Our local community can be assured that our local news will still be published and distributed on a regular basis.

#### **LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME**

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached March 1908, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn what was happening in our local farming communities.

The weather in January and February was very hot and by March, the absence of rain caused anxiety. Grass was scarce, and stock were being fed hay or silage. As reported to the Bendigo Advertiser by its Milloo correspondent, on 24 March, because of the works in progress on the Waranga-Mallee channel, there was a high demand for feedstuffs of all kinds. This in turn caused increases in price for whatever stockfeed could be obtained. The Pannoomilloo correspondent wrote that channel works were progressing satisfactorily, with many men employed at good wages.

On 1 April 1908, the Bendigo Independent reported that the Water Supply Commission had received tenders for the construction of two miles of the Waranga-Mallee Channel, which commenced at the termination of contract No. 58 at 59 miles, and extended to 61 miles. Among the successful contractors were O'Brien Brothers and James Martin, both of Tennyson. Earlier successes, published by the Independent on 20 December 1907, included some tenders by these particular local contractors.

It was not until May 1908 that "splendid" rain fell, and the intervening weeks were anxious ones, but only seriously adverse conditions could prevent social activities. In mid-March, both the Melbourne Argus and the Weekly Times, noted that a large crowd attended the Pine Grove Sports meeting. Then, on 24 March 1908, as reported in the Elmore Standard, a successful tea meeting and concert was held in the Pine Grove Methodist Church.Throughout those weeks, cricket matches as well as meetings and other activities of the various local Mutual Improvement groups continued undeterred.

A tragic accident at Piavella, on 7 April 1908, took the life of 15-year-old Albert Martin of Mandurang. Whilst working with his uncle, Mr O Peiper, the lad slipped from a loaded hay waggon and fell beneath the wheels.

Then, on 11 April, Mrs Cath McFadyen of Torrumbarry died after a lengthy illness. As reported in the Bendigo Independent on 15 April, Mrs McFadyen was a colonist of over 40 years' standing, and left a grown-up family of six sons and two daughters, including Mrs Robert Whinfield, of Bamawm, and Mr Gillespie McFadyen, of Wharparilla. Fortunately, there were no deaths in Tennyson that autumn, but their correspondent to the Elmore Standard reported on 18 April, that an epidemic of measles occurred there, reducing the attendance at the State School by more than 50 %.

In January 1908, Echuca Shire councillors Crawford and McIntyre arranged to interview officials of the Postmaster General's Department, regarding telephonic communications in our district. At the April meeting of the Shire council, Cr McIntyre moved that department be contacted for details of the cost of constructing a line connecting the post offices at Tennyson and Pine Grove. He supported the Tennyson residents' wish to have such a line, the estimated cost being £200. The motion was seconded by Cr Rankin, and carried.

On 1 May, the Bendigo Advertiser reported that the PMG's department would not accept the Council's guarantee towards the cost of constructing a telephone line linking our local area with Rochester, but, if the council could construct the line, the department would maintain it thereafter.

Accommodation at the Warragamba State School was discussed at the meeting of the School Board No. 342 on 11 May 1908. The school building was small and in a state of disrepair, and the cramped conditions, exacerbated by the excessive heat experienced early that year, endangered the children's health. It was proposed that money for repairs at Warragamba would be better used in removing a school building from Diggora South, where the local school had been closed for many months due to low enrolments. As reported in the Elmore Standard on 16 May 1908, the Board offered no objection to the proposal.

Other news from Warragamba, concerned the death on 14 May, of Mr Michael Sullivan. Aged 67 years, he had lived in the district for more than thirty years, and was survived by his widow and a grown-up family of two daughters and a son.

On 30 May 1908, as informed by the Pannoomilloo correspondent, the Elmore Standard advised that the local contractors for the Waranga-Mallee channel were making satisfactory progress. Many teams were engaged scooping out the channel, and more were employed in carting stone from the local quarries. Others hauled timber from the forests and the local railway stations for use in bridges and culverts. It was reported that Warragamba farmer, Mr James McKay, had struck stone in his property which could be utilised in channel work. This stone was believed to be of superior quality to that then being sourced from the Picaninny Creek.

Light rain continued throughout winter, giving the local grain growers cause for optimism, and, generally, not marring local social activities. M I A meetings, debates and socials went ahead as usual; and some of the district Gun Clubs held successful hare shoots, though rabbits were surprisingly scarce.

Arbour Day celebrations had to be postponed due to inclement conditions, but any disappointment was mollified by thoughts of the beneficial rain. Sad news came from Pine Grove where Mrs Mary Annie Mancer died on 12 July 1908. She was 50 years old and had lived in the district for twenty years.




## Creativity abounded when Lockington Consolidated School held its 2024 Art Extravaganza.

It was well deserved egg and bacon rolls and coffees all round (and lots of smiling faces) to thank the dads and special people who attended.



#### Works Notice - Annual Road Resurfacing **Pogram**

Residents are advised that contractors will be conducting road resurfacing works on behalf of Council from Monday 23, September. The works are scheduled between 7:30am and 6:00pm on designated dates. During this period, streets must be clear of vehicles, and residents are requested to ensure children and pets are kept away from the work zones. Driveway access will be briefly restricted while bitumen is sprayed, but the crew will inform when access is available. Post-completion, residents may drive on the new surface at low speeds. 




