The service concluded with the singing of the New Zealand and Australian National Anthems, with students doing sign language to Advance Australia Fair.

Prior to the service a large number of the community, students and RSL members marched, or were driven, through town to the Community Centre, led by student flag bearers, and trailed by our emergency vehicles.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached the end of April 1913, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the local farming communities were faring.

Four months had elapsed since the Bill authorising the construction of the Elmore-Cohuna railway line had been passed by Parliament, but work on the line had not begun. Progress had been thwarted by what the print media christened "the War of the Routes."

It had been hoped that the campaign for this railway service to and through our region – a campaign that had been waged for thirty years and more – might soon come to a successful conclusion, but there were complications.

The equally long campaign to bring irrigation to the northern plains had achieved success, and had brought with it the introduction of closer settlement in Bamawm. The new settlers there supported a proposal for an alternative railway line, from Cohuna to join the main line at Rochester. Both routes had been thoroughly investigated and, in recommending the Elmore-Cohuna route before Parliament, the Railways Standing Committee had allowed for a slight deviation eastwards from the original survey. They believed that this would meet the transport needs of the Bamawm residents, but the new settlers were unhappy.

They hoped that the incoming Minister for Railways (Mr A A Billson) who, together with the Minister for Lands (Mr McKenzie) and Mr Kernot, the head of the Railways construction branch, had made another inspection of the proposed line on 28 February 1913, would give consideration to bringing the route even nearer to the Bamawm settlement. On the other hand, the Cohuna, Gunbower, Elmore, Kamarooka, Tennyson and Elmore Railway Leagues strenuously objected to any alteration to the Cohuna-Elmore route originally recommended by the Railways Standing Committee. A deputation of delegates from the leagues waited on the Minister of Railways on 5 March to urge upon him the desirability of proceeding with the railway along the route of the original survey.

Interestingly, a report in the Elmore Standard on 1 March 1913, indicated that some of the Bamawm residents understood the feelings of the longer-term settlers who lived to their west. As the result of a meeting held at Tennyson earlier, a large number of new settlers in the Bamawm irrigation area, east of the recommended line, had signed a petition to the Minister of Railways objecting, in justice to all concerned, to any further deviation eastward.

However, a report in the Riverine Herald on 4 March, told of another petition from Bamawm, containing seventy signatures, forwarded to the Minister for Railways, praying that the proposed railway line from Cohuna to Elmore be brought three miles nearer to the heart of the irrigation settlement.

Mr Billson promised to consider the representations of deputations from the Railway Leagues, and from the Bamawm settlers, and to place them before the Cabinet. He stated that all the reports and petitions presented in connection with the line would receive proper consideration.

On 25 April 1913, Mr Billson's final decision was announced; the Cohuna-Elmore route would be constructed in accordance with the Railways Standing Committee's recommendations. The announcement was not generally well received.

However, despite all the friction in the air, and shared worries about low rainfall, the local communities continued to function. On 30 April 1913, as reported by the Elmore Standard on 10 May, Mr and Mrs James Jasper, of Tennyson, celebrated their golden wedding anniversary, and a large group of friends gathered to wish them well. A photographer was present to photograph the couple, together with forty-three of their descendants. (Unfortunately, there were ten or twelve absent.)

Then a large crowd assembled at Tennyson on 11 May 1913, for Hospital Sunday. The Elmore Standard reported on 17 May that an amount of £27 had been raised, the whole to be donated to the Echuca Hospital.

And, on 19 May 1913, the Bendigo Independent reported on Bishop of Bendigo, Dr Langley's visit to Bamawm, in connection with the erection of a new church on the settlement.

Good news was reported from Tennyson in the Elmore Standard of 17 May 1913. Two weddings of local interest had been celebrated on 30 April.

The first, the marriage of Miss Ada Jasper, of Tennyson, and Mr Alexander Oliver, of Diggora West, took place at Tennyson. The second, the marriage of Miss Nellie (Maria) Darsy, of Crescent Park, Wanurp, and Mr John Joseph Callaghan, of Clunes was celebrated at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Bendigo.

Then, on 28 May 1913, the Melbourne Argus carried a distressing report of a fire in the Closer Settlement area at Bamawm, when Mr William Clohesy lost his home and all of its contents. Children, playing with matches in their father's absence, were thought to have caused the fire. Mr Clohesy had been very unfortunate, having recently become the sole carer for his eight children, due to the death of his wife, Margaret.

Weather-wise, on-going dry conditions eased and, on 2 June, the Bendigo Independent carried news from its Piavella correspondent of "fine rains" having fallen there, with a total of about 125 points [30 mms] recorded since 29 May. More local news, and more about the train, next time.

Aerial survey in Rochester, Lockington and Elmore

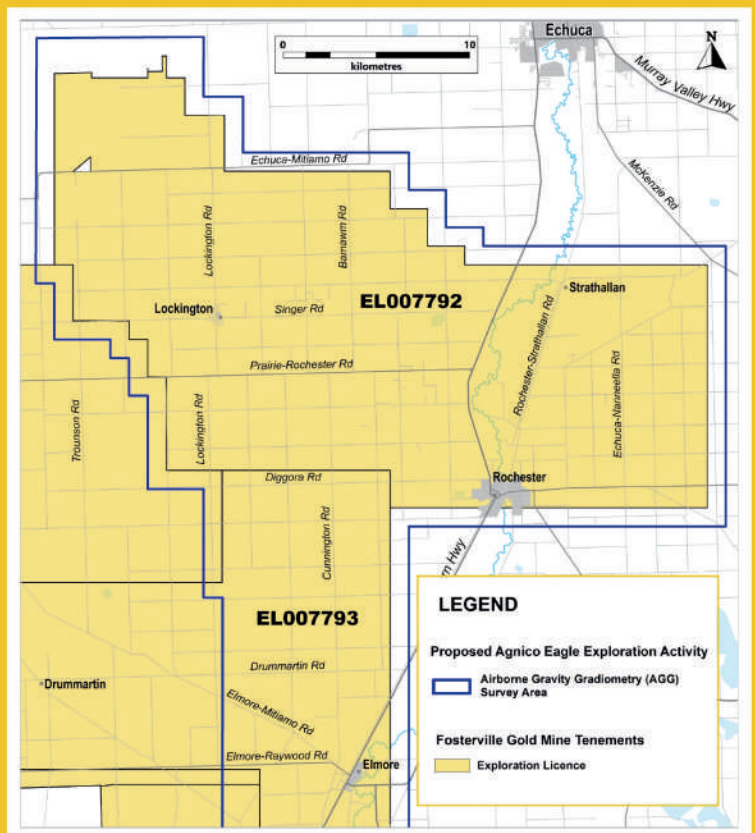
FGM will undertake an Airborne Gravity Gradiometry Survey (AGG) over newly granted exploration licences EL07792, EL007793, EL007794 and part of EL007795, in April 2026.



The survey will be completed using a fixed wing aircraft flying at a height of between 80 and 150 metres. The survey measures extremely small natural variations in the Earth's gravity field.

- The gravity instruments are passive and do not emit any signals.
- The aircraft will fly in an east-west direction across 200m intervals, at speeds of up to 220km/h.
- Flying will only occur during favourable weather conditions.

This community notification is being provided to ensure transparency and minimise disruption.



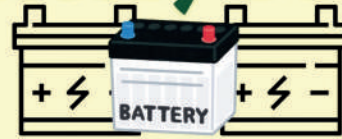
