LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone,

We have reached the year 1900, as we look back at the early newspapers, and in September that year the matter of the long-sought rail service through the district came to light once again. On 5 September, according to an item published in the Elmore Standard on the 7th, a deputation from Cohuna waited on the Minister of Railways to speak in favour of a line from Cohuna to Rochester! The matter was then addressed to the Premier who said that, depending on the strength of supporting evidence, the case would be referred to the Railway Committee.

Weather conditions across the district that Spring were ideal and there were high hopes for an excellent harvest. Residents were able to relax a little and socialise. In that same issue of the Standard, the Pannoomilloo correspondent wrote of the marriage of Miss E G Maude Harrison, eldest daughter of Mr George Harrison of Pannoomilloo, to Mr John Y Anderson of "Calder Park." The ceremony took place at the Harrison family home on 5 September 1900. The correspondent also described the successful celebration of the Warragamba Sunday School anniversary, which had taken place in the Wesleyan Church on the previous Sunday. On the last Saturday in September, the annual Pinegrove Sports were held in "delightful weather, with good entries and large attendances." A full list of all the results appeared in the Bendigo Independent on 4 October.

On 20 October 1900, there came a report from the Independent's travelling reporter, who said that Summer seemed "to have come with a jump" and the crops, which had seemed so promising a fortnight ago, had "begun to weaken a little." He noted that storekeepers, like the farmers, were feeling the strain but all still hoped for a plentiful harvest. (In the ensuing weeks, correspondents from Diggora West and Tennyson were to record similar observations.) On 26 October, the Elmore Standard reported that "a large picnic party from Diggora" intended visiting the Campaspe Weir on the following Sunday afternoon and a local amateur photographer would be taking snapshots of the picnickers. (I wonder if anyone has a copy of one of those snapshots now!! M.O'B)

On 8 November 1900, the Tennyson correspondent to the Bendigo Advertiser advised that Mr Archibald Yeaman, one of the earliest settlers in this district, died on 31 October at Williamstown, where he has been living for some years. "He was very highly respected, and was in every way a model farmer." And, on 28 November, the Bendigo Independent advised that Mr Joseph Sims, of Tennyson, had died very suddenly at his home on the previous Monday. His death was thought to have been caused by "heat apoplexy."

So the end of the year arrived. On 1 December, the Leader described the crops between Tennyson and Rochester as being patchy, probably owing to want of moisture in the subsoil. However, the Tennyson correspondent writing to the Bendigo Advertiser on the 11th, felt that a good average yield would be obtained. The New Year presented with its own set of problems -There was typhoid in the district; water in the dams was becoming low; rabbits and foxes were becoming numerous; and farmers, anxious to burn-off stubble were being urged to exercise caution. There was good news and sad news - Mr George Ham and Miss Flora East, both of Diggora were married in Rochester on 7 February 1901; and, on 18 February, Diggora lost an old and esteemed resident with the death of Mr John O'Brien. He had come to Victoria from Tipperary in 1864 and had lived in Diggora since 1879. Reporting his death, the Elmore Standard of 21 February 1901, recorded that he would be remembered by many as "Johnny O'Brien, the ploughing judge," by reason of his having been Judge at the ploughing matches held at Diggora in earlier years. He was 66 years of age.

On 14 February, the Elmore Railway League met to discuss the proposed new rail link to Cohuna, in light of a suggestion being made that the junction with the Bendigo-Echuca line be made at Rochester rather than at Elmore. As reported in the Elmore Standard on 21 February 1901, the matter of a proposed Wandong-Heathcote-Elmore line, which could result in a shorter trip to Melbourne, was also discussed. There was no shortage of ideas being put forward, as indicated by an article that was published in the Kerang Times on 22 February. Goornong, Rochester and Elmore were all three putting in claims for the starting point of the Cohuna railway and, on 27 February, Mr Trenwith, Minister of Railways, would be in Cohuna to meet with the local railway league. According to the Bendigo Advertiser on 23 February, it was hoped that members of the railway leagues in Elmore and Pannoobamawm would also have the opportunity of meeting with Mr Trenwith while he was in the district.

On the local scene, a disastrous fire had occurred on the property of Mr George Singer at Bamawm, on 23 February 1900. Sheds and outbuildings were burned, and only the family dwelling was saved. Mr Singer was the owner-operator of a chaffcutter, and was well-known and well thought-of by the local farming community. He lost two valuable threshing machines in the fire, and the report in the Bendigo Advertiser on 26 February, stated that it was not known if the equipment was insured.

From Page 1: Here it is, proof that bowls is a game for all ages!



LIONS CLUB SERVICE RECOGNISED






On Sunday 7 January an inter-Club get together involving members of the Elmore, Lockington, Rochester, Echuca and Moama Lions was held in Rochester.

WALSH'S URGENT CALL TO HELP SAVE OUR BACON FROM INQUIRY

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says submissions to the Inquiry into pig welfare in Victoria have officially closed but late submissions are just as important.

Because he says it's time to save the local pork industry's bacon — and there's no time to be wasted.

Mr Walsh says the industry, which is strong across his electorate, is again under attack by "ideological fantasists" in the Allan Labor government and its Greens puppet masters and the Liberals Nationals are calling on the wider community to urgently get on board.

He says it is crucial industry and regional voices are not drowned out by extreme views clouding a sector contributing \$488 million to the Victorian economy and supporting almost 2700 full-time jobs.

"If you enjoyed your traditional Christmas lunch, the bad news is Premier Jacinta Allan is now coming after your ham," Mr Walsh says.

"Labor has launched its ham-fisted Inquiry into pig welfare in Victoria and we are taking a stand against this attack on an industry backed by peer-reviewed, global scientific research into animal welfare.

Mr Walsh says Labor is simply selling out Victorian pork producers.
