LOCAL LADIES GATHER TO CELEBRATE RURAL WOMEN





The Country Women's Association of Victoria State President was a special guest at Lockington's inaugural International Day of Rural Women Ladies Lunch on Thursday, 7 November.

Jenny Nola spoke to a gathering of 80 women from Lockington and the surrounding region about her rural upbringing, her path to the CWA's top job and her hopes for the iconic organisation's future.

The event also featured a parade of spring/summer fashion from Parsons of Rochester, and presentations and giveaways from Lockington & District Bush Nursing Centre and Helen Byrne (The BraVan).

A delicious lunch was catered by Hammond Providore, complimentary sparkling wine was donated by The Shiraz Republic and Bunnings Echuca provided stunning hydrangeas to decorate Lockington Community Centre which were later raffled.

Through the generosity of attendees, \$437 was raised to support Lockington & District Bush Nursing Centre.

The event was made possible by Lockington & District Business Centre through Lockington Neighbourhood House which significantly subsidised the cost of tickets.

Organiser Tanya McDermott was delighted with the response to the day and said it was now likely to be held annually.

"The attendance far exceeded our expectations and everyone had a fantastic afternoon. It was enormously rewarding to have the opportunity celebrate rural women and all that they do to support their families and communities.

"A huge thank you to everyone who contributed in any way to the success of the day, but particularly Jenny Nola who travelled from Melbourne, and Belinda Gordon from Parsons of Rochester who put in an enormous amount of work behind the scenes to present the fashion parade," she said.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone,

We have reached autumn of 1909, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the farming communities of this district were faring.

There were two weddings of significance to the district at about that time. The first took place at Diggora, on 24 March, at the family home of the bride, Miss Olive Maud Honey, second daughter of Mr Richard Honey, who married Mr Phillip Cunnington, fourth son of Mr T S Cunnington of Bamawm.

Then, on 28 April, Miss Annie Louise Zealley, second-youngest daughter of Mr George Zealley of Pannoobamawm, was married to Mr William Vickers of Restdown, in a ceremony celebrated at Pannoobamawm.

On a less happy note, on 13 May 1909, Mr William Hilton died at Bamawm. Mr Hilton was a resident of the district for nearly 36 years, and was 81 years of age. He left a grown-up family of two sons and five daughters.

May and June 1909 were relatively wet months in this region and, in some instances, sowing of crops was set back due to the soggy conditions in the paddocks. However, football got underway, and some successful evening functions were held. These latter included one held on 2 June in Kildea's barn at Warragamba.

There was some good news reported in the Bendiqo Independent on 5 May 1909, stating that, mainly through the instrumentality of Mr Thos Tunnecliffe, M.L.A., and Cr A J Walter, J.P., the Minister of Education had authorised the Public Works Department to renovate the State school at Diggora South, and remove the building to the Warragamba school where, for many months past, the accommodation had proven totally inadequate. (However, it took until August that year for tenders to be called for the actual removal of the building.)

June 1909 must have been an ideal month for weddings in our district as there were four of them!

The first was the marriage of Miss Esther Ann Jane Penny, only daughter of Mr Johnathan Penny of Diggora to Mr John Buchanan, eldest son of the late Mr James Buchanan, also of Diggora. The ceremony took place on 16 June, at the home of the bride's

On that same date, 16 June, at Holy Trinity Church, Rochester, Miss Elsie May Whinfield, daughter of the late Mr John Whinfield of Bamawm, married Mr Arthur Stanley, mounted constable, of Rochester. Saturday, 19th June, was the day chosen by Miss Victoria Greer, daughter of Mr and Mrs George Greer, of Bendigo, late of Wanurp, for the celebration of her wedding with Mr William Dunstone, of Pine Grove, at All Saints' Cathedral, Bendigo. A week later, on 23 June 1909, at "Hazeldene," Diggora, the residence of the bride's brother, Mr Edwin Arnold Warden, of Rochester, was united in marriage to Miss Gertrude Jane Haines, daughter of Mr and Mrs Robert Haines, of Rochester.

Consistent rain fell over a period of six weeks during winter of 1909, but for the most part, football, lawn tennis, dances and euchre parties were ongoing. One such function, a very successful dance and euchre party, held in Kildea's barn on Friday evening, 2 July, co-incidentally supplied the occasion for an incident of robbery and arson. Mr Fiedler's store at Warragamba, was forcibly entered while its owner was attending the function. Several items were stolen, and the offender started a fire in an effort to escape detection. Fortunately, a local resident who left the party early, noticed the fire and quickly called assistance in extinguishing it. The robbery was discovered, and the matter was put in the hands of the police, as reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 6 July.

On 12 July 1909, a Piavella correspondent wrote to the Advertiser saying that local farmers considered agricultural prospects favourable for that season. The crops and grass were doing well, and stock generally looked good. However, fallowing was at a standstill owing to the ground being too soft to carry the horses. That situation was expected to ease but in fact, it didn't, as heavy and persistent rain continued until, by late August, floods were being experienced on the Campaspe River. At Rochester, the streets were full of water, and the houses and shops on the lower levels were swamped.

Work on the Waranga-Mallee Channel was proceeding satisfactorily but, on 22 July, a tragic accident occurred at syphon works near Tennyson. A man from Huntly, Mr William Matthews, was working at the mouth of a tunnel when tons of earth fell in and buried him. He was rescued, but the unfortunate man had sustained multiple injuries and, having been taken by train to Bendigo, he reached hospital the following morning in a very low condition and passed away. Mr Mathews was a married man with children and, on 31 August, a concert and ball was held at Mrs O'Brien's Hall, Tennyson, to raise funds to aid his widow and family. The gathering was a success in every respect, the attendance being one of the largest ever seen at Tennyson Hall. As recorded by the Bendigo Advertiser on 15 September 1909, a good many donations were received.

On 20 September 1909, the Bendigo Advertiser carried the story of a remarkable mishap which occurred to three animals owned Mr P Doherty, at one of his properties at Diggora, upon which was an unoccupied dwelling. A horse and two bullocks got inside the house, the horse in one room and the bullocks in another, evidently with the object of sheltering from the wet weather. The doors closed on the animals, which were not missed for several days, and when found the horse had died. The two bullocks, similarly trapped, had almost died of hunger, but recovered on being liberated.

We'll have to leave the rest of 1909 until a later Locky News. 'Bye until then, Marg O'Brien






