## LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached June 1912, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the farming communities of this district were faring so long ago.

Local residents still awaited a decision regarding the proposed railway line to connect Cohuna with the main Bendigo-Echuca line. They had campaigned for this railway service to and through our region for more than thirty years, preferring the point of connection to the main route to be at Elmore. More recently, an alternative campaign had begun – for a line to connect Cohuna with the main Bendigo-Echuca line at Rochester; a proposal which received strong support from the new settlers at the Bamawm irrigation settlement. A protest had been lodged against the Elmore connection and a decision had yet to be made. In the meantime, meetings of the Railway Leagues took place, countered by meetings of the Bamawm Settlers and their Rochester supporters, and deputations were formed, ready to approach the Minister for Railways if necessary.

In mid-June 1912, a representative of the Bendigo Independent visited Rochester and the Bamawm Irrigation Settlement. His report in the paper on 15 June makes interesting reading. Rochester was in a state of growth, due largely to the developments taking place in the irrigation settlements surrounding the township.

New infrastructure was being provided, along with the expansion, renewal and renovation of existing facilities. At Bamawm, the reporter was given the opportunity of inspecting the settlement and conversing with some of the settlers. These included Mr Swetman, formerly a painter from Bairnsdale, who was then milking cows and growing lucerne; Mr Lucas, from Canada, who was also growing lucerne but, in addition, had planted 400 orange and lemon trees, which were growing wonderfully, only three out of the lot having failed; and Mr Thomas Goldsworthy, an immigrant from England, who believed in minimising work, or rather, working in such a way as to make the most of his time.

He had a small engine driving his separator, and the same engine operated two milking machines, with which he could milk sixteen cows in an hour. As soon as half of the cows were milked the separator was started, and the two processes then went on simultaneously till the remainder of the milking was completed. His piggeries, outbuildings, and all about the place bore evidence of skilled and systematic work.

All three of these men considered that irrigation was a success and were thoroughly satisfied with their holdings. They had no doubt that anybody who liked to work might succeed in Australia. There were others amongst the settlers who were not doing so well, but the reporter thought this was to be expected as some of them, having been previously engaged in city life, were quite ignorant of agricultural affairs.

As a point of interest, there was a report in the Geelong Advertiser on 4 July 1912, of a return, drawn up by the Immigration department, showing that since the Minister for Lands, Mr M'Kenzie, and Mr Elwood Mead visited Europe and America in 1910, 295 settlers from overseas had taken up irrigation blocks. Nine went on the Boisdale Estate, 85 on Bamawm, 52 on Nanneella, 25 on Koyuga, 26 on Cohuna, 64 on Tongala, 28 on Swan Hill, four on Shepparton, and two on the Kilmarnock Estate. Allowing that each settler represented five souls, about 1500 persons, were concerned. Further applications for blocks were being considered. News from the newly-established irrigation settlements featured in the papers almost daily, but life in the longer-settled areas continued to follow its regular pattern.

On 18 June 1912, the Bendigo Independent reported that a dance, held at Tennyson the previous week in support of the Warragamba Gun Club, had been a social and financial success. There was also a report of a successful hare shoot held at Tennyson on 2 July.

A wedding of local interest was celebrated at Christ Church, Echuca on 26 June, according to the Elmore Standard on 6 July 1912. The contracting parties were Mr Frank Ham, son of Mr and Mrs R Ham, of "Windermere," Pannoomilloo and Miss Gertrude Cable, eldest daughter of Mr and Mrs G Cable of Echuca.

There was good news for all when, on the last day of June, it began to rain at last. Though it was 'patchy', the Elmore Standard on 6 July 1912, reported that most parts of the district received a little in the following days. Piavella received an inch [25 mms], Tennyson 90 points [22.5 mms], and Warragamba, only 25 points [6.25 mms], but "Dams were replenished pleasingly, while those out in the rain knew what it was to be wet through." By 6 July, the Weekly Times reported that farmers in the Pine Grove district had commenced fallowing, with the ground being in good order after the recent rain. Crops and grass were growing well.

A meeting of the Rochester District Irrigators' League, on 4 July 1912, was reported in the Argus on the following day. The meeting had received a letter from Mr Elwood Mead, the Chairman of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, endorsed by Mr Graham, Minister of Agriculture, stating that he thought the agitation for a canning factory in the Rochester district was premature and unwise. This statement quite contradicted those made earlier. It was resolved that a deputation, representative of Bamawm, Nanneella, and Ballendella, would wait on the Minister, urging the necessity of establishing a canning factory at Rochester.

Meanwhile, a decision on the route of the proposed Cohuna rail link was still awaited and there will be more about that next time.

If you or someone you know would be in a position to attend and consider joining the Committee, it would be enormously appreciated.


So many of Lockington's vital community groups draw on a small pool of volunteers.


