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## LCS FAREWELLS LONG SERVING TEACHER

Lockington Consolidated School is celebrating the remarkable career of one of its longest-serving and most respected educators, with the retirement of Robyn Angove after 41 years in the teaching profession.

Robyn's teaching journey has taken her to several schools across Victoria, including Melton Primary School, Echuca East Primary School, Cornelia Creek Primary School and Melton South Primary School.

However, it has been her many years at Lockington Consolidated School where she has truly left an enduring mark, dedicating the majority of her career to educating and supporting generations of local students.

Over four decades, Robyn has touched the lives of countless children through her passion for teaching, her unwavering commitment to student learning and her genuine care for every child who entered her classroom.

Her influence has extended well beyond academic achievement, helping to shape confident, capable young people while fostering a love of learning and a strong sense of belonging within the school community.

Such has been the length and impact of Robyn's career that many of the students she taught in her early years have now returned as parents, entrusting their own children to the same school where they once learnt under her guidance.

This unique connection is a testament to the lasting relationships she has built and the respect she has earned throughout the Lockington community.

Colleagues describe Robyn as a dedicated professional whose kindness, knowledge and willingness to support others have made her an invaluable member of the staff.

Her calm approach, wealth of experience and commitment to ensuring every student could achieve success have been hallmarks of her career.

Following a period of leave, Robyn has made the decision to officially retire from her ongoing teaching role.

While she is stepping away from permanent classroom teaching, the school is delighted that she will remain a familiar face, returning from time to time as a Casual Replacement Teacher.

Lockington Consolidated School extends its sincere thanks to Robyn for her outstanding service to education and for the immeasurable contribution she has made to the lives of students, families and colleagues over the past 41 years.

Her legacy will continue to be felt for many years to come.

We held a celebratory morning tea for Robyn in the last week of term to thank her and mark this important occasion.

## LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

**We have reached September 1913, as we look back at the early newspapers to read what was happening in our local farming communities.**

The Bill to provide for the construction of the railway from Cohuna to Elmore had been passed in December 1912, and with almost eight months having passed, work on the line had not begun.

Progress had been stalled by what the print media had christened "the war of the routes," but on 25 April, the Minister for Railways, Mr A A Billson, stated that construction of the Cohuna-Elmore railway line would go ahead as recommended by the Railways Standing Committee.

By 11 August 1913, as published in The Age (Melbourne) the permanent survey was completed, and loads of sleepers were arriving at the Elmore Railway Station.

On 5 September 1913, in reporting on correspondence received at the monthly meeting of the Rochester Shire Council, the Bendigo Independent stated that a letter had been received from the Railways Department concerning the deputation that had waited on the Minister on 9 July.

The deputation had urged that the Elmore-Cohuna railway be constructed along the original route recommended by the Railways Standing Committee, and that a railway station be located near Tennyson MIA Hall corner, and the Minister had promised that he would look into the matter.

The letter now received stated that the Minister had since found that he was unable to make any alteration to the position of any station as fixed by the Railways Standing Committee.

While this was disappointing for the people of Tennyson and the surrounding district, it had to be accepted.

Luckily, the friendly relations that existed on the local sporting scene seem to have weathered the strain caused by the railway fracas. Gun clubs continued to flourish, with the Warragamba club in particular having a good following.

At Milloo, local Tennis Club members, Mr William Gladman and Mr Horace Forsyth, caught the attention of Melbourne's Herald, which carried a report on 3 October 1913, of their "War Against Sparrows," using rackets as weapons.

It read: - "In the evening the two friends, carrying lamps and rackets, walk along the hedgerows, one on either side. As the birds flutter from cover, the hunters volley right and left with deadly precision. It is not unusual for several hundreds of birds to be killed in a night. Occasionally starlings are among the slain.

The farmers benefit as the result of this novel tennis practice, for sparrows take toll of the wheat when it is ripening, and the wielders of the rackets gain skill — they are players above the average ... Messrs. Gladman and Forsyth are evidently the pioneers of the tennis racket method of dealing with sparrows."

Though local friction had played a part, there were other reasons for the delay in commencing construction of the Cohuna-Elmore railway line, principal among them being finance. Fortunately, that particular hurdle was eliminated when, on 27 September 1913, the Elmore Standard published the welcome news that the Premier had been able to float a £2,000,000 State loan on the London market.

The Elmore to Cohuna line, of 57½ miles, was estimated to cost £204,000, and was the longest of eleven new railway lines to be built. On 13 September, the Elmore Standard had reported that several thousand sleepers for the new line were already in hand and stacked in the Elmore railway station yard.

It was intended that the rails would connect with the main Bendigo-Echuca line at about the centre of the railway station platform and would leave the station yard at the north end, cutting off a portion of the local tennis court. The work of plate-laying for the new railway line was expected to be "in full swing by Christmas."

A good fall of rain in mid-September had been appreciated by farming communities across the region. Milk production was on the increase, and grass and crops looked promising. Fruit trees planted by new settlers were doing well, and the Melbourne Age, on 25 September 1913, reported that residents of Bamawm and Rochester were once again asking that the Government should assist them by establishing a canning factory at Rochester.

Mr Elwood Mead, the chairman of the Water Supply Commission, suggested that, with a government allowance to help introduce such work, the co-operative butter factory at Rochester might take up canning. Mr Graham, the Minister for Agriculture, promised to consider the request. Subsequently, both Mr Mead and Mr Graham visited the settlement at Bamawm and, as reported by the Bendigo Independent on 7 October, and again on 6 December, both commented on the marvellous progress that had been made there during 1913, with Mr Mead predicting "a prosperous future for the orchardists."

The region's 'dry' farmers were also doing well. It seemed that summer had come early when a top temperature of 93° fahrenheit [33.9° celcius] was experienced locally on 10 October 1913. The Bendigo Advertiser on 13 October, had reported that, though there was an abundance of natural fodder, the native grasses had begun to dry off and crops were showing ill effects.

However, a good fall of rain in the Rochester district in the following week, as reported by Melbourne's Argus on 16 October, practically assured a good harvest. There were "some splendid crops at Restdown, Tennyson and Diggora."

## **Exciting Improvements Coming to your Bush Nursing Centre.**

The Lockington & District Bush Nursing Centre is pleased to announce we have been awarded funding through the Victorian Government's Regional Health Infrastructure Fund (RHIF). The successful grant application will allow us to undertake a significant refurbishment of our Centre.

Over the coming weeks you will notice plenty of activity around the Centre as renovations get underway. While these works will cause some disruption, every effort will be made to ensure there is minimal impact on our services and patient care.

### **The refurbishment will include:**

- Replacement of the ageing and damaged flooring throughout the building
- Construction of a dedicated acute emergency treatment room with direct ambulance access, a new emergency trolley/ bed, and additional clinic space to better respond to the growing healthcare needs of our community.
- Installation of much needed storage solutions within our existing clinic room.
- Refurbishment of our waiting room and patient bathroom to provide a more welcoming and comfortable environment.

To enable these works, our main treatment room will be temporarily relocated to the doctors consulting room. We anticipate the renovations will take approximately four weeks to complete.

We understand that building works can be inconvenient and sometimes require us to make temporary changes to how and where we provide your care. We sincerely thank our community for your patience and understanding during this time. Our highest priority remains delivering safe, timely and compassionate care and we will do everything possible to ensure these renovations do not affect the quality of the services we provide.

If you experience changes to your appointment location or the way we deliver you care, we appreciate your flexibility while we complete these important improvements.

We are excited about what these upgrades will mean for our community and look forward to welcoming you into an improved Bush Nursing Centre very Soon.

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## KOTTA HALL CENTENARY PLANS

**An updated time capsule and Community Fun Run will be among the highlights of a three-day celebration to mark the Kotta Hall Centenary.**

The Kotta Hall Committee is putting together an extensive program of events to mark the historic occasion on 9, 10 and 11 October this year.

The festivities will commence with a Bush Dance and barbecue on Friday night.

Saturday's planned activities include a performance by comedian Monica Dullard, time capsule burial and a plaque unveiling. It is hoped to also involve The Locky Ukers.

On Sunday morning, a Fun Run/Walk will commence at 10am from the north end of Lockington Consolidated School and travel approximately seven kilometres to the Kotta Railway Station. A shorter course for primary school-aged competitors will leave at 11.30am.

An extensive montage of photographs documenting the history of the hall and the Kotta district is currently being collated and will be available for viewing across all three days.

Community Bank Elmore, Lockington and Rochester has also provided a \$2500 funding grant to print a Kotta History Book which is being collated and written by David Hammond and it is hoped the publication will be completed in time for the Centenary celebration.

The late Dick Worboys had undertaken extensive research with a view to documenting the Kotta region's beginnings in a book but sadly passed away before he was able to finish the project.

### LOCKINGTON MURAL COMP SET TO RETURN IN 2026

A Mural Competition is returning to Lockington after a five-year hiatus.



Lockington Neighbourhood House will co-ordinate the competition on behalf of Lockington District Business Centre which will provide \$1000 for the winning entry and \$500 for the runner-up.

The most recent Lockington Mural Competition was held in 2021 and the entries, which are located within the Lockington Pump Track community precinct, have degraded as a result of age and inevitable weathering.

The Business Centre Committee of Management is keen to replace the 2.5m x 1.5m murals with new paintings to reinvigorate the townscape and is calling on artists to be a part of this year's project.

"We would particularly love to see some local artists involved but will warmly welcome anyone who would like to help brighten our town," Business Centre COM President Jennie Keele said.

"The Mural Competition created plenty of interest when it was held five years ago.

"We hope that the recent mural completed by Jimmy Dvate on the Business Centre building might inspire some of our most creative residents to put their hand up for this year's project," she added.

There is an opportunity for six artists to participate in the 2026 Mural Competition, which will be held over four days from 10 to 13 September at the Lockington Community Centre.

The Business Centre will provide backing boards and paints and the competition is open to all ages.

Billy captivated the judges with his speech about Alice Springs, while Davey's speech about Lewis Hamilton showcased his confidence, creativity and speaking ability.

Both now progress to the next stage of the competition, where they will represent Lockington Consolidated School against winners from other Lions Club districts at Rochester on 19 July.

### JEWELLERY WORKSHOP

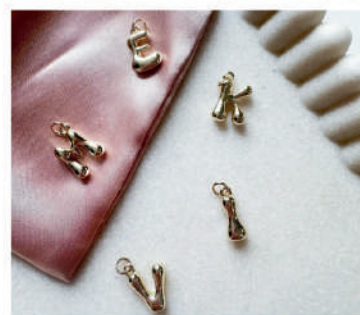
**Knots N Cotton Co will host a Jewellery Making Workshop at Lockington Neighbourhood House on Sunday, 2 August from 1pm.**

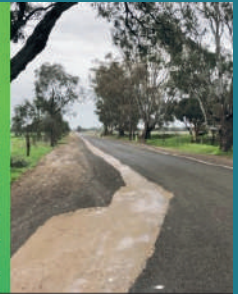
