#### COL DOES LOCKY PROUD IN PARIS



We were proud well before the Paralympic Games had started but Locky swimmer Col Pearse's efforts in the pool in Paris had our entire community celebrating.

After winning his heat, Col finished an outstanding fourth in the 100m Butterfly S10 Final, just touched out for a medal by Australian teammate Alex Saffy in a Paralympic record time.

His crowning glory, however, came in the 200m Individual Medley S10 Final where he had qualified fastest.

Col claimed a silver medal with a personal best time. He had previously won a bronze at the Tokyo Paralympics.

As local Member Peter Walsh said so perfectly on social media following the performance, "What a spectacular ambassador for his family, his community, his country, and the wider world".

#### **LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME**

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached November of 1907, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the farming communities of this district were faring.

As reported by the Tennyson correspondent, in the Bendigo Advertiser on 26 November, harvesting had commenced and many of the oat crops were already harvested. The wheat crops were ripening nicely, but most of them were very thin and, as water had become extremely scarce, farmers were busy cleaning out wells or sinking new ones.

At Pannoomilloo, as reported in that same newspaper on 30 November, haymaking was in full swing. Crops were "very light," and the farmers had to contend with caterpillars – which had been "very destructive," – and sparrows, particularly near the timber and hedges. "The last downpour, though welcome, was too light to fill the dams." The Pannoomilloo correspondent stated that 1907 was the driest year experienced in the last 35 years. "During that long period the residents have never had recourse to the wells for stock and domestic purposes so early in the season."

The year's end was approaching, and school concerts were in order. A particularly successful one was held in the Tennyson Hall on 26 November. The performers were students of the Wanurp and Tennyson State schools, trained by their teachers, Misses Skewes and Eadie, with Mr and Mrs Rosan assisting with lighting etc. The concert was followed by dancing. At Warragamba, the main entertainment at that time took the form of farewell functions.On New Year's Eve, the Woodburn family home was the venue for a gathering to extend good wishes Mr W J Lovett, as he was leaving the Warragamba Butter Factory after an association of fifteen years. On 7 January 1908, another pleasant social was held in Kildea's barn, to make a presentation to Mr Lovett on behalf of his many friends at Warragamba.

On 7 January 1908, the people of Tennyson and the surrounding district lost a highly respected friend and neighbour of very long

standing, when Mr James Steen died at his residence "Brookborou," after a protracted illness. Mr Steen was aged 64 years. He was born in the County Fermanaugh, Ireland, in 1844, and came to Victoria in September, 1861. He first settled in Bendigo, and became associated with the Bendigo Advertiser as a compositor. He then proceeded to the New Zealand goldfields, where he remained for two years. When land selection took place here in 1871, Mr Steen selected land in Pannoomilloo with his brothers, Johnstone and Thomas. There, he farmed successfully for the ensuing 35 years, and identified himself with every movement for the advancement of the district. Mr Steen was survived by a widow, five daughters and two sons; the daughters being Mrs E Sublet (Ballarat), Mrs A Wilson (Milloo), Mrs John Reddrop (Milloo), Mrs Joseph Elliott (Warragamba), and Miss Steen. His sons were Mr Thos. Steen, farmer, Tennyson, and Mr Johnstone Steen, schoolteacher, Western Australia.

Heavy showers at the end of December 1907 were welcomed. They relieved fears of a water famine, whilst being late enough not to damage crops as the harvest was close to completion. The weather through January and into February 1908 was very hot, the extreme heat possibly causing a fire, which broke out at Tennyson on 14 January. On the property of Mr J Grigg, that fire completely destroyed a stack of 20 tons of hay, which comprised the whole of his season's crop. At Warragamba, as described in the Elmore Standard on 15 February, there was concern for the health of the local schoolchildren; thirty of them being confined, day after day, in a very small classroom, in heat that exceeded 100° farenheit (38° celcius). On several occasions, lessons had to be curtailed. The Standard that day carried the report of the death, at Kangaroo Flat on 11 February, of former Warragamba pioneer resident, Mr Walter Oliver. The deceased had been a resident of the district for over 30 years, and was survived by his three daughters and two sons. Another "old district identity," Mr John Jamieson, late of Rochester East and previously of Bamawm, passed away, aged 81 years, on 27 January. In reporting his death, the Bendigo Independent of 29 January 1908, stated that it was "hastened by the heat."

A campaign to obtain telephonic communication between Rochester and Tennyson was launched in 1907, and came forward again in January 1908. A petition was submitted in quest of the assistance of the Echuca Shire Council. In response, Cr M'Intyre moved that the Shire President (Cr Crawford) and Cr Doherty wait on the deputy Postmaster-General, and put the claim for the construction of the line before him. When the Shire Council met again in February 1908, correspondence was received from J Bertram and Sons, asking that they be furnished with a rough plan showing the proposed route of Tennyson telephone line, road crossings, distances, etc.; and they would quote cost of installation.

Once again, farewells were in vogue. As reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 26 February 1908, almost the whole of the residents of Prairie and the surrounding district assembled at the residence of Mr. Jos. Orchard, Piavella Park, on Wednesday 19 February, to spend a social evening with Mr and Mrs Orchard on the eve of their departure, and also to welcome back Mr and Mrs Leslie Orchard from their honeymoon. Mr Leslie Orchard had wed Miss Charlotte Tonkin, only daughter of Mr William Tonkin, of Milloo. The newly-married couple would reside in the old family home, while Mr and Mrs Orchard, senr., were retiring from farming pursuits, and were going to Melbourne to live privately. Then, the Elmore Standard reported that, on 24 February 1908, about 140 guests attended a farewell social, tendered to Mr J Fitzgibbon, in Kildea's barn at Diggora.

That must be all for this time, 'Bye,





#### **RECOGNISING OUR VALUE**

Lockington Neighbourhood House provided more than \$210,000 in practical value to the local community in 2023.

The figure was one of the key findings of an annual review and assessment, undertaken by Neighbourhood Houses Victoria.

It represents a return to the community of \$2.21 for every \$1.00 of Neighbourhood House Coordination Program funding and almost \$130 for every hour that Lockington Neighbourhood House operates.

Proudly, a key outcome of the House's work was an improved quality of life for Lockington district residents through the development, promotion and provision of social connection opportunities.

## FINANCIAL HELP FOR COLIBAN CUSTOMERS

#### LOCKINGTON PLACE BASED PLAN UPDATE

Over the past few weeks, our community has been bustling with activities aimed at gathering insights and ideas for the future development of Lockington and district.

The Place Based Plan survey closed on Sunday, 25 August, with a huge total of 192 responses received (121 online surveys and 71 hard copies).

Other engagement activities included:-

#### Stakeholder Interviews

On Wednesday, 28 August, CRED and Council staff conducted five interviews with various community groups in Lockington and District.

These groups included the Lockington and Bamawm Football Netball Club, Lockington Lions Club, Lockington Community Centre, Community Bank Lockington, and Lockington Bush Nursing Centre.



Additionally, telephone interviews were conducted with representatives from Milloo Hall, Business Centre, Lockington Neighbourhood House, and Bamawm Recreational Reserve.

#### Lockington Consolidated School Workshop

On the same day, a workshop was held with grades 4 and 5 at Lockington Consolidated School.

Approximately 35 students participated, sharing their creative ideas and insights on potential improvements and developments that would benefit young people in the future.

#### Committee Workshop

The committee workshop took place on the evening of 28 August.

Attendees included committee members, CRED consultants, Campaspe Shire Council Mayor Amos, Cr Jarman, Cr Pentreath, and Council officers.

The workshop covered summarising engagement activities, reviewing themes from the engagement, prioritising actions, and developing a vision for the future of Lockington and district.

We are excited about the valuable feedback and ideas gathered from these activities and look forward to collating them into the draft place based plan which will be developed over the next few weeks and available for comment following Local Government elections in October.

## Be Screened LIVE LONGER

#### **Bowel Cancer Screening**

Every 2 years now from 45 - 74 years

The Australian Government has lowered the eligible screening age for the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program from 50 to 45. People aged 45 - 49 can request their first free screening kit by completing a webform or calling 1800 627 701. People aged 50 - 74 will continue to receive a free home test kit in the mail every two years.

#### **Breast Cancer Screening**

Every 2 years for women ages 40+ years

BreastScreen Australia is the national breast screening program and actively invites women aged 50 - 74 to have a free two yearly mammogram. Women aged 40 - 49 and those aged over 74 are also eligible to receive a free mammogram but do not receive an invitation.

#### Cervical Cancer Screening

Every 5 years for women aged 25 -74 years

If you are aged 25 to 74 and you have a cervix, you can have a healthcare provider collect your screening sample or collect you own. Both are simple and equally effective.
