PROUD DAY FOR THE MITCHELLS

The grandchildren, from three separate families (sibling parents Corey Mitchell, Dean Mitchell and Kristy Nihill) came together when Lockington Bamawm United clashed with Mount Pleasant at Lockington on 26 April.

Jaxson Nihill (Mounts) competed against cousins Cooper and Nicholas Mitchell (LBU) in the Seniors Football.

Emily Mitchell played A Reserve Netball for LBU and Madalyn Nihill competed in B Grade Netball for Mounts.

Tarli Nihill (Mounts) played cousin Keira Mitchell (LBU) in U17 Netball while Heidi Mitchell (LBU) took on Ayla Nihill (U13 Netball).

"It was pretty special," Lyn Mitchell said, admitting that she kept her allegiances on the day entirely neutral.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We've reached the end of May 1913, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how our local communities were faring.

The Bill authorising construction of the railway from Cohuna to Elmore had been passed in December 1912, but five months had passed and work on the line had not yet begun. The Railways Standing Committee had recommended connection with the main Bendigo-Echuca line at Elmore, as long-sought by the Cohuna, Gunbower, Elmore, Kamarooka, Tennyson and Elmore Railway Leagues, with a slight deviation to the east to serve the needs of the new settlers at the Bamawm irrigation settlement.

These settlers supported an alternative proposal for a railway line from Cohuna to join the main line at Rochester, and even after the Bill was passed, they continued to campaign. Both routes had been thoroughly investigated when deputations representing supporters of both proposals had approached the Minister for Railways, and petitions had been lodged in support of each. After due consideration, the Minister Mr A A Billson, announced on 25 April 1913, that construction of the line would proceed in accordance with the Bill which was passed in December 1912. He said that, though delay had been caused by the various proposals for deviations, none of them could be entertained.

On 28 May 1913, the Geelong Advertiser stated that formalities connected with the survey of the Elmore-Cohuna route were in hand and construction work would begin immediately these were completed.

Equally encouraging news appeared in the Age (Melbourne) on 30 May, in an item relayed from Rochester, stating that a wagon laden with surveying instruments, etc., was dispatched on 24 May to Tennyson. There a start would be made to survey the Cohuna-Elmore railway, the project having "been delayed for years by the war of routes." Despite these reports, hopes of an early commencement were set back once again by an item in the Elmore Standard on 7 June 1913.

It read: - "The following letter has been received by a district resident, who, in view of the widespread interest taken in the proposed railway line from Elmore to Cohuna, serving part of the Bamawm Estate and Tennyson, has made inquiries at headquarters.

The letter reads:— 'Victorian Railways, Melbourne, 4th June, 1913,—Sir,—With reference to your letter of 14th May, inquiring when the construction of the Elmore to Cohuna railway is likely to be started, and what deviation, if any, will be followed in the route towards Bamawm, I am directed by the Minister for Railways to inform you that the completion of the permanent survey from Elmore to Cohuna is now in hand.

Before construction work can be started a construction trust will have to be formed to provide for acquiring the necessary land. The shortest time in which this can be done is four months from date. The route, which will be followed passing Bamawm settlement is that recommended by the Railways Standing Committee. —Yours, etc., J. B. Paterson, Secretary to the Minister."

Still four months to wait!

Another matter of local railway-related concern came to the fore on 7 June 1913, when the Melbourne Argus reported on a meeting of representatives of the northern railway leagues, convened by the Rochester Traders' Association, and held at Rochester on 5 June. On behalf of the Rushworth League and others working with it, Councillor Brice explained the advantages of a cross-country line from Rushworth to Rochester via Stanhope, illustrating his talk with the aid of a map of the district and the proposed routes.

He said that the line would be the main one from the north to Melbourne, as it would be shorter than the existing lines and would serve a significant closer settlement area. It would ultimately be the main line to Sydney. Rochester representatives concurred, but said that they would like the line extended to Bamawm. A further meeting was held on 15 June, at which it was stated that, on 18 June, a deputation would wait on the Minister for Railways in support of a junction with existing lines at Byrneside, and that the claims of the Rushworth-Bamawm line would be laid before the Minister at the same time.

Meanwhile, across the district, there was some sad news to report. The local community suffered the loss of several well-known former residents in June 1913. On 14 June, the Elmore Standard reported the death on the 11th of Mrs Eliza Wilson, relict of the late Mr Andrew Wilson, of Milloo. Mrs Wilson died at Bendigo and her funeral took place at Pine Grove on 12 June.

On 26 June, the Bendigo Advertiser reported the death, at Hampton, Victoria, of Mrs Annie Raper. Then aged 75 years, she had come to Victoria, from the North of Ireland when but a girl. She married Mr Charles Joseph Raper, of Pannoomiloo, and resided in that district for about 25 years. She was the mother of Mrs Elizabeth Ham, Mrs Ellen Stanley, and Messrs Charles and Alfred Raper.

On 30 June, the Bendigo Independent reported the death on 27 June, of Mrs Adelaide Haines of Diggora, who was aged just 58 years. Mrs Haines was survived by her husband, Thomas, and their five sons and six daughters [Robert, Richard, Elizabeth, Maria, David, Lewis, Adelaide, Victoria, Christina, Florence and Percy].

LOCKINGTON CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL NEWS



Lockington Consolidated School's annual Fun Run saw students from all year levels participate.

The event was held on the school grounds and students had trained in the lead up as part of their weekly Physical Education sessions.

Students ran, jogged or walked distances related to their age group, commencing with the seniors who covered 3 kilometres and culminating with the Preps who took on a 1 kilometre course with the help of their Year 6 buddies.

Students and a large contingent of parents, grandparents and friends cheered on the competitors and participants were rewarded with an ice cold Zooper-Dooper at the finishing line.

The event was a prelude to the Campaspe Schools Cross Country event at Moama where Locky's top competitors aged 10 and above strive to progress to Zone Championships later in the year.

The Fun Run is an important annual fundraiser for Lockington Consolidated School's Physical Education Department, enabling the purchase of new equipment.

CONTAINER DEPOSIT SCHEME

In the absence of a dedicated facility in our town, Lockington locals are being encouraged to support the Container Deposit Scheme collection service in Rochester.

Rochester Lions Club has stepped in to operate the facility following the closure of the town's previous collection point.

The service reopened at the Lions yard on Baynes Street (cnr Stephen st), where volunteers are now assisting locals with returning bottles and cans for recycling.

Volunteers include Lions members and several local Work Experience students. The funds raised go directly back into community programs and local support initiatives.

Since opening, the new site has seen a strong response. Volunteers hope participation will continue to grow as more people learn about the depot.

Rochester Lions Club also expects to expand over time, with plans to increase the number of collection bins processed each week as demand rises.

The depot operates six days a week and refunds are provided through cash payments, direct bank deposits, or donations back to the club.

Victoria's CDS offers a 10 cent refund for every eligible drink container returned. Most aluminium, glass, plastic, and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3 litres are accepted.

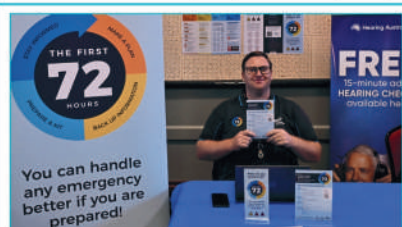
Works notice
