# LOGIES ACCLAIM FOR TRAVIS FIMMEL SERIES

Boy Swallows Universe, the acclaimed television series starring Lockington's own Travis Fimmel, dominated the 2024 TV Week Logies on 18 August.

The show won five awards at the prestigious event: Best Miniseries or Telemovie; Best Lead Actor in a Drama (Felix Cameron); Graham Kennedy Award for Most Popular New Talent (Felix Cameron); Best Supporting Actor (Bryan Brown); and Best Supporting Actress (Sophie Wilde).




#### DAVID & PENNY SHARE THE LOVE

#### **LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME**

Hello again everyone, we have reached May of 1907, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the farming communities of this district were faring.

Rainfall that year had not been sufficient to meet the farmers hopes, but sowing operations were being "steadily pushed forward," as reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 16 May 1907. Through June, early-sown crops progressed satisfactorily though, by July, very little rain had fallen. In Tennyson, stinkwort appeared for the first time, and foxes played havoc amongst the lambs in the district, large numbers being killed every night.

However, with sowing completed, and despite the foxes, it was possible once again for district residents to meet socially. On 28 May 1907, the Bendigo Advertiser reported on the picnic held at Milloo State School on Empire Day, with students from the schools at Tennyson, Wanurp, Milloo and Milloo East, gathering for a combined celebration. At Wharparilla State School, a picnic was held on 7 June, to celebrate Arbour Day.

Unfortunately, the trees expected from the State Nursery did not arrive at the Echuca Railway Station until late that afternoon too late to be planted that day. Across the district, the various Mutual Improvement groups met regularly to socialise, and to hold debating competitions. Meanwhile, at Diggora West, a meeting had been held in the last week of May, to form a lawn tennis club, and on 24 July 1907, the Diggora community held a euchre party and dance, in Kildea's barn, in aid of the building fund of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Catholic Church, at

Three weddings of note took place in the district in the winter of 1907. The first of these was celebrated on 12 June at St David's Church of England, Milloo, the contracting parties being Mr Jonathon Reddrop, second son of Mr James Reddrop, Piavella, and Miss Sarah Martin Steen, fourth daughter of Mr James Steen, of Tennyson. The following week, on 19 June, in a ceremony celebrated at Holy Trinity Church, Rochester, Mr Walter Bird, of Kyabram, married Miss Marion Pitts, third eldest daughter of Mr Thomas Pitts, of Tennyson.

Then, on 29 June, at St Mary's Catholic Church, Terrick Terrick, Mr Michael Thomas T Brown married Miss Mary Ellen Cox, third daughter of Mr James Cox of Spring Vale, Terrick Terrick.

A little rain in early August 1907, was welcomed across the region and, as reported by Pannoomilloo and Tennyson correspondents to the Bendigo Advertiser, "made a marked improvement in the general appearance of the cereal crops and grass." Hares and rabbits quickly responded to the improved conditions but were dealt with by the local gun clubs. In the first week of August, a meeting at Terricks East, with 23 guns, saw 203 hares bagged. The Warragamba Gun Club met fortnightly between 13 August and 17 September, and accounted for a total of 1363 hares, 97 rabbits, and 2 foxes.

On 29 August, the Mitiamo Gun Club met, and shot through the paddocks of Prairie Estate and Mitiamo Park, with 112 hares shot. The Pine Grove Gun Club bagged 402 hares at their meeting on 10 September, and the Terricks East Gun Club held its final meeting for the year on 11 September, to bag a further 160 hares. In other sports news, a picnic, in connection with the five district Cricket Clubs, was held at "Calder Park," Pannoomilloo, on 7 August, and on 10 September, the Tennyson Lawn Tennis Club held its annual ball in the Tennyson Hall.

Four deaths which occurred in the spring of 1907 were of particular significance to residents of our district. On 17 August, the Elmore Standard reported that Mr John O'Flaherty, a very old resident of Rochester, died on 13 August, aged 85 years.He was the father of Mrs John McGann, of Warragamba, and Miss Mary and Mr Hugh O'Flaherty, of Rochester. The Bendigo Independent on 28 August, advised that Mr John McAuliffe, for many years a resident of Bamawm, died the previous day, aged 77 years; and on 30 August, the Tennyson correspondent wrote to the Bendigo Advertiser that Mr George Harrison passed away on 29 August.On 13 September, the Bendigo Advertiser announced the sudden death on 11 September, of Mrs Jessie McKay, a very old and highly respected resident of the Mitiamo district. She was the mother of Mr Alexander McKay, farmer, of Wanurp.

On 28 August 1907, the Tennyson correspondent wrote to the Bendigo Advertiser that the wheat and oat crops there were "looking well, despite the absence of a good rainfall," but, by 2 October, the Advertiser's report from Pannoomilloo was far less encouraging. It stated that the parched land was growing drier daily so farmers felt "almost distracted," and many "turned their dairy cattle onto their oat paddocks.'

Otherwise, there were signs of progress in the district. On 16 August 1907, the Bendigo Independent reported that Mr Montgomery, of the Postal Department, visited Rochester to inspect the route of a proposed telephone line to Tennyson, a distance of about twenty miles. Then, on 28 September, the Elmore Standard reported that members of the Railway Standing Committee were in Elmore to take evidence in the Atheanaum Hall that evening, concerning the proposed rail link from Elmore to Cohuna. The following week, the committee took evidence at the Shire Hall, Rochester, pertaining to an alternative proposal for a line to Cohuna from Rochester. Next day, evidence was taken at Tennyson, where there was a very large gathering of farmers and other interested people, including some from Elmore and Kamarooka.All witnesses expressed their willingness to load their land, and to pay a special rate for stock, in the event of the proposed line not paying. However, as they supported a rail line to connect Cohuna to the Bendigo-Echuca line at Huntly or Bagshot, it seemed the project would be denied again due to the lack of unanimity.



The Centre has been reviewing the costs of Dressings after a number of recent price rises. We will be implementing a new system on a trial basis to ensure we are covering costs. The cost of a basic dressings will now be a flat rate of \$5 and more complex dressings will be slightly dearer. Thank you for your understanding.

If you are experiencing financial difficulty please tell the nurse so other arrangements can be made. No person will be denied medical care when they require treatment due to an inability to pay. Our staff are dedicated to providing safe, affordable care to everyone.
