# **NEW BUSH NURSING CENTRE MANAGER**



New Lockington & District Bush Nursing Centre Manager Sharon Moran is settling in after commencing in the role on 4 March.

Sharon has joined the Bush Nursing staff after three years with Heathcote Health; she has been nursing for 27 years and worked for more than two decades in the Emergency Department at Bendigo Health.

She replaces former Manager Kim McDonald who has relocated to Queensland.

"I know I've got big shoes to fill," Sharon said. "It's obvious Kim was very loved and is sadly missed.

"I would have liked to work with her, but fortunately I feel I'm getting to know Kim really well through the Lockington community."

Sharon lives at Avonmore, near Elmore and said the opportunity to offer personalised care in a rural setting had drawn her to the new position.

She was keen to spend more time in a hands-on capacity treating patients and feels most comfortable working in smaller communities.

"Country people are my people," Sharon said, adding that she was enormously grateful to the LDBNC team and staff who have wrapped their arms around her and been incredibly helpful.

# **LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME**

Hello again everyone,

We have reached June 1902, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the people of this district were faring.

After an extremely dry six months, the region received good rains at the end of June 1902; nearly an inch [55 mms] was registered at Tennyson, as reported to the Elmore Standard on 28 June. However, it was followed by frosts which retarded the growth of crops and grass, and no more rain fell throughout July. On 19 July, the Standard reported that Mr George Greer's dwelling at Pine Grove had been burnt to the ground on the 10th

Wind, hail and 16 points [4 mms] of rain marked the beginning of August but, otherwise, drought conditions persisted. There had been an outbreak of influenza at Warragamba, and dairying was faring badly as reported in the Elmore Standard on 2 August.

There was some good news, relayed in the Numurkah Leader, on 8 August, stating that the daily mail run for which the residents had petitioned, had been established; from Rochester to Bamawm, Pannoobamawm, Pannoomilloo, Diggora West, Warragamba, and Diggora.

However, not all of the news was good as the report went on to say that a number of horses and cattle in the district had died from typhoid, pneumonia and bronchial troubles, while several draught horses had succumbed to the bot fly disease.

The drought worsened through August and into September, but the local people still gathered for sports, entertainment, and to celebrate special occasions. Three hundred of them attended a Coronation picnic held in Mr Forsyth's paddock at Piavella on 9 August, and cricket was well supported, as were regular Mutual Improvement Society meetings.

Fortunately, it rained a little on 26 September, adding to the enjoyment to be had at Pine Grove's annual sports and picnic, held on 27 September. Though fewer people attended than was usual, there was still a crowd of about five hundred.

Drying winds lessened the benefit of the light rains that fell in early October, and hopes of any sort of harvest dwindled. Fellow residents in Diggora were sad to hear of the death of Mrs Eliza Penny on 15 October 1902, but at last, there came some good news – "Phenomenal" rain across the district for several days. It began with a violent thunderstorm in the Diggora region on 23 October when, according to the report in the Bendigo Independent on 28 October, "Rain came down in torrents."

In November, the Metherall Family was farewelled as they left Diggora for Gippsland; a windstorm at Milloo, caused a fire that destroyed the home of Mr William Chambers, and there were severe dust storms at Pine Grove and Rochester. The crops, which struggled to respond to October's rain, were damaged by hot winds and attacked by birds. Nevertheless, despite the unpleasant weather, a successful concert was held by the Band of Hope at Diggora on 19 November, and on that same date, Pine Grove residents took part in their annual concert and coffee supper.

This was described in the report in the Elmore Standard on 22 November 1902, as being "one of the most successful of its kind ever held at Pine Grove." On 16 December, steady rain set in across the region, with some places receiving in excess of 3 inches [75 mms]. The heaviest fall of rain in years, according to the report in the Standard on 20 December 1902, it was too late to be of any assistance to the crops, but ensured that all fears of a water famine were ended.

Still, the year terminated on a sad note. On 24 December, James Coghlin, the 24-year-old son of Mr John Coghlin of Diggora, died at Elmore. He was well-known and popular throughout the district; "well to the fore in all athletic sports ... a good footballer, cricketer and all round athlete." He had become ill just a month earlier, rallied a little early in December, but then fell victim to a severe form of typhoid fever which led to his death. He was buried at Elmore, on Christmas Day 1902.

February 1903 brought wind and severe dust storms to the district; "the worst ever seen" in Piavella, and at Diggora West everything was "in complete darkness for several minutes," according to the reports in the Bendigo Independent, on 17 and 18 February. It was a busy month for the church communities of Diggora. Other local residents joined in when the Methodist congregation farewelled members of the Maddren Family who were leaving for Gippsland, and again when the annual social of the Diggora Presbyterian Church was held on 18 February. On 2 March, the Milloo Mutual Improvement Society led members of that district's community in a farewell to Mr and Mrs James Brook, who were leaving the district. These gatherings were reported by the Bendigo papers and by the Elmore Standard.

Good rains fell early in March and by 21 March, the Bendigo Advertiser could report that farmers in Milloo, Bamawm, Tennyson and Diggora were well advanced in sowing their crops. The Melbourne Argus reported on 31 March, that stock feed was still short in the Rochester district, and a large number of horses had died because of sand in their stomachs. A rapidly growing new weed had appeared in Pannoomilloo, Diggora and Tennyson; yet un-named, it was plentiful but the animals preferred not to eat it if other grass was available. Some rain fell in April but more was needed if there was to be a harvest. The Argus on 14 April 1903, reported that dust storms experienced earlier in the year had blocked the western portion of the irrigation channels of the Campaspe Trust. As they had yet to be cleared, farmers were unable to get a drop of water to irrigate their grass paddocks.

There'll be more of 1903 next time.



# **Hospital Rebuild**

We know everyone is keen to hear how the building works are progressing.

We have navigated quite a few hurdles and delays so far, but great progress is now being made. However, everyone of us will be disappointed to learn that our return to site is likely to be a little later than originally anticipated. The original Program had us returning in stages, with Aged Care and the Acute Hospital scheduled to be first to occupy the site in June/July this year.

As work has progressed it has become increasingly clear that it is not as easy as we had hoped to separate the areas out from each other and occupy one or two wings while work continued in others. To ensure that essential services such as power, IT, fire services etc. are all linked up across the site, we need to keep those services intact and continuous throughout the entire building. If we were to separate the zones from each other it would require these services to be separated also, which would increase the cost of the work as well as cause further delays and disruption.

While we are still working to return to site by the end of the year, a revised Program of Works has the majority of the building works scheduled to be completed by the end of October. Then we need to have all of the occupancy and safety inspections completed and signed off, and all of the furniture and equipment reinstated, before we can return residents to the site and re-commence our clinical services.

Based on all of these factors, we hope to reinstate all of our services on site at the same time which, at this stage, is looking like November 2024.

We will continue to work hard to ensure we are all back in REDHS by Christmas. We are already planning a Grand Re-Opening celebration to welcome the community and our residents back to Rochester.

## FIRST FARMER BATTLE WON SAYS WALSH

The Nationals leader and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, says a two-year battle to protect Victorian farmers and their private property from radical fringe animal activists has been won following the recent passage of the Biosecurity Legislation Amendment (Incident Response) Bill 2024.

"We have been pressuring the reluctant Allan Labor Government every step of the way to adopt measures imposing tougher penalties for trespassing on agricultural premises, effectively doubling them to a maximum of \$23,077 for individuals and \$115,386 for organisations," he added.

"Two years ago, an Impact of Animal Activism Inquiry, led by The Nationals, revealed shortfalls in the existing trespass laws and revealed instances of justice system failures. Despite this, the Labor Government initially ignored our recommendation of harsher penalties for individuals trespassing on, and causing damage to producer's homes and businesses."

Mr Walsh condemned Labor's political games, which left primary producers paying the price for the Allan government's inability to listen and act on the needs of the industry. He added the two-year delay by Labor has also meant more justice denied for our hardworking farmers, who were impacted by trespassing and damage to their premises.

"But despite this recent win, the fight is not over. The next battle is to ensure Labor does not destroy our state's agricultural sector with its amendments to the Animal Care and Protection Bill, currently open for public submissions."

Meanwhile Mr Walsh has demanded Treasurer Tim Pallas "explain, let alone justify" radical and punitive changes to the state's land tax charges.

Mr Walsh took his fight to the floor of the Parliament, asking Mr Pallas to "explain to my constituents why the government has changed the criteria to force thousands of them to pay a land tax for the first time".

He says "like my constituents, I look forward to seeing how the Treasurer will justify this latest blatant tax grab".

"Labor's decision to slash the tax-free threshold from \$300,000 to \$50,000, while also slapping an additional flat tax up to \$975 on Victorian households is daylight robbery," Mr Walsh says.

"Treasurer Tim Pallas has tried to soften the blow by claiming his land tax hike will cost the average Victorian household an additional \$1300 every year – but we are hearing reports of much greater damage to the bottom lines of ordinary Victorians trying to get ahead," he says.

"These changes will punish and divide homeowners and renters across Victoria and is just the latest of many examples of Labor punishing Victorians for its own economic mismanagement.

"This new Labor tax – one of more than 50 it has introduced despite promises there would be no new taxes for Victorians – must lead to increased pressure on households, increased costs to running a business and increased rents and impact some of Victoria's most vulnerable community members."

Mr Walsh says with typical Allan Labor government timing, these land tax changes come at a time when Victorians can least afford them.

He says The Nationals and Liberals are giving a promise to undertake a wholesale review of Victoria's taxation system – and legislate a cap on our State's out-of-control debt – when elected.

"I can tell you now, we will also repeal Labor's unfair school tax and set up a Victorian version of the Productivity Commission," Mr Walsh explains.

"There is little wriggle room left – even if you only own land with others, in whatever ownership structure, you are classified as a joint owner for land tax purposes," he says.

"If you own land with multiple people, companies or trusts, each unique combination of owners is considered a different joint ownership. Joint owners are assessed for land tax in a different way.




