## DRAFT LOCKINGTON & DISTRICT PLACE BASED PLAN OPENS FOR COMMENT

After several months of extensive community consultation and engagement, the Lockington & District Place Based Plan Committee has approved the draft Lockington & District Place Based Plan for the community to review.

The Lockington & District Place Based Plan Committee worked alongside independent consultants Cred Consulting to guide the development of the plan.

During the next six weeks, Lockington & district community members will have the opportunity to read and discuss the contents of the plan and provide feedback before it takes the next step, being tabled to Campaspe Shire Council.

From 20 January until 5 March you will be able to read the draft Lockington & District Place Based Plan and submit feedback online or in person at Council's Customer Service Centres.

Hard copies of the plan and the feedback forms will also be available at the Lockington District Business Centre.



## **LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME**

Hello again everyone,

Happy New Year 2025 - but we have only reached January 1910, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the farming communities of this district were faring.

That year would mark the beginning of enormous changes for our district. The irrigation scheme, sought since the earliest selector settlers arrived here, was coming to be – but it was not to be the scheme for which the residents had hoped; a system of channels that would simply bring extra water to their farms for stock and domestic purposes; a solution in times of water shortage or drought.

Instead, what was to be provided was an irrigation scheme that could be justified only if used for intensive farming – small acreages used to produce fruit, vegetables, dairy produce and the like. Across the district, thousands of acres of land, generally representative of the choicest and most successfully operated of the existing farms, were being acquired by the government, to be subdivided and re-allocated to hundreds of new settlers, a majority of whom were to be recruited from overseas!

In a matter of months, many of the long-established local communities would disappear or become unrecognisable, with most of their former residents having moved away to retire, or to take up land elsewhere.

The hopes and plans of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission and the Closer Settlement Board were outlined in press statements, published by the metropolitan daily newspapers, such as that which appeared in the Melbourne Argus on 17 January 1910. It quoted Mr Elwood Mead, an American experienced in the establishment of similar irrigation systems in his own country, who had been appointed as the Chairman of the S R & W S Commission.

"Every developing country has to seek settlers, just as it has later on to seek markets, and nothing better repays careful, persistent effort."...

"We found it desirable to operate in ... the Bamawm district, where there is good land on the authorised route of the Goulburn Waranga Mallee channel, and no existing channels to interfere with a perfect scheme of water distribution being planned."

... "Bamawm scheme ... will become an immigrant settlement, although we will not, of course, exclude Australians. They will have the first chance." ... "We propose to follow the methods adopted by settlement promoters in America, and appoint experts who will give instruction and advice in grading and preparing land for irrigation, and in irrigating and cultivating it.

Several experts may be brought over from the United States for this service." ... "We must go to Europe and the United States for the settlers. In Great Britain, Denmark and other Continental countries and in the United States, farmers are used to the intense culture on small holdings we desire to promote by irrigation here." ... "Reliable farm labour could however be obtained in Great Britain and on the Continent. It is badly required in all the irrigation districts. There can be no real development in irrigated culture without it." ...

"How shall we obtain these settlers? There is only one way ... We must go out and look for them." ... "The sons of Victorian farmers show no special liking for irrigated culture on small areas, in spite of the very profitable returns proved to be obtainable from such holdings ... Their inclination is to move out to the wide and cheap areas of the less thickly populated States, where there are obvious opportunities of prosperity for the man who has the courage of the pioneer.

Therefore, immigrants skilled in this special class of farming must be found".... "It will be 50 years before the irrigation districts of Northern Victoria are filled up, if we rely on natural development only to provide increased population." ... "It will take several months to get the Bamawm scheme into such condition that settlers can be placed on it. What ought to be done, when the plans are ready, is to send a delegation abroad - to Europe and the United States - to seek for settlers." ...

"A Minister of the Crown ought to be a member of this delegation." ... "Once set the current of immigration steadily in the direction of Victoria," said Mr Mead, in conclusion, "and we would soon be able to find room for 100,000 new settlers. By building another reservoir at Tahbilk, we could irrigate four times as large an area as that of the schemes already provided for.

A forward immigration and settlement policy would send Victoria bounding ahead of any other State in the Commonwealth."... "In wealth production we want to aim at making 40 acres do what 400 acres are now doing."... "[Bamawm] will be one of the best (if not the best) of irrigation schemes in Australia."

Alongside these exciting developments, to a limited extent, the local district continued to function as usual. As reported by the Bendigo Advertiser on 18 January 1910, cricket got underway with an association consisting of the Wanurp, Terricks, Mologa and Mitiamo clubs, formed as a result of a meeting held at the Royal Mail Hotel, Mitiamo, on 15 January.

At Warragamba, as reported by the Elmore Standard on 19 February 1910, a well-attended meeting was held at the Creamery on 15 February, forming a local tennis club. (The Warragamba correspondent also wrote that drinking water had become scarce there, many farmers trusting to the generosity of their more fortunate neighbours for supplies.)

Other bad news came in a report in the Bendigo Advertiser on 22 February 1901 - The homestead of Mr August Petzke, of Wharparilla, was totally destroyed by fire that morning. The outbreak was caused by a child upsetting a kerosene lamp.



The date for the Community Defib Roundup / annual testing is Monday 3rd February 2025. This is the perfect opportunity for your organisation to get their device checked and ensure it is functioning effectively when it is required.

The \$15 charge to assess and test devices will be waived for non-profit community groups. We would like your device booked in before this date as part of our registration process. Devices can be left at the Centre on Friday 31st January in preparation for testing.

Devices <u>needed</u> for events in the days leading up to 3/2/25 can be dropped off on the morning of the 3rd by arrangement (but still need to be booked in prior to this - so we can cater to the community's needs)

- Please ensure your device is labelled with the organisations name and address so each
  can be returned to the respective club that it belongs.
- · Provide a name and mobile number for your responsible contact person.
- · Advise the Centre of hours that your machine is accessible

The visiting technician will advise any devices that require replacement battery and or pads (approx. cost for this can be around \$500 for both)

Help us to help you ensure your device is in optimum working order when it is needed to save a life. This Defib Roundup is set to become an annual event to ensure all devices in our community are functioning properly.
