LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone,

We have reached April 1912, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the farming communities of this district were faring.

The new irrigation farming settlements, established in our region as part of the Closer Settlement Scheme, were featuring almost daily in the State's major newspapers.

However, the news most awaited at that time, by our families, concerned the proposed railway line to connect Cohuna with the main Bendigo-Echuca line. Construction of the line, to connect with the main route at Elmore, had been recommended by the Railways Standing Committee in October 1911, in the belief that it could serve the entire district satisfactorily. However, since October, an alternative campaign was waged, favouring a line to connect Cohuna with the main Bendigo-Echuca line at Rochester. This latter proposal received strong support from the new settlers at Bamawm, and a protest was lodged against the proposed Elmore connection. A final decision about the route was anxiously awaited.

In the meantime, as reported in the Argus on 12 April 1912, a joint preliminary meeting was held at Rochester on 11 April, to consider the question of amalgamating the Settlers' Associations, formed earlier at Bamawm, Nanneella, Rochester West, and Restdown. Though there had been some complaints about general conditions in the new settlements, coming through the associations, such complaints were not coming from Bamawm.

However, an article in the Melbourne Leader on 20 April 1912, indicated that some of the new settlers at Bamawm had a specific problem to address. They had experienced considerable difficulty in controlling the flow of the irrigation water as it escaped from the ditch, and this led to instances of unsatisfactory watering. Fortunately, a solution to the problem was found by one of their own. A Mr Vickers, an Englishman, who just twelve months earlier had acquired an irrigation block at Bamawm, had devised an effective means of controlling the

flow of water over his land. Mr Elwood Mead, the Chairman of the Water Supply Commission, was much interested in Mr Vickers' successful experiment, stating that irrigators in Washington, U.S.A., had adopted a somewhat similar principle with excellent results.

There were other happenings to report at the newly established settlement. On 2 May 1912, the Elmore Standard stated that a new church, built by the Presbyterians of Victoria for the Bamawm settlers, had been opened on 28 April, with well-attended services held that day, and an enjoyable social meeting held on the following Wednesday evening to mark the occasion.

On 8 May 1912, the closer settlement areas in and around Rochester were inspected by a party of American land-seekers, with the Bamawm settlement, which was now one year old, attracting particular attention, as an instance of what could be achieved by perseverance. As reported in the Argus on 9 May, the visitors were especially impressed to find fellow Americans among those who had already taken up allotments at Bamawm. [Unfortunately, the report does not name the settlers involved. M O'B.] The inspection group then moved on and, as reported by the Ballarat Star on 9 May, a civic welcome was tendered to them at Rochester, before their party travelled to Bendigo.

So far, farming in the irrigation settlements appeared to be proving successful, but weather conditions in autumn of 1912 were worrying for dry land farmers. On 11 May 1912, the Elmore Standard reported that the Campaspe River was "drier now than the oldest inhabitant [could] remember for the past quarter of a century." A week later, the paper's Warragamba correspondent wrote that there was "no natural feed for stock," and the district had never since the drought [1901-2] looked so bare. Graziers were resorting to hand-feeding and, with the scarcity of water being felt in nearly every homestead, some farmers had to cart water for all purposes.

However, the Warragamba community was rallying well. On 15 May, the Warragamba Lawn Tennis Club held a ball in the Tennyson Hall, with music supplied by Mr and Miss Patullo, and Mr G Turvey acting as M.C. As reported in the Standard on 18 May, sixty couples assembled from the surrounding district and "all went merry as a marriage bell."

On 29 May, the Bendigo Independent carried a less cheery report from its Piavella correspondent, stating that rain was badly needed there, too. Stock was in low condition, especially sheep, numbers of which were dying. There was no sign of any crops coming up and, unless it rained very shortly, most people would be out of water. There had been practically no rain for nearly nine months but, as in Warragamba, the community was holding up well. On Empire Day, 24 May 1912, the Milloo and Milloo East schools united to celebrate the occasion at a monster picnic. A very patriotic and enjoyable time was had by all.

By 1 June 1912, the Weekly Times reported that the prevailing dry weather was being severely felt, not only amongst dry farmers, but also by the settlers on Bamawm. Whilst Mr Roy, the local officer of the Lands Department, had received many inquiries from all parts of Victoria, for supplies of lucerne, the settlers were unfortunately unable to supply it. The Bendigo Advertiser on 7 June, reported that a well-attended meeting of settlers was held at Rochester on 6 June - delegates attending from Bamawm, Ballendella, Nanneella, and Mead Settlers Associations - at which the secretary drew attention to the fact that the water in the channels was to be cut off on 8 June, a disaster for the settlers, who could not possibly do without the water. A motion was passed "That the Water Commission be asked to keep the channels full until rain [fell]."

SENIORS AUGUST LUNCHEON

Lockington Senior Citizens Club held a successful Pie and Pastie Luncheon on 11 August.

Fifty-five people enjoyed a hearty meal, raffles and giveaways, and heard guest speaker Beryl Marshall talk about her escapades while living in England.

The next Seniors get-together will be an outing to Gunbower on 2 September including a visit to Torrumbarry Weir.

The original Torrumbarry Weir used 14 removable steel trestles that could be winched out of the river to allow the passage of floods. The first diversions from the weir pool occurred in June 1923.

The structure operated successfully until 1992, when major damage to its foundations occurred. Extensive repairs were carried out to enable the weir to continue functioning, but a recurrence of the foundation failure could not be discounted and its long-term viability was in question.

A new Torrumbarry Weir was constructed between 1993 and 1996, with the existing lock structure retained.



Notification to landholders: Roadside Exploration in Lockington, Elmore and Diggora areas



Fosterville Gold Mine will be undertaking exploration activities within public road reserves in the Lockington, Elmore and Diggora areas from mid-August 2025.

The programs – including Passive Seismic and Induced Polarisation surveys will be ongoing for 8 weeks, with works on individual roadsides to take 3 to 9 days.

The exploration activities are permitted by Resources Victoria and are being undertaken, between roadsides and the adjacent private property boundary, with appropriate permitting from councils.

The surveys will not impede access to farm gates and will not cause any disturbance to buried infrastructure, including irrigation lines.

Traffic management will be in place, and you may see light vehicle(s), up to three people, cones, bollards and speed restriction signs.


No roads will be closed to complete these exploration activities.
