\$40,000 GRANT AWARDED TO BUSH NURSING CENTRE

Lockington & District Bush Nursing Centre has secured a significant funding grant to promote social connection within the local community.

The Centre was awarded \$40,000 through the Violet Vines Marshman Centre for Rural Health, a division of LaTrobe University.

The Violet Vines Marshman Project will run across the next 12 to 24 months and focus on initiatives which support good mental health and wellbeing.

It is being overseen by LDBNC nurse Lucy Gibson who prepared the successful grant application.

"Through collaboration and co-design, we will aim to develop and implement a range of activities and events that ensure there is a positive impact across a large cross section of the greater Lockington community," Lucy said.

"We have had preliminary discussions with a number of groups, including Headspace Echuca, Campaspe Shire and Lockington Neighbourhood House and we're excited to start the rollout," she said.

"There are lots of great ideas under consideration and several already in the pipeline, including chair yoga which commenced this week and is being offered free for the first seven sessions.

"The Bush Nursing Centre is also involved with the upcoming International Day of Rural Women Ladies' Lunch in Lockington on 15 October, and I'm very keen to support local youth by addressing the disadvantage that comes from growing up in a small rural community," Lucy said.

Lockington locals are also encouraged to contribute to the planning phase and put forward ideas and initiatives that might fit under the scope of the project.

Violet Vines Marshman (pictured) was born in 1917, in a rural township in the Southern Grampians, and in the shadow of the Great War.

She devoted her life to improving the health and wellbeing of people living in rural and regional Australia: in towns like Branxholme, where caring sat at the very heart of community spirit.

She was interested in people and helping them, always volunteering to roll up her sleeves to get things done.

Her optimism and endurance saw her through life, with all its challenges.

She died in 2014 but her legacy lives on through the Violet Vines Marshman Charitable Trust.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached July 1908, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn what was happening.

Our region experienced a late autumn break in May, and only light showers fell through the winter months so, by August, the generally dry conditions gave concern. However, with crops sown, there was time for recreation, and people joined in the meetings and activities of the various M I A groups, or played football or winter cricket.

One notable social event was the Parr-Oliver wedding. As reported in the Elmore Standard on 1 August 1908, the ceremony took place at the bride's home in Warragamba on 8 July. The bride, Miss Jessie Oliver was the eldest daughter of the late Mr Andrew Oliver, and her groom, Mr Thomas Parr was the eldest son of the late William Parr and Mrs Parr of Pine Grove.

A very different event, reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 13 August 1908, was the concert and bioscope entertainment held in the Tennyson Hall on 10 August, to aid the Church of England Central Fund. "Mr J C Langley showed a great number of pictures with the aid of his bioscope.

As the songs were beautifully illustrated, encores were numerous. Mr P O'Brien made an efficient accompanist, and was assisted by Mrs Es Minahan on the violin." [The "bioscope entertainment" was a type of slide show, a fore-runner of movies.]

Good rains fell across the State in the first week of September. As stated by the Editor of the Elmore Standard on 5 September 1908, this averted fears of a water famine in the coming summer, and made a good harvest almost a certainty, as well as providing plenty of grass. However, he commented that the weather conditions somewhat spoiled the American Fleet festivities in Melbourne.

Hundreds of country folk, including some from our area, flocked to Melbourne to welcome the Great White Fleet to Victoria.

The fleet, from the United States, was invited to Australia by the Prime Minister, Mr Alfred Deakin, as part of a world-wide tour. The spectacle of sixteen white battleships sailing into Port Phillip Bay on Saturday, 29 August 1908, was watched by many thousands of people from across Victoria, and beyond.

The ships were crewed by 25,000 officers and men of the US Navy, and Victorians happily welcomed them. The Kerang New Times sent its own reporter along, and descriptions of the fleet's arrival, and the welcoming celebrations over the ensuing week, featured in the New Times for the following fortnight.

However, it was a city reporter who wrote: - "The visit of the fleet to Australia has not only been a great object lesson to Australians, but it has been an equally great object lesson to the Americans. They have candidly confessed their former ignorance of Australia, and admitted that their eyes have been opened to its wonderful potentialities."

[At that time, Australia lacked its own naval defence force, and its security depended on a small Imperial Squadron, based in Sydney by the British Royal Navy. Though Australia contributed £200,000 per annum for its upkeep, this Squadron could be withdrawn in times of danger to fulfil imperial priorities. People in Australia, Mr Deakin among them, wanted this situation remedied. The Prime Minister sought to rouse popular support, and the invitation to the Great White Fleet to visit Australia gave Australians a display of sea power, such as had never before been seen here. While admiring the spectacle, Australians were inspired by the strength behind it. Moves to establish Australia's own Navy did not begin until 1909, but the visit of the Great White Fleet may have been crucial in increasing public awareness of its need.]

Meanwhile, it was almost a year since the Railways Standing Committee visited the northern district to take evidence regarding the various routes proposed for a railway line to connect Cohuna with the main Bendigo-Echuca service. The Committee had undertaken a thorough evaluation of the evidence gathered and, on 16 September 1908, all of the metropolitan 'dailies' carried its final report.

"After analysing the case made out in favour of each proposal, the committee adopted the following recommendation - 'That in view of the large annual loss that would result from the construction and working of a railway to Cohuna, the committee considers it inexpedient at present to connect that town by means of a railway with the existing railway system." So, after agitating for more than thirty-five years for a railway through our region, local residents faced disappointment once again.

The campaign for telephonic communications in the area fared no better. On 25 September 1908, the Bendigo Advertiser reported that a letter from the Postmaster General's Department, received by the Echuca Shire Council at its September meeting, stated that the proposed telephone to Tennyson, Pinegrove, Bamawm, Pannoomilloo and Pannoobamawm from Rochester would involve an annual loss of £10/16/9, and the department could not build the

It was suggested that the local people could build their own line, and the decision was made to contact the PMG's department asking that an estimate of the cost of line be supplied.

In the meantime, Pannoomilloo residents were saddened by the sudden death on 3 September 1908, of their friend and neighbour, Mr John Doyle. Mr Doyle was just 58 years old and suffered a heart attack. He left a family of seven, one boy and six girls, the youngest being a 10-year-old.

On that sad note we'll say goodbye until next time,



Thunderstorm Asthma

Because so many people needed urgent asthma treatment at one time, it meant that emergency services were unable to meet the demand. Even people without asthma can be at risk of thunderstorm asthma. Thunderstorm asthma can affect those with spring time hay fever, even if they have never been told they have asthma.

To lower the chance of having thunderstorm asthma when it is a known trigger for you, it is best to have good asthma management year-round. This means:

- Using your preventer especially during the spring thunderstorm season.
- Keeping your hay fever under control and taking any necessary hay fever medication.
- Carry your reliver inhaler.
- Stay inside & keep windows shut before and during storms with wind gusts.
- Use a spacer with Ventolin puffer for optimum effect.




