LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone,

We have reached January 1912, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the local farming communities were faring.

The news of most interest to our families at the time concerned the proposed railway line to connect Cohuna with the main Bendigo-Echuca line at Elmore. On 12 October 1911, the Railways Standing Committee had tabled its recommendation in the Legislative Assembly for the construction of the line, but no further progress had been made as the news had met with a mixed reception.

Local residents had been campaigning for the provision of a railway service to and through this region for more than thirty years, with their preferred point of connection to the main route being at Elmore. However, it was claimed that a Rochester-Cohuna rail link would better suit the new settlers at the Bamawm irrigation settlement, and there was strong support from this quarter for the alternative route.

On 6 January 1912, a conference of Railway Leagues interested in the Elmore to Cohuna railway route was held in the Athenaeum Hall, Elmore, when there were present representatives from Pannoomilloo, Tennyson, Pine Grove, Warragamba and Elmore. As reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 9 January 1912, the conference was called to controvert the mis-statements made by a deputation, headed by Mr H M'Kenzie, M.L.A., which had recently waited upon the Minister for Railways, urging that the Cohuna railway should start from Rochester. It seemed to those attending this conference that it should not have been needed.

The Railways Standing Committee had been appointed in order to do away with political patronage, yet it appeared that considerable political influence was being exerted in efforts to overthrow the verdict of the Standing Committee – a verdict based on evidence and inquiries extending over twenty years. Those at the conference maintained that the agitation was being fostered in Rochester, and was not a genuine appeal by the new settlers at Bamawm.

The Elmore route would serve all equally well, but any deviation eastward would not serve, effectively, the country towards Drummartin and Kamarooka, whose needs should also be considered. After some discussion, a resolution was formed "That a sub-committee be appointed to prepare a report controverting the statements of the recent deputation, and that the same be printed and distributed to every member of Parliament." The resolution was carried unanimously. The people of the region had now to await the decision of the government.

As 1912 began, the weather was hot and dry and on 9 January, a serious fire occurred at Wanurp at Messrs Dunstone Bros.' farm. Fifty tons of hay, 250 new bags, fencing, and grass were destroyed. Reigel Bros' new chaff-cutting plant (valued at £120) and two bicycles, standing by the stacks, were also burnt, and the men lost clothing and some cash. About 60 farmers assisted to prevent the fire from spreading further.

This fire was reported in the Argus on 13 January and, on 27 January, the Leader reported another fire in the district, this time on the property of Mr P Doherty between Rochester and Bamawm. This second fire broke out on 20 January and once again, there was ample assistance available to subdue it, but Mr Doherty still lost about 70 acres of grass and some fencing. However, the principal sufferer was Mr Read, of Restdown, who had over 100 acres of grass destroyed, as well as some fencing, some machinery and a stack of hay.

On a more cheerful note, with the weather so warm, the prospect of a picnic on the Murray River, near the Dead Horse Point Irrigation Works would have been attractive. Such a one took place on 17 January, organised by the Wharparilla Church of England community. The Bendigo Independent on 19 January 1912, reported that the event was well attended, well catered and was thoroughly enjoyed by all.

On 3 February 1912, the Wharparilla community lost 94-year-old resident, Mr Patrick McSwain. A native of Ireland, Mr McSwain had arrived in Victoria in 1854, having first travelled to Canada and the United States. He was on the Diggings at Blackwood, and later at Ballarat, before settling on his selection at Wharparilla in 1873. As reported by the Bendigo Independent on 8 February, Mr McSwain was survived by his four adult children, his wife having predeceased him in 1911.

A fierce electrical storm on 16 February was responsible for the death of Mr William Gaynor, a contractor from Corop. He and Mr Daniel Bourke of Restdown, were attending a sale at Bamawm, and were struck by lightning as they rushed to shelter from the heavy rain. As reported by the Bendigo Advertiser on 19 February, though Mr Bourke was seriously injured, he was taken to Rochester for medical treatment and subsequently recovered.

In the meantime, the new irrigation settlements were attracting attention. On 10 February 1912, the Argus reported that a party of two Australian and eight over-seas land-seekers were that day visiting Bamawm. Mr Elwood Mead, the Chairman of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, stated that there were a thousand farmers in England anxious to come to Australia, but at that time they were unable to secure berths to make the voyage. On 23 February, Messrs Weir and Cooke sat as a Land Board to allocate irrigation blocks in the Pannoo Estate, mostly in the parish of Pannooabamawm. There were 45 blocks altogether, of which 17 were allotted. Successful applicants listed in the report in the Age on 29 February, included such names as Heeps, Lowrie, Dullard, Aird, Park, Wright, Parr, Whinfield, Windridge, Sinclair, Turvey, Cathcart, and Brereton.

In other news of local interest, the Elmore Standard on 2 March 1912, reported that Miss Emily Jane Pitts, daughter of Mr J Pitts, of "Devonleigh," Elmore, was married to Mr Thomas Steen, of Tennyson, on 26 February, at the Methodist Church, Elmore.

There will be more from 1912 next time.

US ADVENTURER VISITS LOCKINGTON EN ROUTE TO PERTH



Adventure has defined the past six years of 25-year-old Gin's life.

She walked across America at the age of 18-19, having never left home before, overweight and awkward (her own words) with \$500 to her name, and it stirred something in her. She was transformed!

At 20, feeling trapped and having lapsed into a depression, she took off on her bicycle to cross the country again.

With spirits newly restored, she rode across the United States aged 21-23 on her mustang, Finley.

She had never ridden a horse, and he had been wild and untouched by humans a few months prior to their meeting.

Then she paddled the Yukon River and the voyage made her realise she wasn't ready to settle down.

Long riding in particular had captured her heart because it allowed her to combine her two greatest passions: animals and adventure.

She says she has known no greater love outside of family than from her furry, four-legged friends.

Having crossed North America on horseback already, Gin was eager to travel overseas for the first time to tackle another continent.

She departed from Tathra, New South Wales on 20 May with the goal of riding 700 kilometres ocean to ocean across Australia to Perth.

Her equine partner is Fable, a five and a half year-old, 14.2 hand black Brumby gelding from Kosciusko National Park/the Snowy Mountains in New South Wales.

Gin hails from Pennsylvania and passed through Lockington on the weekend of 13 & 14 July, spending the night at the Traveller's Rest and celebrating her birthday with locals before heading off on the next stage of her epic journey.

LOCKY OP SHOPS A STORM

Helping Hands Mission benefitted to the tune of more than \$4000 thanks to an Op Shop Bus Trip on 19 July co-ordinated out of Lockington by Tish Serpell.

Fifty six intrepid shoppers enjoyed the day which is held annually and carries on a project started by Deb Leed.

The group visited three Melbourne op shops run by Helping Hands Mission, a charity which does extraordinary work, particularly assisting families which have been impacted by domestic violence.

The op shops, located at 14 McIntosh Street in Airport West; 66 - 68 Oakover Road in Preston; and 85-89 Hampshire Road in Sunshine; have been thoughtfully designed to be more than just retail spaces.

They are among five community hubs under the Helping Hands umbrella, offering a chance for social inclusion and access to low cost items, all while generating the funding for the charity's aid programs.

Helping Hands began with a simple mission back in 2007, to support communities doing it tough.

What started as a small outreach project in rural Victoria has grown into a thriving community-based organisation.

Today, it supports over 500 families every week across Victoria — especially in Melbourne's north west — through Emergency Food Relief and Furniture and Essentials Assistance.



DROUGHT RESPONSE TASKFORCE



The Nationals Member for Murray Plains, Peter Walsh, said after three regional meetings, Premier Jacinta Allan’s drought response taskforce might have got its solutions package “about half right”.

Mr Walsh, who was invited onto the taskforce by the Premier, said her announcement funding to the drought declared shires would see farming council rates cut as much as 40 per cent in the next billing cycle was a step in the right direction – but only a small step.

He said the cuts should have been at least 50 per cent to have some genuine impact on the bottom line of drought devastated farmers. There will also be some extra funding for mental health and food support programs.

“I would have thought the Premier could have made sure farm rates were cut by 50 per cent – with the precedent being the millennium drought – using rates is a proportionate response and a great way to relieve financial pressures, we just haven’t gone far enough,” Walsh explained.

“The overall drought package is worth \$75 million – which covers the rate cuts and includes \$2 million to the CWA to run food relief programs and a further \$6.3 million for other fees and charges to be waived, with those details still to come,” he added.




