LOCKY LEGENDS SIGN UP FOR THEIR 6TH GREAT CYCLE CHALLENGE

Jenny and Garry Mustey will once again be hitting the tracks, trails and local roads to participate in the Great Cycle Challenge. This will be the sixth time they will be joining thousands of other riders across Australia to raise money for the Children's Medical Research Institute. Their fundraising will enable the Institute to continue their work into the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and finding a cure for childhood cancer. Over the past five years Jenny and Garry have raised over \$8000 and ridden over 4500kms. Their aim is to raise another \$1000 and ride at least 500kms during October 2023. “Lockington - Lines in Time”

Hello again Everyone,
We have reached 1898, as we look back at the newspapers of the day to learn how people fared in our district, as the end of the Nineteenth Century approached. Writing to the *Elmore Standard* of 21 January, and 4 February 1898, the Pine Grove correspondent noted that local farmers engaged in dairying were “having a good season,” with “three or four hundred gallons of milk still coming to Fiedler and Appleby’s cream, butter and cheesery,” but most of the news in the early part of that year was focused on the grain harvest. The correspondent felt it was still too soon to give a precise estimate of the yield, as the harvest was proving to be a particularly “long” one. It was difficult to obtain extra manual labour to assist in taking the crops off and, as there were “none too many machines about,” it would be “some little time” until threshing would be completed. In this regard, McDowall Bros’ machine had been engaged at Mr Chappel’s in Pine Grove; Brasier’s threshing machine was also working in that district; and Turner’s and Walter Bros’ machines were at work at Diggora.

Early February saw some easing of the summer heat, and about an inch [25 mms] of rain fell across the district. Again, it was the Pine Grove correspondent who reported to the *Elmore Standard* of 18 February, that the supply of drinking water had been replenished, the dust laid, and the possibilities of bush fires minimised. On 5 March 1898, the *Bendigo Independent* reported that harvesting was completed, and Harvest Thanksgiving services were being held in the churches around the northern district. With work now behind them, the young men of the northern plains returned to their favoured sport of cricket, and some even went fishing or for a bathe in the Murray River.

Not all of the news was good. On 5 March 1898, the *Bendigo Advertiser* regretfully announced that Mr James Lowrie had died at Coburg on 4 March. He was eighty years of age and, having farmed at Milloo for more than twenty years, was well-known in that district. On 25 March, the *Elmore Standard* reported the death of Mr Henry Johns, a long-time resident of Pannoomilloo, who had been ailing for some time. That issue of the *Standard* also carried the news that Mr Henry M Ham of Pannoomilloo had been seriously ill for some weeks and that, in the meantime, his sons, Lou and Ed, had both contracted influenza. Fortunately, all three were recovering. The *Standard’s* correspondent from Pannoomilloo and Pine Grove had better news with some upcoming weddings to report in its issue of 25 March 1898; Miss L Walter was to marry Mr Joseph Cox; Mr Alfred Raper was to marry Miss Ellen Cox; former district teacher, Miss Richards, was to marry Rev C H Zercho, minister of Dookie and formerly of Mitiamo; Mr Josiah Walter Francis of Torrumbarry, was to marry Miss Ann Elizabeth Walter of Pannoomilloo; Mr Hugo Hildebrandt, of Melbourne, was to marry Miss Annie Russell M’Gregor, eldest daughter of Mr James M’Gregor of Bamawm; and there was the marriage of Mr William John Cox and Miss Elizabeth Jane Todd, which had already taken place, “a few days since.”

On the wider scene, Federation was the major topic, and, on 18 May 1898, Mr Max Hirsch addressed about forty electors at Milloo. On 27 May, the *Elmore Standard* reported the address, stating that Cr Allan occupied the chair and introduced Mr Hirsch, who went thoroughly into the Bill, explaining the various clauses. “He made a most eloquent appeal to all present to vote for the Bill and to use all their endeavours in getting others to vote ... The speaker met with hearty applause at the conclusion, and a motion for the Bill by Mr Munro, and seconded by Mr Tonkin, was carried by an overwhelming majority.” On 3 June 1898, as reported in the *Elmore Standard* a week later, “a poll was taken in Victoria, New South Wales, and Tasmania on the Federal Bill. Victoria accepted by a large majority.” The *Standard* went on to report that “Mandurang electors strongly supported the Bill, the majority being exactly 4 to 1, and in only one instance, at Milloo, did the noes outnumber the ayes. [20 yes, 22 noes].”

On 3 June, the *Elmore Standard* reported from Pine Grove that rain was needed for the new crop to germinate, and that farm families were carting water from Cochrane’s well, Warragamba, and other wells in the district for stock and for domestic use. Fortunately, rain came later that month, though the weather was extremely cold. On 8 July, the Tennyson correspondent was quoted in the *Standard*, saying the rain had helped and that grasses and crops were coming along splendidly. Cricket was capturing the attention of the district’s youth once more, though it did have some competition from the newly-formed Tennyson Cycling Club. This club held its first road race at Tennyson on 25 June 1898, causing a great deal of local interest.

Commenting on the “Agricultural Prospects in the North,” an article published by the *Colac Herald* on 26 July 1898, stated as quoted: - “The seasons of semi-famine have passed, and present appearances seem to indicate that Dame Fortune will ‘scatter plenty o’er a smiling land.’... My impression is that the tide has turned and the long-wished for change has come ... Since the break-up of the drought, rains have been plentiful and regular, and now nothing can prevent a good season.” The farmers on the northern plains would have been hoping the writer of that article was correct. ‘Bye until next time,

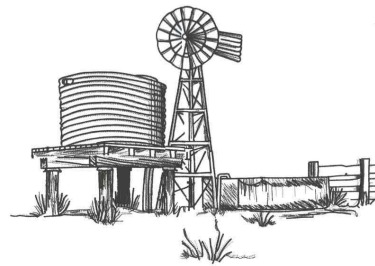

Council seeks MAV support for 'betterment' funding

Council has endorsed a motion for inclusion at the Municipal Association of Victoria (MAV) State Council Meeting to be held Friday 13 October 2023. The motion calls on the Victorian and Australian Governments to commit to providing full disaster recovery funding to enable the repair of public assets, such as roads, damaged by natural disasters, to current day standards to provide improved disaster resilience. The current funding arrangements only allow like-for-like replacement or repair. A commitment by the state and federal governments to provide this 'betterment' funding would allow councils to submit claims to fund improvements to their assets so they are better protected against damage from natural disasters into the future.

Submission to the Productivity Commission review of the Murray Darling Basin Plan

Council endorsed a submission to the Productivity Commission's five-yearly implementation review of the Murray Darling Basin Plan. Campaspe Shire Council's submission highlighted the significant economic contribution the agriculture and food manufacturing industries make to the local economy and emphasised the need for continued access to water for economic survival and growth into the future. The submission reiterated Council's support of the environmental outcomes aimed at achieving through the Murray Darling Basin Plan, but not be at the cost of the long-term viability, economic growth and wellbeing of Campaspe towns.

Draft Municipal Early Years Plan open for comment

The draft Municipal Early Years Plan 2023-25 was authorised for release for public comment for a period of four weeks. The Draft Municipal Early Years Plan 2023-25 was developed following community and industry consultation and outlines our strategic direction to promote positive outcomes for children 0-8 years of age and their families within Campaspe Shire. The Draft Municipal Early Years Plan will be available to public to view and comment on Council's website on the Now Open page or at any Service Centres until 13 September.

Bed tax: It's the Daniel Andrews cost of sleep squeeze says Walsh

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says just when you thought Daniel Andrews had bled you dry, now he's planning to tax you for sleeping.

Mr Walsh says regional Victoria's already battered tourism industry now faces a 'bed tax' in hotels and short stay rentals.

He says Victorian Tourism Industry Council chief executive Felicia Mariani has told him the tourism spend across the state was already lagging behind NSW and Queensland.

"So why not kick an industry when it's down in a disgraceful last gasp bid by Daniel Andrews to offset the financial basket case this is the Victorian economy," Mr Walsh added.

"Even in Melbourne – the apple of Dan's eye – the accommodation industry is up in arms saying this is one tax too many, and it will cause job losses and cut spending across the tourism/visitor board," he says.

"With thousands of businesses there screaming blue murder – and more than 1200 have already written scathing protests to the Premier – you can imagine the ripple effect across regional areas.

"This latest stealth attack on the taxpayer's hip pocket means any Victorian, let alone interstate or overseas visitor, who travels overnight to attend footy matches, shows, medical appointments or treat weekends will be slugged.

"And the knock-on effect will be cuts in discretionary spending when they do travel, supporting other businesses in the area."

Mr Walsh says all the statistics show more than twice as many intrastate overnight trips are made by Victorians, rather than interstate travellers staying in our state.

He says he hasn't met a business owner or operator yet who plans to absorb another round of taxes when you look what Daniel Andrews has done to their power bills alone.

"These costs will all go straight to the consumer because if a small business, in particular, adds another minus to its bottom line, it will potentially put them out of business," Mr Walsh explains.

"Maybe this round of upcoming taxes is to pay for the Commonwealth Games, which, had they gone ahead, would almost have certainly filled hotels, motels and short-stay venues across regional Victoria," he says.

"But once again our Premier has demonstrated his total incompetence in managing anything beyond his memory lapses at any inquiry into his bungling and blowouts – and it's the taxpayer who gets to foot the bill again.

"That's not really anything to give us a night of undisturbed sleep, is it Dan?"



Walsh is 'appalled and deeply troubled' by police station changes

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says he is "appalled and deeply troubled" by plans to strip small country towns of their one resident police officer.

Mr Walsh says in the latest ruse to try and fool the Victorian public into thinking Victoria Police is in good shape under the Andrews Labor government, officers from 98 one-person stations in small towns will be rostered into larger regional hubs and cities.

A move he says will leave these many communities feeling unprotected and exposed.

In his electorate of Murray Plains, the stations caught up in this "radical rewriting of the rules" will see Boort, Gunbower, Koondrook, Pyramid Hill, Quambatook and Tongala lose their independent police support.

"Rural communities which have fought hard to get, or retain, their police stations, are being undermined by this stealth tactic from Daniel Andrews Inc – and that's wrong," Mr Walsh added.

"Victoria Police cannot fill and/or maintain rosters in its larger 24-hour stations, it is facing a mass exodus of officers and now, once again, rural and regional Victoria pays the price for Daniel Andrews and his failures," he says.

"Police union secretary Wayne Gatt has gone on record saying the Victorian Government has lost hundreds of police during the past two years, adding they have about 800 vacancies.

"He says any government suggestion the force has grown by additional police this year would be a fallacy."

Mr Walsh says Nationals members around the state are already seeing the community fallout in their electorates just as he is.

He says officers in the one-person 16-hour stations say they are already being pulled out to meet Commissioner Shane Patton's mandate that every shift at nearby 24-hour stations must be filled.

"There are hundreds of police off on long-term sick leave, that's a matter of public record, and it would seem the only real plan in place is to steal staff from smaller regional stations to keep those 24-hour stations open," Mr Walsh says.

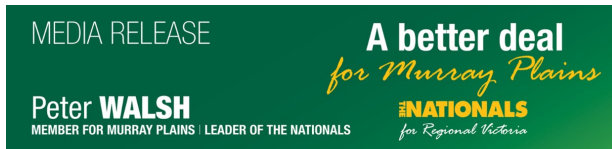
"This is making many communities more unsafe, with wait times already often hours for an emergency response in remote parts of Victoria," he says.

"One officer told media he was always willing to show 'a little bit of leeway' in helping out, but police command had to realise 'there are about 100 of us covering about a third of the response zones (in Victoria), while 15,000 covered two-thirds'.

"Those are numbers which don't add up, but with the Andrews Labor government they never do.

"Think how much good we might have done with police recruiting if the Premier hadn't just blown somewhere north of \$500 million with the Commonwealth Games – this man and this mockery of a government have so much to answer for, if you could ever get a straight answer out of them.

"But I will let the affected frontline regional police have the final say, when one of them explained to me 'police command often had no idea of just how embedded and important one-person stations were to rural communities, given you can't quantify interaction'."

Road toll soars while Labor looks the other way on road repairs

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says Daniel Andrews and his Minister of Roads Melissa Horne can no longer pretend they are doing “even a half-decent job” of protecting Victorians on regional roads.

Mr Walsh says with the state’s highest road toll in seven years, and with more than half those tragedies on regional and rural roads, “the figures prove both the lie this incompetent government cares about regional Victoria and that it takes road safety seriously”.

He says the road toll stands at 191 – that’s up 23.2 per cent on last year.

“Sadly 108 of those deaths have been on our roads, on regional and country roads, compared with 88 at the same time in 2022,” Mr Walsh added.

“Yet regional Victoria accounts for barely a quarter of the state’s population so these figures are even worse, if you could imagine that,” he says.

“Things are getting so bad, police from around Australia, and New Zealand, are coming together on September 14 to focus on Victoria’s road toll in a desperate bid to stem the carnage at the direct request of Chief Commissioner Shane Patton.

“At the same time acting Deputy Commissioner Glenn Weir has been very public with the ‘significant concern’ of police about the numbers heading in the wrong way.”

Mr Walsh adds there is no doubt in his mind “the appalling and deteriorating” condition of regional and rural roads “is playing its deadly part in this unfolding disaster”.

He says the rolling five-year average stands at 81 deaths on country roads, compared with 69 in the metropolitan area.

“Everyone has been asking for our road network to be repaired, an appeal made more urgent by the extensive flood damage across northern Victoria,” Mr Walsh says.

“Those appeals have turned to pleas and all we get from the Andrews Labor government is silence – a clear message of disinterest and disdain from Daniel Andrews and Melissa Horne,” he says.

“This isn’t another inquiry Daniel Andrews can refuse to attend. He can’t say he knows nothing about it or can’t remember – his usual defence – either.

“If there was a gold medal in total incompetence at the Commonwealth Games, Daniel Andrews would be guaranteed victory – except that was another lie and he ran our Games’ dream off the road as well.”
