#### **LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME**

Hello again everyone .....

We have entered the 20th Century, as we look back at the early newspapers, and it seems that, for the people in our district, the year began in sadness. Two of its elderly and much-respected residents passed away during January 1900; Mr Andrew Oliver, then aged 85 years, died on the 17th at his son's residence in Diggora, and on the 18th, Mrs Margaret Archibald passed away at Bamawm. She was 80 years old, and she and her husband, John, were among the very earliest of the selector couples to come to the plains country west of the Campaspe, having arrived in Bamawm from Kyneton in 1873.

In 1898, the passing of the Land Act [No 1602] had made provision for land to be acquired for the purpose of closer settlement. In the future, this Act, and the Closer Settlement Acts that followed it in the early part of the 20th Century, were to have a huge impact on the northern plains. On 8 February 1900, a report appeared in the Bendigo Advertiser to the effect that the Echuca Borough Council intended to urge the Government to "enter into negotiations for the purpose of repurchasing the Wharparilla Estate under the 'Closer Settlement on the Land' principle." In this regard, a public meeting was to be held.

On the local scene, the weather was giving cause for concern. Rain was badly needed and, on 13 February 1900, the Bendigo Independent carried this report from Diggora West: - "Grass is very scarce, and there is consequently a great falling off in the quantity of milk taken to the Warragamba Creamery. Water for stock purposes has given out in many cases, and there will shortly be a great run on the well on Mr William Cochrane's property. This well is 130ft deep, and the supply of water, slightly mineralised, is inexhaustible." On 23 February, the Warragamba correspondent to the Elmore Standard submitted a similar report, adding that "The only things that are 'booming' are clearing sales. There are nearly as many of them amongst the farmers as there are amongst the drapers in a large city."

On 28 February 1900, the Bendigo Independent reported that, due to the scarcity of water in the Campaspe River, the Rochester Waterworks Trust was restricting the hours during which townspeople could access the pumping works.

The dry weather continued until late March, and by then the engine at the Warragamba Creamery was being worked only three times a week. Even after rain fell, there was yet another problem as foxes began invading the hen-houses. In the meantime, the people of the district kept up their spirits as was their custom. On 26 February, the Bible Christian Church at Diggora was "crowded to excess" for a "conversazione;" then, in early March, the Wharparilla detachment of the Mounted Rifles ran a popular competition among its members; and, on 21 March 1900, the threat of rain did not affect attendance at the Band of Hope's annual picnic in Mr Buchanan's paddock at Diggora.

The only marriage of local interest to be reported so early in that year, was that of Fannie Dorothea Cotton to Thomas Henry Kelly, the stepson of Mr John Bishop of Diggora, celebrated in Bendigo on 21 February, and reported in the Elmore Standard on 2 March 1900. On a far less happy note, the new century brought its share of farming accidents. A young man named Tonkin, from Milloo, suffered a serious injury to his hand in an incident with a horse in January and, in April, fourteen-year-old Edward O'Shannessy, who had lived with the Cahill Family at Warragamba, was killed when the gun he was carrying accidentally discharged when he tripped on a grass tussock. In late May, Annie Eva, the oldest daughter of Mr John Neve of Diggora West and formerly of Pine Grove, died from injuries suffered when she was thrown from her horse. She was twenty years old. Though not due to an accident, the district lost another of its young residents on 1 June 1900, when Miss Gertrude Maddren of Diggora, died of consumption, aged just twenty-three.

On and about 10 May 1900, newspapers across the State, covered the story of the joint deputation from the Echuca Borough and the Echuca Shire Council which had waited on the Minister of Lands on 9 May1900, to urge that Wharparilla and Restdown Estates be acquired for closer settlement purposes. It was claimed that the land in question "could be irrigated, and the soil was well adapted for the growth of cereals." Furthermore, the members of the deputation were convinced that blocks would be taken up by "the right class of settlers – principally sons of farmers, who had been brought up in the district" and, being acquainted with local conditions, they would know "how to make the most of it." While the Minister was sympathetic to the proposal, he was unable to give a positive answer at that time.

As the Tennyson correspondent reported in the Bendigo Advertiser, on 29 March 1900, the "splendid rains" which fell at that time put some water into the dams and gave "great encouragement" to the farmers. By May, the Warragamba Creamery was working full-time again and, on 20 June, their local correspondent to the Elmore Standard stated that the season promised to be "one of the best" for many years. However, farm life still had its problems. According to the Bendigo Independent, as the late-sown crops struggled to come up, sparrows, parrots and black magpies were presenting a nuisance. Then, on 22 June, the Standard reported that in Warragamba, four farm horses had died from unknown causes. Maybe the second half of the year will prove to be better.





#### Black day for Basin as the Greens push for buybacks

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plans, Peter Walsh, says the Greens haven't just gutted the Murray Darling Basin by backing Canberra's plan to loot the system of another 450GL of environmental water, they are setting up the devastation of communities across his electorate.

And Mr Walsh says the crisis is bigger than just Murray Plains, the collateral damage of this "incredibly naïve and shortsighted decision" will be felt the length and breadth of the Murray.

He says the many irrigation-dependent communities have been abandoned by the city-centric Greens, "who think an electric car and a few solar panels give them the moral high ground".

"Even Greens in the Victorian Parliament were this week calling on the Premier to get behind the Albanese government wrecking machine," Mr Walsh says.

"The Greens need reminding those in the inner city would be hungry, naked and sober without hardworking communities such as those in the Goulburn Murray region," he says.


"These inner-city MPs will leave a legacy of destruction if they keep ignoring the voices of Basin communities – the people who live there, work there, and have local histories stretching back generations.

"What is happening in Canberra is bad enough, but for the local Greens to try and push Victoria to kowtow confirms these dilettantes are morally bankrupt, valuing a flimsy plan to flush vital water into artificial lakes in South Australia and out the Murray mouth ahead of the future of the hardworking people of regional Victoria."

Water Shadow Minister Tim McCurdy says the Greens' Member for Melbourne, who made the call, has "without hesitation betrayed her Mildura childhood home by demanding support for the Albanese Labor Government's disastrous buybacks".

"These buybacks are a tipping point which will devastate industries and entire communities in northern Victoria," Mr McCurdy says.

"The inner-city Greens Member for Melbourne has again shown her lack of understanding of the balance which can exist between the environment and the communities which rely on our water – we can, and must, have both," he says.
