LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone

We have reached 1899, as we look back at the newspapers of the day to learn how people were faring in our district, as the end of the Nineteenth Century approached. There was a brief episode of flooding rain in late June that year, but dry conditions followed, and no more rain fell until October. On 23 October 1899, the Melbourne Age reported from Milloo: - "The crops have never looked better, and the harvest yield promises to be unprecedented. The growth of grass is also abundant. Sheep and cattle of every class are in splendid condition, and are bringing good prices." It seemed like ideal conditions would complete the year, but there were other happenings.

During the night of 11 October 1899, while Mr and Mrs Charles Raper were away in Bendigo, their home at Pannoomilloo was burned to the ground. Fortunately, their eldest son, who was asleep at home, woke and was able to escape the burning building, though he suffered smoke inhalation. In its report on 14 October, the Bendigo Advertiser stated that the fire had such a hold, when Mr Raper Jnr awoke, that he was unable to save anything from the house. In other news, it was reported by the Elmore Standard on 20 October, that Private William Gamble of the Pannoomilloo Mounted Rifles, had left the district earlier that week for the Transvaal Camp [South Africa]. He was wished well by all. In that same issue of the Standard, there was a report of a novel cricket match having been played the previous week at the Terricks, "between a team of the Musgrove family and one selected from all comers. The family eleven put together 98 runs, and sent their opponents to the right about for 57.'

Still on the subject of cricket, the Bendigo Independent on 19 October, reported that a Tennyson team was being selected to play at Bendigo on the 21st. Most other news focused on the crops which were progressing satisfactorily, as the locusts did "not appear to be so vigorous as in other years." There was concern at the prevalence of influenza in the district. The Tennyson correspondent wrote to the Bendigo Advertiser on 20 October, saying "nearly every family here is affected."

There were several accidents reported from the district in November 1899. The first, reported by the Bendigo Independent on 17 November, though serious enough, was the least serious. It occurred at Pannoomilloo, when a lad named Roy Park fell about twenty feet from a tree. He sustained a severe cut on the right eye and slight concussion, and was attended by Dr Harse of Rochester. [The boy had climbed into the tree in search of a bird's nest, quite understandable when one reads in the Independent on 25 December 1899 that, during that year, "The boys attending Tennyson school have collected over 9000 sparrow eggs, and in addition have killed a great number of young sparrows. The Echuca Shire Council wisely encourages the gathering of eggs by giving 2s 6d per 100."]

To return to the accidents - On 13 November 1899, the Bendigo Advertiser reported that Mr Robert Boyd of Bamawm, had been thrown from his gig when the horse bolted. Mr Boyd sustained a serious fracture to his leg, and it was expected to be at least six months before he would be able to get about. An even more serious riding accident was suffered by Mr John Stewart of Milloo, on 15 November. On 21 November, the Bendigo Advertiser reported that he was thrown from his bolting horse, and his head came in contact with the gate post, causing concussion and a fracture to the skull. Dr Harse of Rochester, came to Milloo to attend Mr Stewart at his home, but his injury was so severe that he died on 21 November 1899. He was an exceptionally long-time resident of the district, and his funeral at the Pine Grove Cemetery was largely attended. Great sympathy was felt for Mr Stewart's family in their bereavement. On 18 November, the Bendigo Independent carried a report from its Diggora West correspondent, noting that caterpillars which had infested the district earlier in the year had reached the next stage of their life cycle as moths, and were polluting the water tanks. [It seems they were of the same species as the Bogong moth.]

Crops in the district had appeared to be doing well but were set back by stormy weather later in the month. "To make matters worse" as claimed by the Pine Grove correspondent in a report to the Elmore Standard on 24 November, locusts were "playing sad havoc ... particularly towards Terrick East," where several crops had been ruined. On 2 December 1899, a gale hit the district and almost completely wrecked the teacher's residence attached to the Pine Grove State school, wreaking further damage to crops not yet harvested. A week later, as reported by the Bendigo Independent on 8 December, the district experienced a heatwave when the temperature at Pannoomilloo reached "104" Fahrenheit [40" Celsius] in the shade."

By 27 December 1899, the Elmore Standard, the Bendigo Independent, and the Bendigo Advertiser all heard from the various correspondents across our district, that the harvest was almost complete, though "harvest labourers had been lacking in spite of good wages being offered." The Tennyson correspondent reported that the yield fell short of expectations, "owing to the great damage inflicted on the ripe crops by the violent hot winds early in the month." So, the year and the century came to an end. We'll check out the 1900s next time.





A better deal for Murray Plains MEMBER FOR MURRAY PLAINS | LEADER OF THE NATIONALS or Regional Victoria

Walsh 100 per cent behind 'Denyer Bill' and no parole

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, has strongly backed the proposed legislation to keep killers such as Paul Denyer behind bars for life.

Mr Walsh says the Denyers of the world, the Julian Knights and Craig Minogues, have committed crimes "so absolutely atrocious" they do not deserve to be released from jail.

Particularly, he says, when they never show any remorse, not at their arrests, their trials, or their incarcerations.

"It is just incomprehensible to me, and to any rightminded person, that these people could be released from jail at any time in the foreseeable future, if ever," Mr Walsh told Parliament on Thursday.

"This bill [the Corrections Amendment (Parole Reform) Bill 2023], as I understand it, gives the parole board the power to effectively keep someone in jail forever, and that is very, very important here because people who commit these heinous crimes just do not deserve to be out in society," he says.

"This finally puts Denyer in the same category as Knight (convicted of seven murders) and Minogue (convicted of the Russell St bombing), as I mentioned before, with the years he will spend in jail into the future."

In 1993 Denyer was sentenced to three life sentences without parole for the murders of Elizabeth Stevens, Debbie Fream, and Natalie Russell until he successfully challenged the term and was granted a 30-year non-parole period on appeal in 1994.

The sentencing judge, Frank Vincent, described Denyer's extraordinary savagery as "almost beyond comprehension".

Mr Walsh says it is sad in society we have to do these sorts of things and that we have criminals like this in our state, in our communities, who will deliberately go out and cause harm.

He says for most it is incomprehensible someone would do that, but "more incomprehensible - unless you are family of those victims - is what you would go through when this happens".

"That is what this bill is about: delivering justice, or as much justice as can be delivered to these shattered, grieving families, who have been given a life sentence with absolutely no chance of parole," Mr Walsh says.

"At the same time this bill is proof positive the system works, even though it has been too long in coming, for which I believe all of us here in Parliament owe the families of Denyer's victims an apology for that delay," he says.

"I would like to do that on behalf of the Nationals and sincerely say: we have finally got here, and we are glad we are."

Mr Walsh says if anyone doubts the role, and influence, of Opposition, they should look at the work of the Liberal Members for Berwick (Brad Battin) and Mornington (Chris Crewther) to keep pushing this issue

He says this is a shining example of how democracies work.
