# **LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME**

Hello again everyone,

We have reached August 1910, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the farming communities of this district were faring.

This was a year when major developments were planned to take place; closer settlement and intensive irrigation farming were to replace what had been dry land cropping and grazing enterprises on thousands of acres of land across the region.

While land had been acquired and plans were in hand, there was still work to be done and the Bamawm Irrigation Scheme – that which most concerned our district – would not be ready until March 1911. Nevertheless, the Melbourne Leader reported on 27 August 1910, that the Government expected any day to receive notification that the first of the overseas immigrants, selected by Messrs. Hugh M'Kenzie (Minister for Lands) and Elwood Mead (Chairman of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission) to settle on the Closer Settlement irrigation blocks, had already embarked for Australia!

In the meantime, other locally-based projects were being successfully completed. On 10 August 1910, as reported in the Melbourne Argus on 12 August, as part of the celebrations for the opening of the Mutual Improvement Association Hall at Tennyson, a sports meeting was held on the site. A large crowd gathered to watch the opening ceremony performed by Mr Palmer M.H.R. Developments at Warragamba were on a somewhat smaller scale but were important to the local residents there. Mr T Tunnecliffe M.L.A. had been advised by the Education department, that the Public Works department would be erecting a new fence around the recently renovated Warragamba State school.

In addition, a new teacher's residence had been constructed there, and tenders had been called for the removal of the disused, and run-down, residence at the site of the former Diggora South State school. More district news concerned renewed activity in the campaign for a railway line to service the farming communities in the region between the Bendigo-Echuca and Bendigo-Kerang lines – A service for which the local people

had campaigned without success for more than thirty years. The matter had been re-introduced in the Legislative Assembly on 26 July 1910, and there had been meetings of the various Railway Leagues at centres along the proposed route/routes but, by October, no definite decision had been made.

At a conference of the Railway Leagues on 26 October, held at Gunbower, a resolution was passed unanimously "That in the opinion of the conference a deputation should wait upon the Minister of Railways, and urge the construction of the line, Elmore to Cohuna township, at as early a date as possible." It was also resolved that the secretary of the combined Leagues (Mr A D Randall) write to the Railways Standing Committee, and ascertain when they proposed to take evidence in regard to the proposed line. A subsequent meeting held at Tennyson on 5 November, was fully in accord with those resolutions. On 19 November, the Elmore Standard reported that Mr Randall, general secretary for the proposed Elmore-Cohuna line, had received word from Mr Cullen, M.L.A., that the members of the Railways Standing Committee were to be in the district very soon, and the Minister therefore thought it unnecessary for the proposed deputation to interview him. A committee was then appointed to prepare evidence to place before the Standing Committee at the time of their planned visit.

In other news, the Elmore Standard had reported on 26 November 1910, that the S R & W S Commission had accepted tenders of T Malone for construction of part of the Bamawm East irrigation channel, but work would not be completed until mid-February 1911, and was way behind new settlers' expectations.On 8 December, the Argus reported that new immigrants were arriving in Victoria daily, many of them wanting to take up land at Bamawm, though allotments would not be available there until March 1911. Whilst some insisted that the delegation sent to Europe to recruit immigrants had led them to suppose that they could secure land immediately on arrival, others admitted that they were "so anxious to secure land in the Rochester district" that they "came early to have 'first cut in.'" The Argus reported on 21 December, that the Water Commission was advertising for men with drays to work on construction of the Bamawm water channels but, as stated in the Age next day, while officers of the department would be waiting to meet with applicants, it was not the most favourable time for such recruitment. "In slacker times, the district farmers took on much of this class of work, but just now they were in the midst of the harvest."

On 21 November 1910, the Bendigo Independent reported that haymaking was underway in the Rochester district, and that crops were expected to be above average, though not equal to those of the previous two seasons. There were some excellent crops in Ballendella, Bamawm, Diggora, Warragamba, Pannoomilloo and neighbouring parishes. Though some fear of rust had been expressed, "best authorities" saw no cause for alarm. It was anticipated that returns would vary from about 7 to 10 bags to the acre, and the sample was first-class. Federation was principally sown, and Steinweidel and Bunyip varieties were seen here and there.

The report which appeared in the Kerang New Times on 2 December, was similar but added that, at the Terricks, on account of the difference in the quality of the land, the yields would not be as heavy as those towards Bamawm.Harvest was expected to be completed about New Year, but violent windstorms and lightning, at the end of December 1910, caused delay for some. On the farm of Messrs. Dullard Bros. at Pine Grove, a stook of hay was struck by the lightning. Fortunately, the incident was seen, and a serious fire was averted.
