\$350,000 ELECTION PROMISE FOR LOCKINGTON'S WATER WHEEL COURT

Federal Member for Nicholls Sam Birrell has promised that an elected Dutton-Littleproud Coalition Government would provide \$350,000 to support the Lockington community to expand accommodation at Waterwheel Court.

The funding would help to address the lengthy waiting list for community based housing in our district.

"Lockington Community Care is a great success story and an example of what small communities can achieve," Birrell said.

"The Committee received a small grant in 1991 to build two units to provide much needed housing for the elderly and disadvantaged in the community, and they built four units!



"The group has now built 16 units, leveraging any funding to provide maximum benefit, which is why the Nationals want to continue to invest in this community project," he explained.

Lockington Community Care Inc. is a registered charity run by a Volunteer Committee.

"People who have lived in a small community all their lives deserve the opportunity to age in place, and Lockington Community Care provides that opportunity," Birrell said.

"What has been achieved to date is remarkable for such a small community, but there is a waiting list for accommodation, so more needs to be done."

The funding commitment is part of a Coalition plan to strengthen local communities and get the country back on track.

A Coalition Government has committed to unlocking up to 500,000 new homes by investing \$5 billion to fund essential infrastructure like water, power, and sewerage at housing development sites.

It would also allow Australians to access up to \$50,000 from their superannuation to buy a first home.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone.

We have reached February 1911, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the local farming communities were

Major developments that were planned to take place in 1910 had yet to happen. Closer settlement and intensive irrigation farming would replace what had been dry land cropping and grazing enterprises on thousands of acres of land across the region. However, the Bamawm Irrigation Scheme - that which most concerned our district - would not be ready for its new residents before March 1911.

For the more westerly parts of the proposed Closer Settlement area, the delay would be even longer with the following notice appearing in the Bendigo Independent on 11 March 1911: -Closer Settlement. - Messrs. Cordner, Reynell and Co., auctioneers, of Bendigo, have been instructed by the Closer Settlement Board to invite tenders for leasing (with right to cultivate) suitable areas in the parishes of Pannoobamawm, Pannoomilloo, and Milloo. The conditions provide for leases to run till 1 March 1912.


In the meantime, throughout much of the district, life continued along something resembling its normal course. The harvest was completed, a little late, but the yield had been better than average and thanksgiving services were being held by the various church communities.

At Pine Grove East, on 17 February 1911, the local Sunday School held its annual picnic on Mrs Riegel's farm. During the afternoon, presentations were made to Mrs Riegel and Miss Minnie Riegel.

As noted in the Bendigo Advertiser on 22 February, Mrs Riegel and her sons and daughters intended moving to their estate at the Terrick Hills, their Pine Grove East farm having been sold to the Government. On 3 March, the Advertiser reported that the Pine Grove Sports and Picnic Club held its annual gathering at the Recreation Reserve on 27 February. There was a large attendance, the weather being all that could be desired.

There were other things happening. Though the marriage of Mr Michael Wilkinson, of Wellington-Flat Estate, Sutton Grange, and Miss Kathleen Green, eldest daughter of Mr W Green, of " Avondale," Warragamba, had taken place at Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Church, Elmore, on Tuesday, 7th February, it was not until 18 March 1911, that Elmore Standard readers were favoured with a report. It stated that a number of the relatives and friends of the contracting parties were present at the beautiful ceremony. After the service, the bridal party drove to the Victoria Hotel, where a recherche breakfast was served. The happy couple, escorted to the railway station by most of the guests, left by the evening train for Melbourne, en route for Tasmania, where the honeymoon was spent.

On 4 March, the Elmore Standard carried a report on the marriage of Mr Michael McGann of Warragamba and Miss May Ryan, the second daughter of Mr Patrick Ryan of Diggora. That ceremony took place at Rochester, followed by a wedding breakfast held at Miss Coghlin's Commercial Hotel.

In that same issue of the Standard was a report of a concert, held at the Diggora West State School on 1 March 1911, where a presentation was made to Mr Jonathon Honey and Miss May Whitford, in view of their approaching marriage. There was also the sad news of the death of Mrs James McKay's youngest son, Keith; a boy between two and three years old, who passed away on 28 February, after a fit of convulsions.

Major news in the district at that time focused on the visit of the Railways Standing Committee to gather evidence concerning the proposed rail service to link Cohuna with the main Bendigo-Echuca railway line. As reported in the Elmore Standard on 25 February, the Standing Committee would be at Cohuna that day. The Committee would then gather evidence at Elmore on 10 March, at Tennyson on 11 March, at Pine Grove East on 13 March, and at Rochester on 14 March 1911.

On 11 March, the Standard reported on evidence taken at Elmore, from owners of property in Tennyson, Pannoobamawm, Pannoomilloo, Warragamba and Elmore. All favoured a line to connect Cohuna with Elmore, and felt that an alternative proposal, to have the point of connection with the main line at Rochester, would not be advantageous. It would serve less people, carry less produce, would run counter to the irrigation channels (whereas the Elmore route would run parallel to them), would cross less productive farm land, and would encounter land that was prone to

Whilst all those interviewed were prepared to enter into a form of guarantee that a line connecting Cohuna with Elmore would be a paying proposition, none were prepared to support a similar guarantee should the connection be made at Rochester. The proceedings then terminated and the Committee proceeded to Rochester. On 18 March 1911, the Elmore Standard reported on the visit of the Committee to Tennyson and Rochester, stating that a "great deal of valuable evidence," favouring the Elmore route, was taken. However, of the evidence taken at Rochester on 14 March, the greater part favoured a railway connection between Cohuna and Rochester. As the Standard reported, evidence was also given there in support of a Cohuna-Echuca line.

Across the region, the weather conditions that year were exceptional. On 11 March 1911, the Warragamba correspondent wrote to the Elmore Standard: - "February's phenomenal rainfall is being succeeded by abnormal March downpours; this week's rains amounting to 119 points [30 mms approx.], making 956 points [240 mms approx.] since the New Year dawned. The locality for years past has not appeared so green during corresponding months; grass and water are in abundance, stock in excellent condition, and thus one has little difficulty in predicting a good autumn."

Small pub makes big impact

From a pool of 140 nominees across Victoria, the Lockington Hotel has been chosen as a finalist for two Victorian Australian Hotel Association awards.

The hotel is one of 12 vying for the title of Best Chef of the Year and one of five for Best Bush Pub of the Year.

Lockington Hotel chef Simon Poynting said the team was proud of the achievement.

"We're pretty proud and happy, if we get no further, I'm still so proud of how far we've got," he said.

"I feel more alive than ever and stuff like this, it's amazing for a little town like us to make the categories we've made.

"I'm so proud of the whole team, the front of house, the back of house, it's a whole learning curve for us all and we're keeping Lockington on the maps. That's the main thing."

With over 30 years of cooking experience under his belt, Mr Poynting brings a wealth of knowledge and creativity to the hotel kitchen.

However, cooking was not a job he intentionally sought out but one that fell in his lap at 21 years old.

In his home town of Apollo Bay, he became a fisherman straight out of school, going

on month-long trips to fish in Tasmanian waters.

After long periods out at sea, he felt he was missing out on his youth, and so he decided to look for a new job.

ed to look for a new job.
"I never thought I wanted to be a chef, I tried my hand at a lot of things," he said.

"I was having a drink in the Apollo Bay beer garden and my mate's parents owned it. He walked out one night and said, 'we really need help tonight, mate, do you want to be a kitchen hand?' and I did it and the rest is history.

"I just really enjoyed it and started to ask too many questions and the next thing you know, I'm an apprentice and it steam-rolled from there."

After completing his apprenticeship on the Great Ocean Road, where he learnt to handle seafood, he moved

to Melbourne to experience its vibrant food culture.

He worked in the city for around 12 years, gaining as much experience as he could in various kitchens and from chefs of different cultures.

Not long after meeting the woman who is now his wife, they visited Rochester for temporary work and ended up staying for 10 years and raising a family.

However, after the 2022 floods, they made the move to Lockington.

Now in his third year as the Lockington Hotel's head chef, he has seen the establishment continue to grow.

"We've got people coming from everywhere, we've got such a name now," he said.

"Especially our weekend lunches and our (dinner times), people are driving from all across the region because we have a name for what we're doing with our food and what the guys are doing in the bar with their service.

"We're just looking forward to the (awards) ceremony now and crossing our fingers and hoping for the best."

Nominations for the awards opened in October 2024. Then there was a judging period, from Friday, January 10 until Monday, March 3.

During this time, secret diners were deployed across Victoria to assess the nominated venues.

Each business was evaluated on a range of aspects, including food, service and staff knowledge of local wines and produce.

Within the region, other hotels have also been named among the AHA Award finalists, including Echuca Hotel for Best Live Entertainment Venue Excellence in Service.

The American Hotel, Echuca has also been nominated for awards, including Best Cocktail List of the Year, Best Outdoor Experience — Regional and Best Pub Bar — Regional.

All the finalists will be attending an awards ceremony on Monday, May 19.

OBITUARY - BILL PITTAWAY

"I want to thank all of you for being here to honor the life of William Ernest Pittaway and to share memories of him.

For those who may not know me, my name is Trent, and I am one of Bill's grandchildren.

As we reflect on the life of Bill or Papa as we knew him, I would like to share some of the memories I have of him and some of the details of his life.

Bill was born on 14th of September 1924 at a nurses house in Golden Square to Albert Leslie Pittaway (a dairyman) and Minna Victoria Pittaway nee Smith.

The family lived on a farm at Kangaroo Flat that went back to his Great Grandfather William Pittaway. Bill went to school at Kangaroo Flat State School No 981, walking the mile to school each day.

Jobs were hard to get in those days and Bill moved to Lockington when he was 14 to work delivering meat for Sam Dingley and his wife Enid.

He continued working in this business until 1942 when it closed due to the War. Bill joined the Air-Force in 1943 and served at Rocklands Dam, Richmond Airforce Base, Townsville and in Bougainville.

During a leave period Bill married Lorna on the 5th January 1945. Together they had two sons Kevin and Denis.

After the war Bill returned to work at the Butcher's Shop in Lockington where he became the Manager in 1954 and in 1966 he took over the Butcher's Shop in Rochester where he remained until he retired in 1994 at the age of 70.

It is in this shop that many remember him, Papa slicing a piece of Stras was always a highlight when we came to visit him in the shop. It was here that he taught us how to count change out of a till and I remember playing with the till pretending we were working in the shop.

Amongst the many achievements of his life were being a Foundation Member of Lockington Fire Brigade, Lockington Bowling Club, Lockington Bush Nursing Centre and as a Charter Member of the Lockington Lions Club.

He was the Church Secretary from 1956-1974 and Parish Council Secretary and Treasurer from 1963-1988, first President of the Lockington Swimming Pool, on the Lockington Hall Committee for 30 years and the Lockington Recreation Committee for 20 years.

Bill was a Life Member of the RSL and served as Rochester Treasurer.

While Bill achieved many things during his life, it was his role as Father, Grandfather and Great Grandfather that he was most proud of and I will always remember the time and patience that he gave us growing up. I am sure my brother and sister, Sean and Lana would agree that we couldn't have asked for a better Papa.

I would again like to thank all of Bill's family and friends both here and online for coming along to celebrate his life today and support the family. Papa we will always remember and love you and will miss you."







The women will hold the annual 3 bowl Triples on Friday 11th April starting at 10.00am.


