RAGNAR COMES HOME TO OUR PUB WITH A VERY SPECIAL STORY

A meaningful artwork gifted to Lockington Community Hotel is opening up important conversations about mental health and wellbeing.

Manager Linda Neville said the striking portrait depicting local actor Travis Fimmel in one of his most famous roles had come with a moving backstory.

"I still get goosebumps thinking about it; it makes me quite emotional," Linda said, recalling the events that led to a recent visit from Tasmanian charcoal artist Jodi.

"We were so proud to be given the portrait which has been a real talking point with our patrons since we found its perfect home on the hotel wall," she said.

"I can see that it's going to create a ripple effect for weeks and months to come and that's an amazing legacy we've inherited."

In Jodi's own words, the project was born out of grief, resilience and an unwavering belief in betting on oneself.

"It was created by a charcoal artist, bar attendant and mother navigating a heavy loss; the piece carries a special soul," she explained.

"My best mate, my favourite human 'Woody' - who always believed in my art and championed every bet I placed on myself - took his own life in November 2025.

"Where stress and grief usually paralyze my hands and lock my creativity, this portrait did the opposite."

Jodi was a huge fan of the television series Vikings and had always wanted to draw lead character Ragnar, played by Travis.

She turned that ambition into a tangible project that replaced her deep sense of numbness, feeling lost and a lack of motivation with an excited, challenge-driven mindset.

Not satisfied with her first attempt, she went back to the beginning and developed version two, which was her first venture into mixed media art and became both a channel for healing and a tribute to Woody's unwavering belief.

Jodi subsequently sold many of her belongings and set off on a four-wheel drive pilgrimage to the mainland with her daughter to deliver Ragnar to his spiritual home.

Crossing the Tasman by boat, they headed to Echuca first to sprinkle some of Woody's ashes at the Murray River, a place he had spoken about wanting to visit.

It was then onto Lockington where the pair enjoyed Our Pub's renown hospitality, met some locals, spent the night and made lifelong memories.

"The artwork is a celebration of a unique friendship, eternal gratitude, healing, growth, inner strength, and inspiration," Jodi said.

"May it bring as much magic to the Lockington Hotel as this journey has brought to my heart and soul," she added.

LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again Everyone,

We have reached February 1914, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn what was happening in our local farming communities.

In fact, there was some good news concerning the provision of telephone facilities in the district. On 12 February, the Echuca and Moama Advertiser and Farmers' Gazette reported that the Water Supply Commission was erecting a telephone line from Rochester to Bamawm, with telephone instruments being installed in the water bailiffs' residences.

The line would not be available to the general public, but would fill an essential role, enabling channel breakages and similar incidents to be reported quickly to the Commission's office in Rochester. The Gazette reporter added that, of course, there was "no doubt that urgent messages for doctors, etc., would be transmitted for anyone requiring it."

It was now more than forty years since European settlers first came to this district, and the ranks of our pioneers were thinning. On 25 February 1914, the Bendigo Advertiser carried news of the death on 22 February, of Mr Andrew McNaught, a pioneer settler of Warragamba.

Mr McNaught died on the selection which he had taken up forty years earlier, and to which he had added many acres. He left a widow and grown-up family, who were well known and highly respected in the district.

Shortly afterwards, friends and relatives of the McIntyre family throughout the district were sad to hear of the death, on 1 March 1914, of Mr Thomas McIntyre. Mr McIntyre was the uncle of Mr Ken O'Brien, and the brother of Mrs Elizabeth O'Brien of the Tennyson Store. As reported in the Echuca and Moama Advertiser and Farmers' Gazette on 5 March 1914, Mr McIntyre was 54 years of age, and died in Melbourne.

Yet another sad news item, this time reported in the Rochester Express on 13 March 1914, concerned the adjourned Inquiry into the death of Ernest Brouard at the Pine Grove races on 28 February. The Inquiry was resumed on 9 March at the Echuca courthouse before Mr P. Bartoid, P.M., the coroner.

Benjamin Cox and Charles King, who were both riding in the race at the time of the fatality, were examined. A verdict was returned that Brouard had been accidentally killed through horses trampling on him, and that there was no blame attachable to any person.

There were others lost to small local communities in our district at that time – fortunately without such sad connotations. On 24 February, the Wanurp correspondent wrote to the Rochester Express that Mr J Cant, an old pioneer of 40 years' standing in that district was departing for the Mallee, where he had a considerable holding.

Taking the dry spell into consideration, Mr Cant's clearing sale was just about the best that had been held in the district for some time – a good send-off to an old neighbour.

Then, on 5 March, the Echuca and Moama Advertiser and Farmers' Gazette reported that, after having been nine years resident in Diggara, the Dargan family moved to their new farm at Willow Grove, about six miles north-west of the Bamawm Extension.

Also reported in that particular edition of the Gazette, was the news that the residence of Settler Brady, at Bamawm, was burnt to the ground on 28 February.

More than a year had gone by since the Bill to provide for the construction of the railway from Cohuna to Elmore had been passed, in December 1912. On 21 February 1914, an item appeared in the Weekly Times stating that the trust for acquiring the land had been gazetted. The sum of £55,000, the estimated cost of the line, which would cover a distance of 57½ miles, had been approved by Parliament.

At the end of 30 days from the appointment of the trust, the work of constructing the line would begin, and would be vigorously pushed on. It was hoped it would provide transport for the Bamawm irrigation settlement at an early date.

In the meantime, material and supplies for use in constructing the line were arriving at the Elmore Railway Station. In that same issue of the Weekly Times, an item appeared stating that the people of the Cohuna district were looking forward eagerly to the turning of the first sod in connection with the construction of the line of railway from Elmore to Cohuna.

The same could be said for residents of our district.

P.S. – On 13 October 1913, the following item appeared in the Bendigo Advertiser:-

"Near the main road from Bamawm to Rochester a rather peculiar sight is to be seen in the shape of a large wooden tower built near a big gum tree. The tower, which is nearly 60ft. in height, is of a square shape, and is made of big gum tree logs, roughly cut and laid crosswise on each other, until the required height was reached.

The purpose for which the tower was originally built seems to be a puzzle to the residents of the district, although, by the look of the structure, one would think that it was erected as an imitation of the leaning Tower of Pisa. The structure has been there for many years, and is one of the landmarks of the district."

Their piece was titled Luminescence.

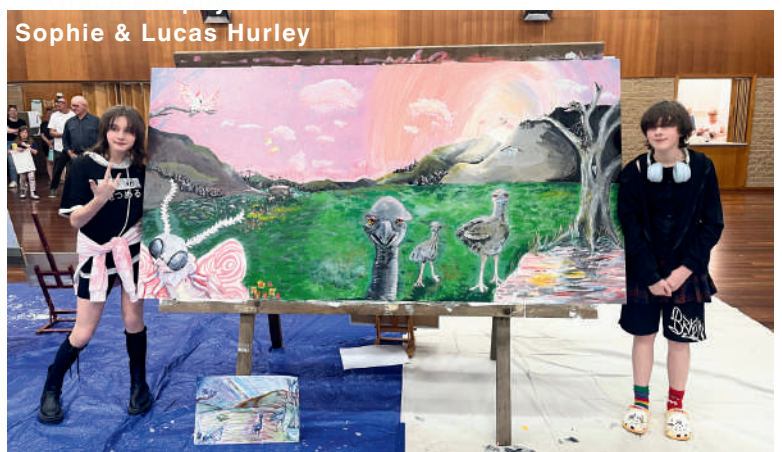
The 2026 Lockington Mural Competition ran over four days from 10-13 September at the Lockington Community Centre and featured six invited artists.

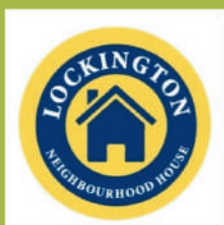

KOTTA HALL CENTENARY COUNTDOWN CONTINUES



As the countdown to the Kotta Hall Centenary celebrations continues, the program of events to mark the historic occasion is growing.

The newest addition is the Kotta Locky Fun Run, scheduled for Sunday, 11 October. Everyone is invited to participate in the eight-kilometre event which will raise funds to support the ongoing development of the Kotta Rail Trail.

Meanwhile, in the process of researching the history of the Kotta Hall a newspaper article (pictured above left) has been uncovered documenting the venue's official opening.

No less than 400 people attended the Monday night event, dancing until the early hours of the morning.

The 1926 article noted "Kotta is fast placing itself on the map, and the new facilities for intense culture in the district will ensure its rapid progress".

The Kotta Hall Centenary will take place from 10am to 4pm on Saturday, 10 October this year and include a display of historical photographs and guest speaker Monica Dullard.

Historian David Hammond has also received funding from the Community Bank - Elmore, Lockington and Rochester to print a history of the Kotta region and hopes to have the project completed for launch on the day.

He is honouring the extensive research undertaken by the late Dick Worboys who was passionate about documenting the Kotta region's history but passed away before he was able to finalise a book.

The festivities commence on Friday, 9 October with a Bush Dance from 6.30pm featuring The Billabong Bushies Band.

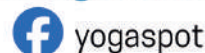

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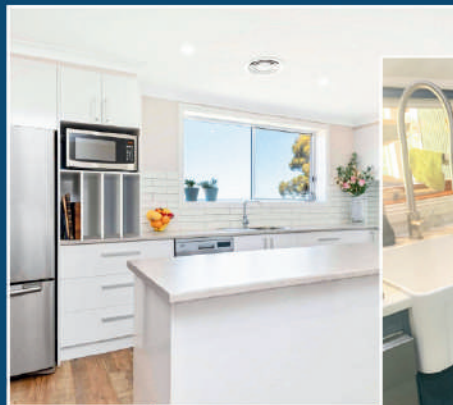

Notification to Landholders: Roadside Exploration in Goornong, Elmore, Lockington and Hunter Areas



Fosterville Gold Mine will undertake Aircore drilling exploration on public roadside reserves in the Goornong, Elmore, Lockington and Hunter areas in September 2026.

The program will last approximately 10 weeks, with works between roadsides and the adjacent private property boundaries, expected to take between 3 to 9 days at a time.

The exploration activities are permitted by Resources Victoria and local councils.

The surveys will not impede access to farm gates or cause any disturbance to buried infrastructure, including irrigation lines.

Traffic management will be in place, and you may see light vehicle(s), up to three people, cones, bollards and speed restriction signs.

No roads will be closed to complete these exploration activities.

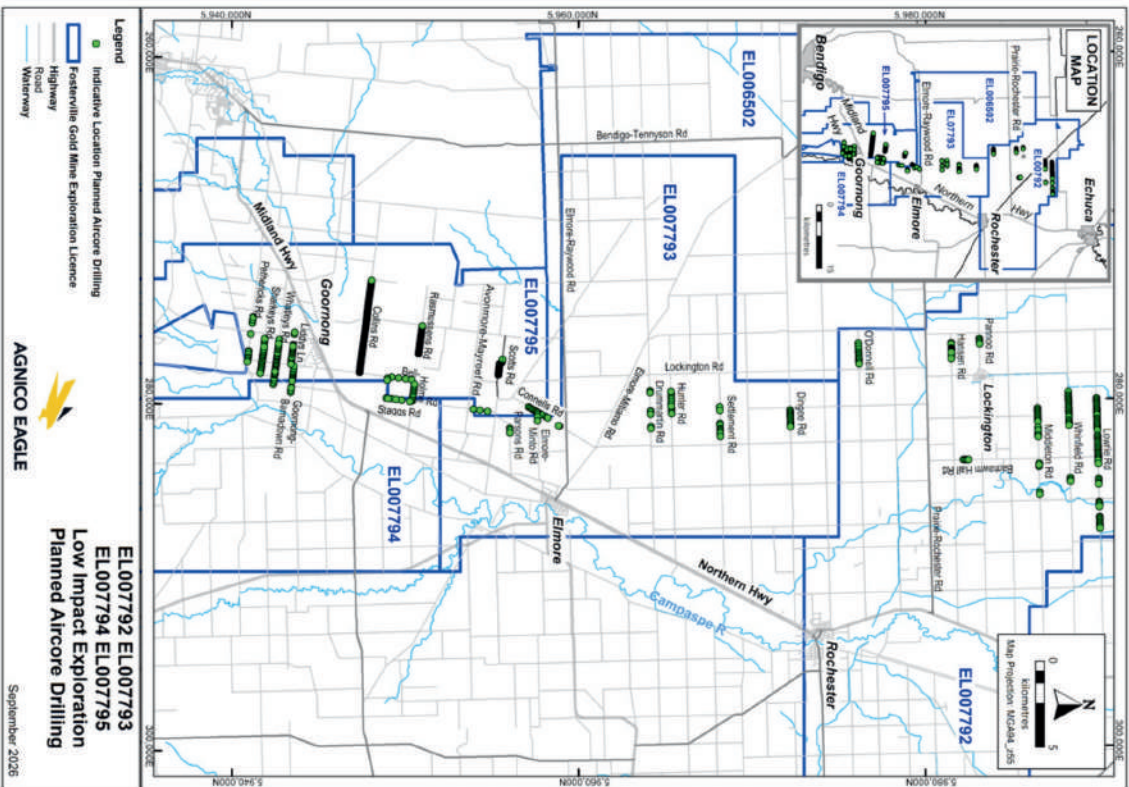

THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA: BE PREPARED THIS GRASS POLLEN SEASON

In Victoria, grass pollen season runs from 1 October to 31 December. During this time you may notice an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. This season also bring the chance of deadly thunderstorm asthma events. Thunderstorm asthma can happen when high grass pollen levels combine with certain thunderstorms. Pollen can break into tiny particles that are breathed deep into the lungs. These events result in high demand for emergency services in a short period of time which can lead to deaths as services are overwhelmed.

People at high risk include those with current or past asthma, undiagnosed asthma, or spring hay fever especially when asthma and hay fever occur together, or asthma is poorly controlled. These events can trigger asthma symptoms, even if you have never had asthma before.

BE PREPARED:

- see your GP to review asthma control, medications and your written asthma action plan.
 - manage hay fever early with advice from your GP or pharmacist.
 - take preventer medications as prescribed and carry a reliever puffer.
- check the Victorian epidemic thunderstorm asthma forecast on VicEmergency and set a watch zone.

ON MODERATE or High RISK DAYS:

- avoid being outdoors during thunderstorms, especially in the gusty wind before the storm.
 - Stay indoors,
 - Close windows and doors,
- and use air conditioning on recirculate where possible.

Warning symptoms include wheezing, breathlessness, chest tightness and coughing even in people never diagnosed with asthma.

ASTHMA FIRST AID

- Sit the person upright.
- Give 4 separate puffs of a blue/grey reliever puffer through a spacer, with 4 breaths after each puff.
 - Wait 4 minutes. If there is no improvement, repeat.
- If breathing does not return to normal, call Triple Zero (000). Continue reliever medication every 4 minutes until help arrives.

Check official Victorian Department of Health and Better Health Channel advice for updates.

Quick action may help prevent an asthma attack from becoming an asthma emergency.

Lockington Pony Club members met on Saturday, 12 September for a busy and fun confidence-building day.

The program included Pairs Riding, where participants learned to ride in rhythm and stay connected with their partner.

They practised keeping horses together, matching pace and spacing, changing the leading rider and riding different shapes and patterns as a pair.

It was a great exercise for improving control, awareness, teamwork and accuracy.

The Mounted Games included an Egg and Spoon Race - testing balance, control and a steady hand; Bowling Pins – working on accuracy, steering and control; and the Sponge Challenge – moving a wet sponge while mounted, with a few splashes along the way.

A session titled “Managing Your Horse When They Get A Fright” was adjusted to suit each rider’s level and focused on practical skills to use when a horse becomes worried, spooky or unsure.

They included: circling down to a controlled halt; using a one-rein stop; getting flexion through the horse’s neck and body; being a leader and building horse confidence; and following guidance, staying calm and giving your horse clear direction.

The aim was to give riders some simple, practical tools they can use when things don’t quite go to plan, while building confidence and trust between horse and rider.

It was a fantastic day of teamwork, learning, confidence building and plenty of fun.
