THREE CHEERS FOR COL AT THE COMMONWEALTH GAMES

Congratulations to Lockington's favourite local para athlete Col Pearse who once again shone brightly in the pool at the 2026 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow.

Defending the title he won four years earlier in Birmingham, Col finished the narrowest of seconds behind fellow Australian Alex Saffy to claim the Silver Medal in the Men's 100 metre Butterfly S10 Final.

Col had qualified second fastest for the final with a time of 58.68 when runner-up in his heat swim behind Canadian Fernando Lu.

He was part of the most successful Australian Swimming Team in Commonwealth Games history - the Dolphins closed out Glasgow 2026 with 76 medals - 37 gold, 16 silver and 23 bronze.

More than 200 athletes competed across 10 sports for Team Australia at the Glasgow Games; the 11-day event involved athletes from 74 nations and territories.



LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached November 1913, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn what was happening in our local farming communities.

Due to what the print media had called "the war of the routes," construction of the Cohuna to Elmore railway line had not begun, even though the Bill to provide for it had been passed in December 1912.

Since the 1870s, there had been a campaign for the provision of a railway service to and through the district, with the intention that a new line from the northern plains be connected to the main Bendigo-Echuca line at Elmore.

However, since the introduction of Closer Settlement in Bamawm in 1910-11, the original proposal had been challenged by the new settlers, who believed they had been promised a line through Bamawm, to connect Cohuna to the main line at Rochester.

The Construction Bill, as passed in December 1912, followed the recommendation of the Railways Standing Committee – The line would follow a route from Cohuna to Elmore as originally proposed, but would allow a slight deviation to the east to meet the transport needs of the new settlers at Bamawm.

The passage of the Bill led to protests, and calls for reconsideration, but the Minister's final decision, announced on 25 April 1913, was to proceed in accordance with the Standing Committee's recommendation. Since that date, financial problems, and the formalities involved in setting up an Elmore-Cohuna Railway Construction Trust, had caused further delays but, as the end of 1913 approached, it seemed that construction could begin soon.

Whilst the railway matters were capturing most attention across the district, harvest time was near and, in our part of the State where drought conditions were all too frequent, the season had been a comparatively satisfactory one. A Weekly Times reporter visited the northern district in November 1913 and provided a glowing description of its crops in the paper's edition of 15 November.

On 22 November, the Bendigo Advertiser reported that harvesting in the Rochester district had started under favourable weather auspices, "although the wind shook a lot of grain out of the early ripening crops" earlier that week. While special mention was made of settler Eddie Chappel's 60 acres of the much-praised Yandilla King wheat, some big returns were promised from the fine wheat paddocks of Diggora, Tennyson, and Pannoomilloo.

On 28 November 1913, as reported by the Melbourne Argus on 1 December, at a conference of representatives from the various shires interested in the Elmore-Cohuna railway line, it was resolved to delegate to the Rochester Shire Council the power to form a Railway Construction Trust, and purchase the necessary land along the route.

The greater part of the land required was in the shire of Rochester, and by this delegation of authority, it was expected that the work of the Trust would be facilitated. As soon as the chief engineer could acquaint the Trust as to the land required, steps would be taken to purchase same.

On 4 December, the Bendigo Independent carried a report that, in the Legislative Council on the previous day, the Minister for Railways had told Mr Henry Angus, Member for Gunbower that the order-in-council notifying the proposal to constitute the Railway Construction Trust for the proposed Elmore to Cohuna railway was made on 26 November.

In accordance with common practice, this was allowed to lie for a month. If no objections were received the Trust would be constituted on 15 January 1914. The construction of the Elmore-Cohuna line would then proceed as early as possible.

On 13 December, a brief item in the Elmore Standard gave promise that all formalities had been dealt with – It told of "a proclamation by His Excellency the Honourable Sir John Madden, Victoria's Chief Justice, constituting certain lands a railway construction district under the name of the Elmore to Cohuna Railway Construction District."

With splendid harvest weather, it was expected that for most farmers, harvesting would be completed by Christmas. Rust had played havoc in some parts of the State, but had not caused any problems in this region. It was said that, at Pine Grove, at no period of the district's history had the crops looked so well, and there were high expectations at Diggora West, according to a report published in the Elmore Standard on 13 December 1913.

The local correspondent remarked that it was a great pity that the proposed railway line from Elmore to Cohuna was not completed, as farmers had thought that the previous year's harvest was the last that they would have to cart into Elmore or Rochester by road.

It was said that some of the fine flow of wheat being carted to Strathallan station was coming from as far away as Milloo. So, the season had been an excellent one for the grain growers, and also promised well for graziers. Sheep and lambs, where available, were bringing tip-top prices and hides and skins were selling at the highest rates known for years.

AGRICULTURE SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

The Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority is promoting a fantastic opportunity for young people in Victoria's agricultural sector.

The Young Farmers Upskill and Invest Program is now open — offering scholarships of up to \$10,000 to support the next generation of farmers to build skills, strengthen their businesses, and grow their careers.

Each scholarship includes up to \$5000 for training or study (upskill activity) and up to \$5000 to invest in applying those skills on-farm or professionally (invest activity).

From business planning and financial literacy to climate adaptation, technical skills and farm safety — applicants can tailor their learning to suit their goals.

These scholarships are designed to support practical, career-focused learning; help young farmers apply new skills directly on-farm; and build resilience, innovation and leadership across Victoria's agriculture sector.

Approximately 12–14 scholarships will be awarded this round to applicants aged 18 to 45 who live in Victoria, are working at least 3 days per week on a farm, have a minimum of 2 years' on-farm experience and are Australian citizens or permanent residents.

Applications close at 5pm on Friday 14 August 2026.

LOCKY UKERS ROCK BLUES FESTIVAL

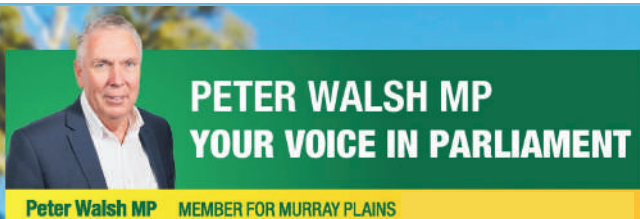
The Locky Ukers had a fabulous time playing at the Echuca-Moama Winter Blues Festival on 25 July.

Every five years, the Australian Bureau of Statistics counts every person and household in Australia.

This is called the Census of Population and Housing. Census night is Tuesday 11 August 2026.

You can complete your Census form as soon as you receive your instructions, if you know where you'll be on Census night.

The Census form asks questions about your age, country of birth, cultural background, living situation, work and education.

In the Census, every answer matters to help us understand what Australia needs now and into the future.

Census data is used to inform decisions about transport, schools, health care, infrastructure and business. It also helps plan local services for individuals, families and communities.

The Census is compulsory under the Census and Statistics Act 1905.

Everyone in Australia on Census night must be included on a Census form.

NH VIC KEEP OUR DOORS OPEN CAMPAIGN

After unsuccessfully lobbying for increased funding in the 2026/27 budget, Neighbourhood Houses Victoria is seeking public support in the lead up to the 2026 State Election.

NH Vic has developed an online petition, calling for a 25 percent increase in funding for the State's Neighbourhood and Community Houses, half of which are currently running at a loss.

The sector's funding, which is delivered via the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing, is 20 percent lower in real terms than it was in 2010. And the indexed funding increase scheduled for the new financial year will not cover the recent 4.6 percent wage increase applied by Fair Work Australia. To sign the petition, visit :-

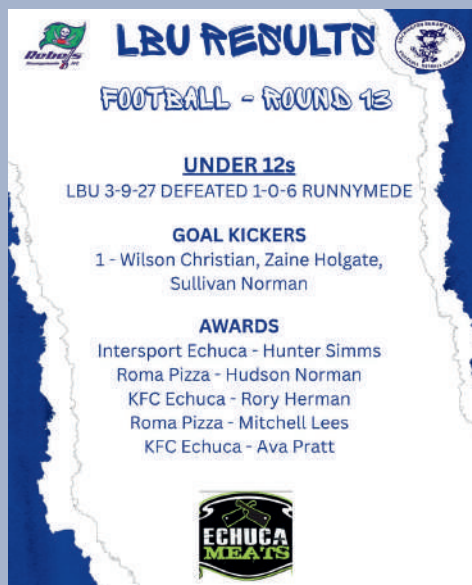

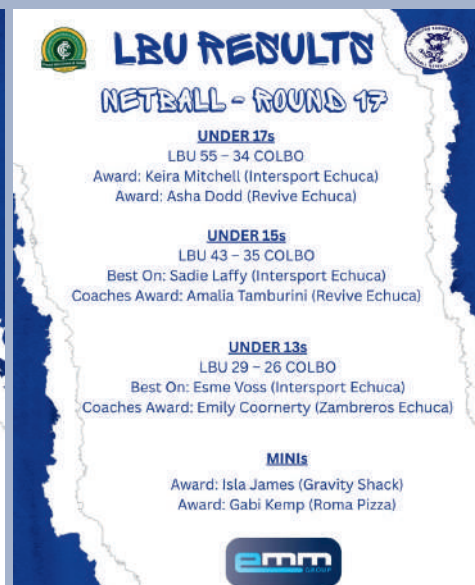
