka." different ceremony, involving a young resident of the district, took place at the end of June 1897, at the Brigidine Convent in Echuca. The Bendigo Advertiser on 1 July, reported that a congregation of some two hundred friends and relatives were present to witness the reception of Miss Mary Anne Dullard, daughter of Mr P Dullard, as a novice in the Brigidine religious order.

> The rain, which fell intermittently from 19 June 1897, gave new hope to the farming communities on the northern plains. The Tennyson correspondent wrote to the *Elmore* Standard on 9 July, "What was a short time ago a brown waste is now covered with young grass and crops. The dams are well supplied with water, and the mortality amongst stock has been reduced very much. All things now point to a prosperous half-year." Furthermore, the Tennyson Philharmonic Society was "making splendid progress," and winter cricket was under way once again. The only depressing item was the report that Scarlatina in a mild form was very prevalent throughout the district.



Individuals requiring treatment will be contacted and will receive appropriate care in a safe and suitable location. The two test vending machines will be rotated across five communities in the Loddon, Mallee and Hume regions. The STI test vending machine will be placed at the Echuca Library until October 2023.
