LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached 1899, as we look back at the newspapers of the day to learn how people fared in our district, as the end of the Nineteenth Century approached. After a brief episode of flooding rain in late June, dry conditions returned, and September was unseasonably hot. Growth of crops and grass was checked, and this was exacerbated when vast numbers of locusts arrived in Pine Grove and Milloo. On 30 September 1899, the Bendigo Independent reported the visit to these particular districts, of a Mr S A Cock, inspector under the Vegetation Diseases Act. He came at the request of the Government entomologist, Mr French, to collect supplies of locusts in various stages of growth, to be used for experimental purposes. It was Mr French's intention to test a fungus he had received from South Africa which, it was reported, would kill locusts. [As far as I have been able to ascertain, this particular project was unsuccessful but similar studies were begun in the 1980s. M O'B.]

Despite the need for rain, the Diggora West correspondent was able to report to the

Bendigo Independent on 2 September 1899: -"Great business is being done at the Warragamba creamery; two separators are kept going regularly. Over 1000 gallons of milk are treated on Mondays and it is intended in future to 'separate' on Sundays, so as to relieve the extra pressure." On 7 September, the Bendigo Advertiser had news from Tennyson: - "Mr Charles Archibald Yeaman, of 'Woodlands', Tennyson, has received the following letter from a Mr Sherrard, secretary, Victorian Court, Greater Britain Exhibition. 'Sir, — I have the honour to inform you that you have been awarded a diploma equivalent to a gold medal, for your exhibit at the Greater Britain Exhibition, Earl's Court, London.' Mr Yeaman forwarded an exhibit of about 40 native grasses last February, and all will be glad to hear of his success." Another local achievement was announced by the Elmore Standard on 22 September: - "The following notice appeared in last week's 'Gazette': - An application has been received from Mr Thomas Watson, farmer, of Tennyson, for a patent for 'Improvements in horse works and connections thereto for the driving of winnowing and other machines."

Sports, particularly cricket, continued to play a vital role in the rural community, but church activities were also significant in maintaining social contacts and providing entertainment. On 13 September 1899, an afternoon function was held in Mrs O'Brien's Hall at Tennyson, to farewell Father Mulqueen, who was leaving the Catholic parish of Rochester after having served there for the past eight years. Afternoon tea was served, followed by official speech-making, a presentation, and some musical items to "enliven the event," as reported in the Bendigo Independent on the following Tuesday. On the following Wednesday evening, 20 September, a very successful tea and concert in connection with the Milloo Church of England, took place at Tennyson Hall. The large audience was treated to an excellent programme of songs, recitations, etc. A hearty vote of thanks was passed to all who assisted in making the meeting so successful and, as the Elmore Standard reported on 29 September, "the evening was brought to a close by singing the National Anthem.'

The next celebration which took place at Tennyson that month, was of a more personal nature. On 13 October 1899, the Elmore Standard quoted its Tennyson correspondent:

"On the evening of September 28th, a large party of relatives and friends met at the invitation of Mr Adam Munro at his residence, 'Hazeldean,' to celebrate the golden wedding of his father and mother. Mr and Mrs Hector Munro are well known and highly esteemed by all the people of Tennyson and the whole countryside, they being amongst the first settlers at Rochester." Mr and Mrs Munro were then living in retirement at Williamstown, but were present in Tennyson to celebrate the 50th anniversary of their wedding. The host and hostess, Mr and Mrs Adam Munro did all possible to make the evening a happy one, and all were delighted with the evening's enjoyment.

There was also a wedding celebrated in Tennyson in September 1899. The following report appeared in the Elmore Standard on 13 October. "JOYCE—McINERNEY. A pretty wedding took place on Wednesday, September 27, at St. Joseph's Church,

Tennyson, when Mr Patrick Joyce, second son of Mr Edmund Joyce, Pannoobamawn, was married to Miss Maggie McInerney, second daughter of Mr Morgan McInerney, County Clare, Ireland, by the Revs. Prior O'Hanlon and Father Mulqueen. The church was filled with guests... [The bride] was given away by her cousin, Mr McNamara, of Numurkah. The Misses Mary and Kate Joyce acted as bridesmaids [and] Mr G J Monahan, of Swan Hill, and Mr J McInerney, the bride's brother, acted as groomsmen.... After the ceremony an adjournment was made to the residence of the bridegroom's parents, where an excellent wedding breakfast was awaiting... Music, parlour games, and dancing made the evening pass very pleasantly... The newly-married couple left for Melbourne, where their honeymoon will be spent."

It seems to have been a very busy month and we have still to reach the end of the Century. That will probably happen next time. 'Bye until then.

The day finished with a special Indonesian assembly, showcasing art and performances.





















The projector was purchased with financial support from Campaspe Shire Council and would be ideal for Christmas movie nights and other fun festive season and holiday activities.

We are exploring a number ideas including a regular community morning tea where everyone is invited to pop in for a cuppa and a chat - keep an eye out for dates between now and Christmas.




Hayley and Lanie from CFA Peer Support informed everyone of the support that is available for our members.

SAM BIRREL MP - RUNNING THROUGH ROCHY

I recently joined Member for Wannon, Dan Tehan MP and his team of runners through Rochester as part of a nearly 1000km run to raise money for Creutzfeldt–Jakob disease (CJD).

CJD is a rare and serious disease that causes the brain to degenerate leading to dementia and death.

In Australia, around one person out of a million will develop CJD each year.



Dan Tehan MP is taking part in the run to honour his late mother Marie, who passed away due to CJD in 2004.

It was a great honour to join my good friend and parliamentary colleague in an endeavour that is close to his heart.

I took Mr Tehan through Rochester which gave the Member for Wannon the opportunity to meet with locals and hear how the recovery effort is tracking one year on from the floods.

As a former minister and regional member of parliament, Mr Tehan was very interested to hear from locals as to the extent of the flood event one year on, how the recovery is going and what further support may be needed from the Federal Government.

The team also stocked up on much needed dinner supplies at Cottam's Family Butcher and Major's Supa IGA.

Rochester is looking to the future, and I will continue to bring MP's to the town to ensure residents are supported.

Labor's hidden agenda to merge our regional hospitals says Walsh

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says the Allan government's latest attack on hospital budgets comes with a hidden agenda beyond devastating regional health networks.

Mr Walsh says he has no doubt the underlying strategy is to force hospital mergers to give the socialist architects of any Labor government greater centralised control of regional health networks.

He says in its May budget this year the government slashed a staggering \$1 billion from its health budget as "it clambered to recover the billions it had already wasted through financial incompetence and botched big budget projects".

"In September the government took its razor to psychiatric services across the state and now it's pushing its health tax, which by its own admission is going to force some GP practices to close down - how ridiculous is that?" Mr Walsh says.

"At the 2022 election the Liberals Nationals put forward a sound, fully-budgeted strategy to not just cover existing health costs but to have the money to allow for massive investments in infrastructure, doctor and nurse training and recruitment and new and better equipment," he says.

"Now here we are, 12 months down the track, Victoria is almost broke because of this Labor government and the average regional Victorian is at the frontline of a new fight to save their local hospital, because believe me, cutting backroom costs doesn't make that work disappear, it merely shoves it onto whoever is left standing - and that will be staff who should be focused on healthcare."

Mr Walsh says some regional hospitals are facing cuts of \$4 million. He says when you are talking numbers that big it means jobs, and lots of them.

"And what regional town wants to see people thrown out of work because the government doesn't have a clue how to manage the money it is increasingly tearing out of people's hip pockets and savings accounts," Mr Walsh asked.

"If your receptionists and your accounts people and administration staff disappear, much of that workload will land at the feet of the frontline teams and having a whizzbang call centre in Melbourne will do nothing for any issues in Swan Hill, or Echuca or Kerang and so on," he says.

"Health Minister Mary-Anne Thomas has been infected with Labor party arrogance when she tries to tell us about the government's 'largest ever investment' in Victorian health. Seriously? I think you could pretty safely expect every year's health budget to be the biggest ever because the population is growing, more health care is required and that means more money.

"Except right now I am genuinely worried, even scared, Jacinta Allan has nothing left in the state's coffers to deliver even the most basic services, let alone a record investment - headlines and hollow promises don't save lives, a government which can balance the books does."
