BUSINESS CENTRE TO MARK 20 YEAR ANNIVERSARY





Lockington District Business Centre is celebrating a significant milestone, marking two decades of service to the local community.

The Centre will commemorate its 20-year anniversary in conjunction with Community Bank – Elmore, Lockington and Rochester with a morning tea at 10.30am on Tuesday, 27 February. Members of the local community are warmly invited to attend.

The LBDC story started in 2002 when the local Westpac Bank shut its doors and a few residents got together to find a solution for the town.

With a view to establishing a Community Bank in partnership with Elmore, the original plan was to purchase the corner block opposite the supermarket and build a Rural Transaction Centre.

A feasibility study and business plan were completed and the morning the foundations were to be prepared, the community learned that Joe Sciotto was going to close his garage.

With no fuel available in town, there was concern that people would travel out of Lockington to also do their banking and shopping. Immediately a stop was put to building on the corner block and a community meeting was called.

It was determined the community would purchase the garage from Joe and develop the building into a Rural Transaction Centre, housing a Community Bank, launderette, church Op Shop, computer facilities and car wash.

In total \$200,000 was raised by the Community Care Committee including \$140,000 in loans from community members – these loans were paid back over the following years with bank interest rates.

RTC grant money helped to facilitate the building's transformation into Lockington District Business Centre.

Renovations started around 20 December 2003 and the project was completely largely with donated labor; volunteers continued to sell fuel while the renovations happened around them. The building was completely gutted and 10 internal rooms created.

The Centre set a mission to research community needs on a continuing basis, plan strategically, seek resources to provide safe and inclusive services including space for the Community Bank, protect the town's sole fuel outlet, provide a workshop area and accommodate a Neighbourhood House and Learning Centre.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone,

We have reached the year 1901, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the people of this district were faring.

By mid-May that year, all was not looking well. The country was once again in the grip of a dry spell, and an epidemic of measles – in a very severe form – had prevailed for some weeks. Then, on the night of 23 May, according to reports in the Elmore Standard and the Bendigo Independent, on 29 and 30 May 1901, the Wanurp State school and residence were completely destroyed by fire. The teacher and his wife were awakened at midnight by the fire, and had only time to escape. The whole of the furniture and effects were consumed, and were not insured. For a short time classes were conducted in Mr Orchard's barn, but conditions there were not ideal. According to an item appearing in the Bendigo Independent on 8 June, there was a proposition "by the Wanurp residents to endeavour to shift the Milloo State school into Wanurp." However, the Piavella correspondent felt that this proposal would be "strongly opposed by the local residents," and it seems it was never seriously considered.

Agitation for a rail service to and through the local district had been on hold since late February 1901, when the Minister of Railways, Mr Trenwith inspected the proposed routes and referred the question of construction to the Railway Standing Committee. The project came to notice again in mid-June 1901, when Mr John Cullen, a candidate for election to the Legislative Council as Member for Gunbower. mentioned it in a campaign speech. As reported in the Riverine Herald on 13 June, Mr Cullen addressed a large audience at Irvine's West End Hotel, stating that he would endeavour to have the much-sought railway line constructed to Cohuna, "but he was not going to pledge himself to a starting point ... He intended to adopt the line which the [Railway] Standing Committee recommended." Mr Cullen was successful in the State Elections that year, but the railway project seems to have been forgotten again.

Fortunately, June brought rain to the district and, for a short time, spirits rose. On 20 June 1901, the Elmore Standard reported that the first round for the Northern District Cricket Competition Trophy commenced on 15 June, the clubs engaged being Pinegrove, Diggora, Torrumberry, and Milloo. However, as reported to the Bendigo Advertiser on 29 July, though recent rain, recorded at Tennyson as 56 points [about 14 mms], would greatly assist grass and crops, cattle were in poor condition, and many had died.

People were dying, too, with a number of sudden and unexpected deaths occurring in the district during July 1901. The first of these happened in Piavella on 1 July, when the Paul Mitchell family suffered the loss of their infant daughter after an illness of just three days. The sympathy of the district was extended to the bereaved parents. On 5 July, Mr John Stone, manager of Wharparilla Station died suddenly. He was a native of Derbyshire, aged 56 years, and had been in Australia for thirty years. For much of that time, Mr Stone managed Restdown Station and he was known and highly respected across the region. Then, on 27 July, the Pyramid Hill correspondent to the Bendigo Independent recorded the death of 19-year-old Edward James Smith of Terrick Terrick, caused by complications following a cold. However, there was good news from Diggora, where Miss Mollie Quinn, daughter of Mrs W Quinn, had decided to enter the Brigidine Convent. On 16 July 1901, family and friends gathered at the Quinn residence to make a presentation to Mollie and to bid her goodbye.

On 26 August, the Piavella correspondent wrote to the Bendigo Independent that, though a little rain had fallen, "the season so far is the worst known here." Subsequently, a reporter from the Melbourne Argus looked in on the Northern Areas to assess the situation. His thoughts, published on 3 September, were that further rain was needed to ensure an average cereal season. He interviewed several local residents for their thoughts, among them Mr John Crawford, farmer and grazier, of Pinegrove East. Mr Crawford considered that good spring rains on the plain and timber country at Pannoobamawm might bring a yield of from 12 to 16 bushels, but he added "We have had one of the worst seasons I have known during my residence of 28 years in the district." Mr Crawford's family featured in the social column of the Elmore Standard on 19 September 1901, in a report of the marriage of his second daughter, Miss Barbara A Crawford to Private William Gamble of Pine Grove. The wedding ceremony took place at the Crawford family home on 28 August. (After being invalided home from the Boer War, Private Gamble had been selected to play a role in directing forage to the troops in Africa.) On 26 September, Pine Grove East was in the news yet again, when a youth named Norman Willows was injured in a horse-racing accident at the sports there. The incident was reported by the Melbourne Argus and the Bendigo Advertiser.

Fine weather prevailed for the local State Schools' picnic, held at the Pinegrove Recreation Reserve on 19 October 1901. However, while rain later that month gave a boost to the farmers' hopes, throughout the harvest period it was generally acknowledged that crops were light. The Warragamba correspondent wrote to the Elmore Standard on 19 December 1901: - "Dairying has also been very slack. The local creamery treated about 80,000 gallons less milk this year than last. ...Well sinking is being carried on with great vigour." On 28 December, there came sad news of the death at Diggora of Mrs Phyllis Nicholls, one of that district's early pioneer settlers. Residents across the region hoped that next year would be better.

The inaugural meeting of the Lockington District Business Centre Committee of Management was held on 24 February 2004 with President John Hewlett at the helm; the Committee comprised Joy Weller, Liz Wright, Graeme Wood, Graeme Haines, Faye Haines, Louise Ross, Jim Sandercock and Phil Collins.

LDBC didn't have a formal opening, however, the newest branch of the Elmore Lockington Community Bank was officially launched on 3 March 2004. The Business Centre commenced operation five and a half days a week and was initially run exclusively by some 45 volunteers working two and a half hour shifts.

Since the Centre's inception, just shy of 50,000 volunteer working hours have been dedicated by community members at the front desk alone and an average of 35 active volunteers have supported the whole organisation each year. In the first six months of LDBC's operation, fuel sales averaged 1000 litres per day; 20 years later that figure has grown to almost 3000 litres daily.


In 2007, Federal and Local Government grants of \$80,000 were obtained to replace the existing underground fuel tanks with much larger ones to enable bulk fuel purchases. The bowsers were also shifted to the north side of the building.

In 2005 LDBC received the Tidy Towns "Spirit of Australia Award" for the north-east region, progressing to a State Final.

In 2006, a Neighbourhood House was formally launched, to build on volunteer-run projects already underway in the district. This work was undertaken voluntarily until DHHS funding was provided for six hours per week. The funding was extended to 10 hours in July 2009 and slowly increased over the following 12 years to 25 hours.

A wide range of programs have subsequently been co-ordinated including a Women's Pamper Day, Feast for the Senses Festivals and community dance programs. In 2008 LDBC hosted the Victorian Small Towns summit in conjunction with Campaspe Shire and in 2008 the Centre worked with ACME to produce a series of films on Lockington and district.

The workshop space at the rear of the building was initially rented out to a local business; when it moved to bigger premises funding was sought and secured for a Men's Shed which opened on 15 April 2010 with 25 keen members.



LDBC is proud to mark this occasion in partnership with Community Bank - Elmore, Lockington & Rochester The Men's Shed was set up to improve the health and wellbeing of community members (particularly men) by giving them a safe space to make friends, share meaningful activities, talk and access health information and resources.

In 2017 Campaspe Shire Council offered LDBC the contract for the Lockington Library Depot - a room was converted and once again volunteers were found to man the office. Lockington Library is open three days a week, for four hours each day.

In 2017 LDBC purchased the adjoining Plumber's Shed precinct which has been developed into an appealing community space comprising a multi-purpose meeting room and community garden.

In the same year, the LBDC volunteer team was recognised, winning a 2017 Campaspe Community Volunteer Award.

In 2021 the corner block was turned into a pump track, complemented by a garden area and murals along the fence line. This project was made possible thanks to the generosity of Leanne and Brendan Pentreath who donated the land.

It's hard to imagine where Locky might be today, without the foresight of the Lockington Community Care Committee members who identified the need to fiercely protect the town's fuel and financial services when both were in danger of being permanently lost early in the new millennium.

The Lockington District Business Centre Committee would like to thank all present and past volunteers and the broader community for supporting this venture from the very beginning.






