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AIR-CONDITIONING UPGRADE FOR LOCKINGTON COMMUNITY CENTRE

The Lockington Community Centre will soon be more comfortable, energy efficient and easier to maintain.

The exciting news comes thanks to a \$62,000 heating and cooling upgrade supported by Campaspe Shire Council and the Lockington Community Centre Committee of Management.

The project will replace the centre's ageing evaporative cooling units, which have become increasingly inefficient, costly to maintain and unable to provide reliable comfort during both summer and winter.

As part of the upgrade, four new 10kW under-ceiling split system air conditioning units will be installed, providing efficient heating and cooling throughout the facility.

Existing outdoor units will also be relocated to the roof, improving safety and making future maintenance easier.

The Lockington Community Centre Committee has committed \$15,000 towards the project, with Campaspe Shire Council funding the remaining costs.

Campaspe Shire Mayor Cr Daniel Mackrell said the upgrade would help ensure the community centre remains a welcoming and functional space for years to come.

"The Lockington Community Centre is a valuable community asset that hosts a wide range of events, activities and gatherings throughout the year.

"This upgrade will provide reliable year-round comfort for users while also improving the building's energy efficiency and reducing ongoing maintenance requirements." Cr Mackrell said.

The improvements will deliver better air circulation, more consistent temperatures and a more sustainable heating and cooling system, supporting the community's wellbeing and ensuring the centre remains an accessible and comfortable venue for local groups and visitors alike.

Works are expected to commence following the completion of procurement and contractor arrangements and will be completed within the 2026/27 financial year.

**PLUMBER'S SHED
GETS A FACELIFT**

You may have noticed some temporary fencing and a hive of activity at the Locky Plumber's Shed recently.

The outdoor area at the rear of the shed has also been renovated to provide a lovely outdoor seating area overlooking the community garden.

The work included a new ramp which ensures safe and comfortable access to the building for all, and particularly those with mobility issues.

Sincere thanks to Ged Giddings and his offsider Harry (pictured) who led the project and ensured the work was completed to the highest possible standard.

Lockington Neighbourhood House's Monday Morning Casual Art Group, Youth Action Group and Community Garden volunteers are regular Plumber's Shed users.

The building also hosts Cuppa Connection on the second Thursday of each month, an important social project for the Lockington community as well as meetings, activities and events for a host of organisations throughout the year.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached January 1914, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn what was happening to our local farming communities at that time.

The construction of the Elmore-Cohuna railway line continued to be delayed, according to a report in the Rochester Express on 6 January. In this instance, the delay was due to "the tardiness of the Shire of Gordon" in completing its part in the formalities required for the Shire of Rochester to be constituted as a trust.

On 17 January, the Elmore Standard carried a report of a sad drowning fatality that had occurred two days earlier at Restdown. Eleven-year-old James Godfrey, and his friend John Reidy, were swimming in a lagoon about 3 feet deep, when James apparently slipped into deeper water and fell into difficulty.

His sister Mary, aged 16, was standing on the bank nearby and, though fully clothed, jumped into the water in an effort to save her brother. She got into difficulties too, and both sank, despite John Reidy's efforts to assist them.

John Reidy ran to the Godfrey family home but there was no-one there to help him, and he ran a further mile to the home of Messrs. Patrick and Michael Green. Patrick Green contacted Dr Sanderson and Constables Reidy and Downe, and all five men hurried to the lagoon.

Both bodies were recovered from the water, but endeavours to resuscitate the brother and sister were unsuccessful. The two were children of Mr and Mrs Con Godfrey, who had lived in Diggora for many years before moving to Restdown. To quote the Standard, the tragedy "cast a gloom over the whole district."

In the meantime, it wasn't just the construction of the railway line that appeared to have stalled.

According to the Rochester Express on 23 January 1914, the residents of Tennyson and Pine Grove, had been promised by the Water Commission that, if they undertook to take 100 acre-feet of water, for which they would pay the sum £25 annually, they would be brought within the irrigation area.

Land for the three or four miles of channelling required had been surveyed some months earlier, but nothing further had been done.

A rumour that the proposed channels had been abandoned, was now causing anxiety among the residents involved. Coincidentally, while not supplying an answer to any of the local water worries, water was flowing freely at Tennyson that week, according to a report in the Echuca and Moama Advertiser and Farmer's Gazette on 17 January 1914.

A breach – attributed to damage caused by yabbies – had occurred in the main channel near Mr S Windridge's farm, causing a gap of about a chain in extent. The flow escaped into the Picaninny Creek until repairs were carried out some days later.

The summer of 1913-14 was hot and dry, with a tornado-like storm having occurred over Tennyson and Diggora in the week prior to New Year. Yet another severe storm occurred at Diggora West in mid-January. Writing to the Elmore Standard on 24 January 1914, the local correspondent stated that the storm broke with extreme force.

Vivid flashes of lightning were accompanied by heavy claps of thunder, and the wind roared with great violence. Trees were struck and shattered by lightning, and a valuable draught colt, owned by Mr W Cochrane, was killed.

Unfortunately, the storm brought little rain. Correspondence from Wanurp to the Rochester Express on 17 February 1914, stated that water there had become scarce. Most of the dams were dry, and many people were resorting to wells to water their stock.

This news was echoed a week later in a statement from a veteran farmer from Diggora: - "We badly need three inches of rain!" He followed this with his hopes, inspired by recent news of heavy rain having fallen in Western Australia, that a change should soon be experienced throughout the district for "'tis a long summer that has no ending."

Local roads were also causing some concern. The Wanurp correspondent reported that culverts, especially old ones, had been badly broken up, and were not safe to cross.

It was suggested that they be replaced with open crossings, which could be made of swamp cement, and would be much safer than culverts with broken planks.

Roads had also been on the agenda at the most recent meeting of the Shire of Rochester, as reported by the Express on 30 January 1914. Mr Chaplin, the Shire Engineer, sought to consult with representatives of the South-west Riding concerning a main road to Echuca.

Cr M'Intyre said that, as Tennyson residents would soon have a railway, they would not want to be taxed for a main road as well. Cr Martin was also against proclaiming a main road to Echuca.

He considered the ground on which the road then existed was too low, and the road would be expensive to maintain. Cr M'Intyre suggested that only those roads leading to railway stations should be counted main roads.

Perhaps there will be good news concerning the train next time.

MURAL COMPETITION NEXT WEEK

Lockington District Business Centre and Lockington Neighbourhood House are proud to present the 2026 Lockington Mural Competition.

The event will take place over four days, from Friday 10 September to Sunday 13 September at Lockington Community Centre.

Six country Victorian artists will compete for the first prize cheque of \$1000; the runner-up will receive \$5000 thanks to Lockington Business Centre.

This year's theme is "Rural Life". The participants are:-

Ruby Wyatt-Carter (Mural Title – Murray Wildlife)

Ruby is a young mixed media artist and musician based in Northern Victoria. They explore the arts and express themselves in a number of different ways. Ruby has delivered large scale arts programs across Victoria after receiving Midsummer's Regional Activation Program grants in 2024 and 2025.

Grace Murphy (Mural Title - Land of the Locals)

Grace is a 24-year-old artist from Nanneella who completed her tertiary education at the Victorian College of the Arts, studying a Bachelor of Fine Arts majoring in painting. She has already had a number of solo shows and has chosen a design that prompts her audience to reflect on the beauty of the mundane and familiar.

Olivia & Sophie Hurley (Mural Title - Luminesense)

Thirteen-year-old Lockington twins Olivia and Sophie Hurley are this year's youngest competitors. Their interest in art was nurtured at Primary School by teacher Kathy Connors. They jump at every opportunity to explore their creativity and improve their skills.

Abby Smith (Mural Title - Legacy of the Land)

Abby is a realist artist whose work is centred around highly detailed sketches of animals, architecture and portraiture.

Drawing inspiration from rural Australia, her artwork reflects a deep appreciation for the people, places and landscapes that have shaped her life while being raised on a farming property near Cohuna.

Greta Zegelin (Mural Title - Summer Rain)

Greta lives at Nanneella and her mural design paints a picture of hope for the farming community. She grew up on a dairy farm and has spent most of her life in a small dairy farming community. She is particularly taken by the wildlife that co-exists alongside farms and farmers.

Steve & Carole Monk (Mural Title - It Never Rains But It Pours)

Steve is a Bendigo-based artist who studied Art Education at Melbourne College of Advanced Education. He has been dabbling in art for many years and tried his hand at most forms and styles of painting. He has been a sculptor, mosaic artist and occasional mural artist.

A panel of three judges will assess the Mural Competition entries upon completion to determine the overall winners.

Each of the entries will then be placed in the Lockington Pump Track precinct and displayed for the public to enjoy at the conclusion of the competition.

Locals and visitors are warmly invited to pop in during the event to chat to the artists and watch the works as they evolve.

Lockington Community Centre will be open from 9am to 5pm on each day.

In his spare time local Bamawn farmer Jeremy Rorke grows walnuts which are processed into Vitality Walnut Pour, Australia's first locally grown and produced long-life walnut milk.

Growth in alternative dairy products has increased dramatically in recent years, as has the consumption of nuts.

It's great to see a local business embarking on a new and exciting venture and another locally grown product.

The processing of the walnuts currently takes place in NSW and the business will outgrow this site in the next few years.

As a result, the business is keen to consider alternative sites for processing and Rochester is well positioned in relation to many of the walnut growers.

The processing factory requires around 5,000m² and whilst the old MG site is well located, it would only work if there were other parties interested in co-location.

COLIBAN SEEKS PRICING INPUT

Coliban Water customers and stakeholders across North Central Victoria are invited to help shape the region's water future as planning begins for the organisation's 2028-33 Price Submission.

The Price Submission is developed every five years and sets out the services, investments, outcomes, and prices Coliban Water proposes for the next regulatory period.

It will be submitted to Victoria's independent economic regulator, the Essential Services Commission, which reviews water corporation plans to ensure they are justified, fair, and shaped by customer priorities.

Spokesman Damian Wells said customer feedback would be central to the development of Coliban Water's plans for 2028 to 2033.

"Almost 180,000 customers in 49 communities rely on us to provide safe drinking water, recycled water, rural water, and sewage services that support public health, the environment and regional prosperity," Wells said.

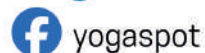

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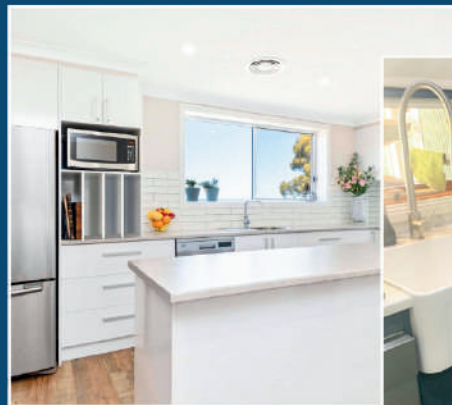
