LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone,

We have reached January 1902, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the people of this district were faring.

Water had become very scarce, and the harvest then in full swing, was falling short of expectations, as reported to the Elmore Standard on 2 January 1902, by its Pine Grove correspondent. It was noted that "A large number of new harvesters have been introduced into the district this season, and appear to be giving general satisfaction. The old-fashioned stripper will soon be a thing of the past."

The following thoughts, expressed to the Standard by this same correspondent a week later, were probably shared by many throughout the northern plains: - "Many years ago when the late Mr Hugh M'Coll was so persistently advocating his great 'canal scheme,' many of the farmers were prone to ridicule the idea as a fad, &c., but the time has now arrived when they are forced to admit that this same 'fad,' had it only been put into practice and carried out, as it should have been, would have proved the salvation of these arid northern plains, and would have been worth hundreds of thousands of pounds to the land owners of the colony."

Interest in the scheme was now very real and, as reported in the Standard on the 16 January 1902, a well-attended public meeting was held at Mitiamo on the 9th, urging that the Government begin immediately to construct the Waranga Basin and the Goulburn Channel.

Weather-wise, the year had not begun well, and the few heavy but brief showers that fell early in January did little to help. The harvest, when completed, was light, the dams were dry and rabbit numbers were increasing.

As reported by the Elmore Standard on 9 January 1902, at Bamawm, Pannoobamawm, Pannoomilloo, and Diggora, the residents were agitating for a daily mail to and from Rochester, to replace the existing tri-weekly service.

Petitions in favour of the desired alteration were forwarded to J H McColl, M.H.R., asking him to use his influence on behalf of the project. On the social scene, on 23 January, the family and friends of Miss Mollie Quinn, formerly of Diggora, were among those who gathered at the Brigidine Convent at Echuca to mark the occasion of her taking her white veil, and her name in religion – Sister Mary Anthony.

The dry weather continued throughout February and, on 19 February, the Diggora West correspondent to the Standard noted that windmills were coming into favour in that district; several having been erected on wells with a good water supply. Describing the position in the Rochester district, in its issue of 26 February 1902, the Bendigo Advertiser stated that it had been many years since there was such a general scarcity of water. Locally, hopes were maintained as residents attended harvest thanksgiving services, held on 17 February, at Pine Grove and at the Milloo Church of England. At the Tennyson Hall, on Wednesday, 19th inst., a tea meeting and a concert were held in connection with the local Presbyterian Church.

On 1 March 1902, an article appeared in the Melbourne Leader describing the "grave state of affairs around Echuca." It stated that the parishes of Gunbower and Terricks were in a "terrible state," while the parishes of Torrumbarry, Terricks East, Pine Grove, Patho and Wharparilla were much the same. An item in the Numurkah Leader on 7 March claimed that the summer's yield of wheat in those parishes had been the lowest in the district's history.

The Elmore Standard of 27 March, noted that in the previous two years there had been a "general stampede" of farmers leaving the district. As though to bear out that statement, the Standard that month reported on functions held at Diggora to farewell the Williamson and Oliver families. Mr Oliver had lived in Diggora for thirty-two years.

On 25 March 1902, there came a change in the weather but it was preceded by an extensive, "terrific" dust storm, with dust "so thick that for a couple of minutes everything was in total darkness," as reported in the Bendigo Independent. In the next few days, some parts of the region received almost 2 inches [50 mms] of rain; much appreciated, as it replenished the dams and meant an end to water-carting. On 27 February, the Bendigo Advertiser stated that in recent weeks, there had been so great a demand for the iron tanks used by the farmers to cart water, that a Rochester plumbing firm had been obliged to employ more workmen to cope with the orders.

Through April, the grass grew well and winter cricket provided a distraction from the local farmers' worries, but there was no follow-up rainfall. By 9 May, the Piavella correspondent to the Bendigo Independent could state that prospects there had "never been more gloomy." The only happy news came from Pine Grove East, where the marriage of John Jasper and Sarah Zealley was celebrated on 28 May 1902. On the other hand, on that same day at Diggora, Mr John Bishop's house was destroyed by fire. Drought conditions continued as winter began and, on 7 June, the Diggora West correspondent wrote to the Bendigo Independent that the northern plains were experiencing their "eighth bad year in succession." The effect in the Terricks region was described by the Melbourne Age on 9 June as being "deplorable."

They had a further ten days to wait for some relief, but we'll need to wait until the next Locky News,




GUN SAFETY COURSE







Young guns James Brentnall and Nicholas Mitchell had an excellent afternoon winning their sets.



After the three games of nine ends there remained two undefeated teams.


